APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF MAY 22, 2014

Chairman Winner asked for approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 22, 2014. Commissioner Beneto **motioned** to approve the minutes. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT.

Executive Director Baedeker stated the California horseracing industry overall handle was up three percent for the month of May, 2014, when compared to May, 2013. He said CHR B had a discussion with the Jockey Club on microchipping the California race horse population. Microchipping would cost \$5.00 per horse and, utilizing InCompass, would allow for a more accurate method to track the horse population, and available stall count, as well as horse identity, markings, and age. Executive Director Baedeker stated the Jockey Club provided a \$37,500 grant towards the \$200,000 needed to complete the development of continuing education training modules. The project ran out of funding in 2013 and would require more industry support to be fully realized. He said CHR B held an effective training session with both the safety stewards and CHR B investigators at the Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory. It

was an opportunity to educate the investigators about medications as well as educate the stewards about investigative procedure. Executive Director Baedeker spoke about a successful meeting between CHRB, the California Thoroughbred Trainers, and Golden Gate Fields on consistency in procedures between Northern and Southern California. He said the meeting showed that the sooner CHRB staff was informed on issues it could assist with; the better it could help to solve the issue. Executive Director Baedeker stated there had been a renewed interest in having a pharmacist in the backstretch to fill prescriptions. He expected the pharmacist issue to be controversial and difficult to implement, but there would be more discussion as it moved forward. Chairman Winner stated the work being done on the continuing education modules was a critical part of the Boards efforts in the prevention of breakdowns and injuries. He said California was fortunate the Jockey Club had stepped forward with its grant. Chairman Winner stated the Board would be working on the issue of pharmacists in the backstretch to determine if it was the right thing to do. He agreed it could be controversial, but it was worth evaluating.

PUBLIC COMMENT

John Valenzuela, representing the Pari-Mutuel Employees Guild SEIU Local 280 (Local 280), stated the Federation of California Horse Racing Associations had taken an unreasonably hard stance in negotiating a labor contract. He said Local 280 had not had any recent wage increases, had already given up 60 percent of its workforce, and had lost some of its sick pay. He did not think a contract would be agreed upon in time for the Del Mar race meeting. Darrell Haire, representing the Jockeys' Guild, stated it was common practice at Los Alamitos to have four or more jockeys in a race represented by the same agent. He said something needed to be done to

put a stop to the practice. CHRB Rule 1790, Jockey Agent, stated no jockey agent shall represent more than two jockeys at the same time, except with the permission of the stewards. Mr. Haire said an agent representing two jockeys in one race was fair. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg said the issue had come up before, but it went nowhere. He said he understood how it might be necessary in some instances, but there was too great a negative when one agent controlled the majority of the field. Commissioner Auerbach said one agent representing four or more jockeys in a race created the problematic perception of one person controlling the economic interests of the race. Brad McKinzie, representing Los Alamitos, stated if the Board prevented an agent from representing more than two riders at Los Alamitos, most of the riders would end up losing their agents. He said Los Alamitos did not care how many jockeys an agent had in a race; it preferred to leave the issue up to the riders. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg asked Mr. McKinzie why Los Alamitos did not care about the public perception with having agents represent four or more riders in a race. Mr. McKinzie said he did not think there was an issue with public perception on jockey representation. He said a Los Alamitos agent representing four jockeys had much less influence than an agent at Santa Anita that represented two jockeys. Chairman Winner referred the issue to the Jockey and Driver Welfare Committee for further discussion.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY FAIR (F) AT FERNDALE, COMMENCING AUGUST 13, 2014 THROUGH AUGUST 24, 2014, INCLUSIVE.

Richard Conway, representing Humboldt County Fair (Humboldt), stated there was an increase in horse recruitment in 2014, focusing on out-of-state horses from Oregon and Idaho. He said

sponsorship was around \$74,000 in 2012 and \$160,000 in 2013. Commissioner Choper asked what sponsorship for 2014 was likely to be. Mr. Conway stated the target for 2014 was \$200,000, but it would likely end up somewhere between \$150,000 and \$175,000. Commissioner Choper asked if \$200,000 would allow Humboldt to breakeven. Mr. Conway stated it would certainly help, but it was an increase in the horse population that would make the difference. Commissioner Auerbach stated she believed a healthy horse population in Humboldt was not sustainable, and a couple of trips for out-of-state recruitment would not solve the problem. She asked what else Humboldt was doing to increase horse population for its race meet. Mr. Conway stated Humboldt was offering different incentives such as shipping and trainer incentives. Commissioner Auerbach asked Mr. Conway to be more specific. Mr. Conway said a trainer that starts five to ten horses receives \$100 per start. Humboldt was also offering a fuel incentive program for horses from Oregon and Idaho. Commissioner Auerbach asked if those incentives were offered in 2013. Mr. Conway stated in 2013 the trainer incentive was not offered, and the shipping incentive was only on a case by case basis. Chairman Winner asked what kind of response was received on the out-of-state recruitment trips. Mr. Conway said in 2013 there were around 26 horses brought in from Oregon and zero from Idaho; for 2014 he expected the number of horses from Oregon to double, and there were calls from people in Idaho who intended on bringing their horses to Humboldt. Chairman Winner asked if the fire clearance issue had been resolved. Mr. Conway stated there were issues in 2013 with the fire suppression system that had all been addressed. Commissioner Auerbach asked the other Commissioners if they wished to discuss the Pick 6 wager separately for each applicant that was requesting it, or as a separate issue. Chairman Winner said it would be best to discuss the Pick 6 wager at the end of the discussion for the Humboldt application. Commissioner Beneto stated a cause for the loss in

the Humboldt horse population was due to sharing dates with Golden Gate Fields. Commissioner Auerbach asked if that started in 2012. Mr. Conway said that it did as did the drastic drop in horse population. Commissioner Beneto asked if Humboldt had raced four days a week in 2013 and was racing three in 2014. Mr. Conway said he hoped that running more races in less days would help the racing product. Chairman Winner said it should also reduce the expenses. Commissioner Auerbach **motioned** to approve Humboldt's application for license to conduct a horse racing meeting, commencing August 13, 2014 through August 24, 2014. Commissioner Beneto **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**. Chris Korby, representing the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF), stated he wished to speak about the Pick 6 wager that Commissioner Auerbach had asked about. He said the fairs would offer the Pick 6 Wager, and CARF would fully disclose the takeout and how the wager would work. Commissioner Choper said the issue had been about the effective takeout and not just the posted takeout. Mr. Korby said CARF would share with the Board the description of the wager, and not post it until there was agreement that it was accurate. Commissioner Auerbach asked if the wager paid out at the end of each fair or carried over until the last fair of the year. Mr. Korby said it paid out at the end of each fair. Commissioner Auerbach stated she did not understand the reason for including such a wager when there were only a limited number of days for it to carry over. Mr. Korby said the main motivation was finding wagers with low cost entry and high payouts that were attractive to the customer. Commissioner Auerbach said it could also drive overall decreases in handle with decreases in other wagers. Chairman Winner said the issue would go to the Committee level where hopefully representatives from the Horseplayers Association of North America could be present for the discussion.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE PACIFIC RACING ASSOCIATION II (T) AT GOLDEN GATE FIELDS, COMMENCING AUGUST 15, 2014 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 14, 2014.

Tom Ludt, representing the Pacific Racing Association II at Golden Gate Fields (GGF), stated GGF began offering the Pick 6 in 2012. He said the theory behind the wager was to get more people interested as the carryover grew. He said previous to 2012, horseracing law, and Sportech's inability to process a Pick 6 wager prevented the wager from being used; however, the laws were changed and Sportech had developed a way to process the Pick 6. Mr. Ludt said the takeout was still in adjustment so that it was good for the players, while not too limiting on the carryover. Commissioner Choper asked if the Horseplayers Association of North America (HANA) were involved in the discussion. Mr. Ludt stated GGF had talked to a lot of players, not just HANA representatives. He said the wager would not work unless the pools were allowed to grow. Commissioner Choper said the problem was that when the pools grew the takeout grew with them. Commissioner Auerbach asked if the wager structure would be as it was in the application. Mr. Ludt stated the structure had not yet been approved by the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC). Executive Director Baedeker stated the use of effective takeout was dangerous if misunderstood. The takeout in the end was the same as required by statute; however, in the Pick 6 it was being deferred to a later date, which arguably made it an unfair wager. Commissioner Auerbach asked how the Board could approve the application when information on the structure of the wager was unavailable. Calvin Rainey, of GGF, stated the 2013/2014 winter spring race meeting had a drop in handle in March, but overall had a one percent increase in all-source handle. The 2013 summer race meeting had a five percent increase in purses making the purse levels at all three GGF meets consistent. Patrick Mackey, representing GGF, said GGF would utilize a Ship and Win program where any horse

that ran out of state their last start, and had not run in California for six months, would get \$200 for the trainer and \$200 for the owner for a start at GGF. Commissioner Choper asked if GGF had the Ship and Win Program in 2013, and if the horses were tracked after coming into California. Mr. Mackey said GGF did utilize Ship and Win in 2013, and 75 to 80 percent of the horses that were paid by the program stayed in California. Dan Cirimele, of GGF, stated the advertising budget for the 2014 meet was the same as it was for 2013. GGF was bringing back, and possibly expanding the Latin Music Festival, and would have dachshund racing again, but only for one day of the meet. He said GGF would continue the Dollar Day promotion for Sundays. Mr. Ludt stated GGF was in the planning stages for renovations, but had run into snags negotiating permits. Commissioner Beneto asked what the average summer meet attendance was. Mr. Ludt said it was around 2,200 per day for live racing. Jacqueline Wagner, Assistant Executive Director, stated the application's outstanding items included a renewal of the \$100,000 bond, and an agreement with the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) for the 18 percent takeout on the \$2.00 Daily Double. She said the other items listed were being taken care of. Mr. Rainey stated the bond would be paid prior to the meet. Mr. Ludt said GGF had met with the TOC and would meet again after the final figures on the winter/spring meet were available to finalize the agreement. Commissioner Auerbach asked if the Board would have a chance to review the finalized TOC agreement on the wager if the license was approved conditionally. Mr. Ludt stated GGF would only apply the wager if an agreement with the TOC was reached and submitted to the Board for review. Chairman Winner said the wager could be discussed at committee, as well as the Board's role in regulating it. He stated the wager could be considered a marketing tool, and be evaluated at committee without holding up the application. Commissioner Auerbach said if it was successful GGF would keep it and if it was not the market

would take care of it. Mr. Ludt said GGF would offer the regular Pick 6 if it did not get the needed TOC agreement. Commissioner Auerbach **motioned** to approve GGF's application for license to conduct a horse racing meeting commencing August 15, 2014 through September 14, 2014. Commissioner Beneto **seconded** the motion. Chris Korby, representing the California Authority of Racing Fairs, stated GGF was no longer running its satellite wagering facility on Wednesdays, which had a negative effect on purses and the stabling and vanning fund. Mr. Ludt stated GGF had less than 100 customers on Wednesdays at its satellite facility. Instead of staying open at a loss, it made the business decision to close its Wednesday operations. Mr. Rainey said the Cal Expo State Fair decided to give up an allocated Wednesday for its 2014 race meeting, and Humboldt gave up two Wednesdays of racing for 2014. Robert Miller, General Counsel, stated the discussion on the satellite facility operations was off subject of the application. The motion was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REPORT REGARDING THE ALLOCATION OF 2014 RACE DATES TO THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY FAIR AT POMONA AND THE PROPOSAL TO RUN THE RACE DATES AT THE LOS ALAMITOS RACE COURSE.

Jim Henwood, representing the Los Angeles County Fair at Pomona (Fairplex), stated legislation needed for the Fairplex meet to run at Los Alamitos Race Course (Los Alamitos) was moving forward; SB 721 was headed to the Governor's desk. He said the Los Angeles Board of Supervisors sent letters stating its understanding and consent of the race meet relocation. Chairman Winner asked if all five members of the Los Angeles Board of Supervisors were informed of the race meet relocation. Mr. Henwood said they were. Chairman Winner asked if there was any objection. Mr. Henwood said there was not. Mr. McKinzie, of Los Alamitos, said

the agreement between Fairplex and Los Alamitos stated Fairplex would only benefit if the overall handle from its meet at Los Alamitos was substantially more than when its race meet ran at Fairplex. Mr. Henwood said Fairplex would be providing stabling for up to 500 horses until November 5, 2014. Mr. McKinzie stated the race meet relocation would be good for the California horseracing industry with bigger handle, \$1 million more in purses, and more money for stabling and vanning. He said Los Alamitos was adding 200 more permanent stalls and 140 temporary stalls. Commissioner Choper asked for the status of negotiations with the unions. Mr. McKinzie said the union representatives were satisfied with the negotiations on the relocation. Commissioner Choper asked if the people losing jobs at Fairplex would get priority for new jobs at Los Alamitos. Mr. McKinzie said hiring would be based on union seniority. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg asked if Fairplex had a right at the termination of the agreement to negotiate a new agreement. Mr. McKinzie said there was nothing in the contract preventing Fairplex from negotiating again when the term ends. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg asked if Fairplex could threaten to not run the race dates. Mr. McKinzie said the dates would just become open dates. Commissioner Beneto asked if the proposed relocated meet would still be a Fairplex meet. Mr. Henwood said it was being branded as a Los Alamitos meet; however, legally it was still a fairplex meet. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg asked if SB 721 would allow the Fairplex meet to be run at Del Mar. Mr. Henwood said it did. Terri Bingham, representing some Arabian breeders and owners, stated Arabian owners were grateful with the meet relocation, and how it gave them an opportunity to run their horses at Los Alamitos again. Holly Beckner, a horse owner, stated the relocation would make it cost prohibitive for her to stay in horse racing. Brian Trela, a horse breeder and owner, stated the loss of Fairplex as a training facility was a huge loss to the industry. John Valenzuela, representing Pari-Mutuel Employees

Guild SEIU Local 280 (Local 280), stated it wished to keep an open dialogue with Fairplex and Los Alamitos management in case it had an issue with the relocation. Damascus Castellanos, representing Teamsters Local 495 (Local 495), stated agreements for the race meet relocation had been finalized. Commissioner Choper asked what was the difference between Local 495 and Local 280. Mr. Castellanos stated Local 495 represented the racing officials, clockers, outriders, assistant starters, security, and parking attendants, but did not represent the pari-mutuel clerks, tickets, or concessions. Lee Hall, representing some members of SEIU United Service Workers West, stated a relocation of a fair to Los Alamitos was already tried with the Orange County fair race meet, and it failed. Mr. McKinzie stated the Orange County Fair had great success at Los Alamitos when it was allowed to run days. Only after it was moved to nights, in competition with Del Mar, did it fail. Commissioner Beneto asked if the Stabling and Vanning Fund would be paying for vanning from Fairplex to the Fairplex meet at Los Alamitos. Mr. McKinzie said it would. Joe Morris, of the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and the Stabling and Vanning Committee, stated both groups he represented were unanimously behind the decision for the Stabling and Vanning Fund to pay for vanning from Fairplex to the Fairplex meet at Los Alamitos. Commissioner Choper **motioned** to approve the proposal to run the Fairplex race dates at Los Alamitos. Commissioner Auerbach **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE EXTENSION OF THE JUNE 2013 BOARD DECISION TO SUSPEND FOR UP TO TWELVE MONTHS THE USE OF CLENBUTEROL BY ALL BREEDS AT ALL CALIFORNIA RACE TRACKS, WHICH IS SET TO EXPIRE JULY 18, 2014.

Dr. Rick Arthur, CHRB Equine Medical Director, stated the extension to suspend the use of clenbuterol was necessary until the proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1844, Authorized Medication, became effective on October 1, 2014. The proposed amendment would reestablish a threshold for clenbuterol of 140 picograms. Commissioner Auerbach **motioned** to approve the extension of the June 2013 Board decision to suspend for up to twelve months the use of clenbuterol by all breeds at all California race tracks. Chairman Winner **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1536, STEWARDS' MINUTES, TO REQUIRE THE STEWARDS TO REPORT ON-TRACK ACCIDENTS INVOLVING EXERCISE RIDERS, OR FOR HARNESS RACING, AN EMPLOYEE RIDING IN A JOG CART OR SULKY NOT ENGAGED IN A RACE VIA THE REVISED JOCKEY/DRIVER ACCIDENT REPORT (CHRB-201 2/14) AND A NEW TRAINING ACCIDENT REPORT (CHRB-201A 2/14) (NOTE: THIS CONCLUDES THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD. THE BOARD MAY ADOPT THE PROPOSAL AS PRESENTED.)

Jacqueline Wagner, Assistant Executive Director, stated Rule 1536 currently required all on-track accidents involving jockeys or drivers to be reported on form CHRB-201 and attached to the stewards' minutes. The proposed amendment to Rule 1536 requires that all on-track accidents involving exercise riders, or for harness racing, an employee riding in a jog cart or sulky not engaged in a race, also be reported on form CHRB-201A and attached to the stewards' minutes. She said no comments were received during the required 45-day notice, and staff recommended the Board adopt the proposal as presented. Commissioner Beneto **motioned** to adopt the proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1536, Stewards' Minutes, to require the stewards

to report on-track accidents involving exercise riders, or for harness racing, an employee riding in a jog cart or sulky not engaged in a race via the revised Jockey/Driver Accident Report (CHRB-201 2/14) and a new Training Accident Report (CHRB-201A 2/14) Commissioner Auerbach **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1689.1, SAFETY VEST REQUIRED, TO EXTEND THE REQUIREMENT TO WEAR A SAFETY VEST TO PONY RIDERS WHO PONY OR LEAD A HORSE OR WHO ARE MOUNTED ON ANY HORSE ON THE GROUNDS OF A FACILITY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD. (NOTE: THIS CONCLUDES THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD. THE BOARD MAY ADOPT THE PROPOSAL AS PRESENTED.)

Chairman Winner stated there were no comments on the proposed amendment to CHRB 1689.1, Safety Vest Required, during its 45-day notice. He said the amendment was part of the Board's move to increase the safety for people riding horses within the inclosure. It was the Board's intent to lead the industry in limiting injuries to horse and rider. Alan Balch, representing the California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT), stated the rule was unclear if it applied to trainers. Commissioner Beneto stated trainers should not need to wear safety vests if they were leading their horse and rider to the track. Commissioner Auerbach stated trainers at Santa Anita, or any other track with a high traffic backstretch, faced many safety hazards even while leading horses to the track. Robert Miller, General Counsel, stated the rule applied to anyone riding a pony, including trainers. Chairman Winner stated the Board was doing everything it possibly could to improve safety, even if it meant a bit of inconvenience to trainers. Mr. McKinzie said the insurance underwriters saw the Board being proactive which was helpful in negotiations for future years. Mr. Balch stated if it was the Board's intention to require any person on a pony in the inclosure to wear a vest then it could be clarified through administration. He said he wanted

to avoid confusion on how it was implemented. Chairman Winner said it was a good idea to handle the issue administratively. Executive Director Baedeker stated there would be a warning period in the initial implementation of the rule to ensure all parties were well aware of the rule and its penalties, long before any action was taken on violations. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg **motioned** to adopt the proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1689.1, Safety Vest Required, to extend the requirement to wear a safety vest to pony riders who pony or lead a horse or who were mounted on any horse on the grounds of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Board. Commissioner Auerbach **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1844, AUTHORIZED MEDICATION, TO REVISE LEVELS OF SPECIFIED AUTHORIZED MEDICATIONS, AND ADD ADDITIONAL DRUG SUBSTANCES. (NOTE: THIS CONCLUDES THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD. THE BOARD MAY ADOPT THE PROPOSAL AS PRESENTED.)

Dr. Rick Arthur, Equine Medical Director, stated the proposed amendment to Rule 1844, Authorized Medication, was the culmination of many years of work. The goal was to provide clear thresholds to prevent medication mistakes, as most medication violations were done accidentally. He said the proposed amendment was the first real effort in California to regulate corticosteroids. Dr. Arthur stated trainers and veterinarians would be notified of the rule change on July 1st to allow time for learning the withdrawal times and processes. Corticosteroid injections would still be used, but there would need to be more consideration on how and when they were used. Dr. Arthur said the proposed amendment to Rule 1844 did not include restricted administration times, as used in New York, but the thresholds would limit injections to four or five days before a race. Eight states had already approved similar rules and other states were moving forward to do so as well. Dr. Dionne Benson, of the Racing Medication Testing

Consortium, stated in the two weeks leading up to Kentucky enacting its similar rule change, veterinarians were doing more exams for lameness; it showed the rule was working. Data from Kentucky's first two weeks with the rule change showed no positives for corticosteroids, and no change in the field sizes at Churchill Downs. Commissioner Choper asked if the proposed amendment to Rule 1844 would reduce the amount of violations. Dr. Arthur said if trainers abided by the recommendations they would not have a violation. Alan Balch, of the California Thoroughbred Trainers, stated if the proposed rule was enacted there would need to be extensive training for all parties to understand the new procedures. Dr. Arthur stated there would be effective training with the veterinarians, and the trainers would need to listen to their veterinarians. Executive Director Baedeker asked Dr. Arthur to give the timing of the implementation once the rule was adopted. Dr. Arthur stated if there was no issue with the Office of Administrative Law approval, the rule amendment would be effective on October 1, 2014. The transition would be similar to when the bute threshold was lowered. Commissioner Auerbach asked what part of the amendment would require the most adjustment for the trainers and veterinarians. Dr. Arthur said the changes for corticosteroids were going to require veterinarians and trainers to use more discretion when use was appropriate. Chairman Winner **motioned** to adopt the proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1844, Authorized Medication, to revise levels of specified authorized medications, and add additional drug substances. Commissioner Auerbach **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**. Executive Director Baedeker stated he was shocked to learn about the careless and indiscriminate use of corticosteroids under the reasoning of "why not." He said the best way to improve the racing industry was to focus its effort on the care of the race horse, because everything else flowed from there. If the racehorse was naturally fit to race, then the safety of the rider, the investment of the

owner, and the livelihood of the people who rely on the industry were all improved. Chairman Winner stated this was the direction the Board wanted to go. Those who played by the rules would have the advantage, not those who did not play by the rules.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1866, VETERINARIAN'S LIST, TO REQUIRE THAT ANY HORSE PLACED ON THE VETERINARIAN'S LIST AS SICK OR RECEIVING VETERINARY TREATMENT-SHOCKWAVE THERAPY NOT BE ALLOWED TO WORK OUT FOR A MINIMUM OF 72 HOURS WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF THE OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN, AND SET SPECIFIC MINIMUM TIME PERIODS FOR HORSES PLACED ON THE VETERINARIAN'S LIST AS UNSOUND OR LAME. (NOTE: THIS CONCLUDES THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD. THE BOARD MAY ADOPT THE PROPOSAL AS PRESENTED.)

Dr. Rick Arthur, Equine Medical Director, stated the proposed amendment to Rule 1866, Veterinarian's List, was straight forward, preventing a horse that had shockwave therapy or had been determined to be sick, from working out for 72 hours. Commissioner Auerbach asked how the amendment changed current practice. Dr. Arthur stated currently a horse could be scratched as sick in the morning and be on the track working out that afternoon. He said shockwave therapy had an analgesic side-effect that lasted 72 hours, and should be prevented from working out until it wore off. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg asked if shockwave therapy was only effective for 72 hours why even use it. Dr. Arthur said the purpose of shockwave therapy was to stimulate the bone and tissue to heal; the 72 hour analgesic effect was not its purpose, but instead a side-effect. Commissioner Choper **motioned** to adopt the proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1866, Veterinarian's List, to require that any horse placed on the Veterinarian's List as sick or receiving veterinary treatment-shockwave therapy not be allowed to work out for a minimum of 72 hours without the permission of the official veterinarian, and set specific minimum time

periods for horses placed on the Veterinarian's List as unsound or lame. Commissioner Beneto **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE APPROVAL OF THE 2014/2015 AGREEMENT PROVIDING FUNDING SUPPORT FOR THE BOARD.

Francisco Gonzalez, CHRB staff, stated the agreement providing funding support for the Board was required by 2009, SBX2-16 which eliminated previous license fees. The agreement used a formula based on the license fees paid before 2009 to cover the operating budget of the CHRB. Commissioner Choper asked where the money came from. Mr. Gonzalez stated the money came from the industry. 2nd Vice-Chairman Rosenberg **motioned** to approve the approval of the 2014/2015 Agreement providing funding support for the Board. Commissioner Auerbach **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

GOLDEN GATE FIELDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$79,672.57 TO 11 BENEFICIARIESRegular Board Meeting
July 18, 2014

ISSUE

Pacific Racing Association, doing business as Golden Gate Fields (GGF) is requesting approval to distribute race day charity proceeds generated at its 2013-2014 racing meet from December 26, 2012 through June 15, 2014. From the net race day charity proceeds GGF is proposing a total distribution of \$79,672.57. The charitable organizations selected and amounts to be distributed are listed on the attachment. Staff notes that 100 percent of the proceeds will be given to 11 horse racing related organizations.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19550 states the Board shall require each licensed racing association that conducts 14 or less weeks of racing to designate three racing days, and each licensed racing association that conducts more than 14 weeks of racing to designate five racing days during any one meeting, to be conducted as charity days by the licensee for the purpose of distribution of the net proceeds there from to beneficiaries through the distribution agent. No racing association shall be required to pay to a distributing agent for the purpose of distribution to beneficiaries more than an amount equal to two-tenths of one percent of the association's total on-track handle on live races conducted by the association at the meeting. Business and Professions Code section 19555 requires that proceeds are to be distributed to beneficiaries within 12 calendar months after the last day of the meet during which charity days were conducted. Business and Professions Code section 19556 provides that the distributing agent shall make the distribution to beneficiaries qualified under this article. At least 20 percent of the distribution shall be made to charities associated with the horse racing industry. An additional five percent shall be paid to a welfare fund and another five percent shall be paid to a nonprofit corporation, the primary purpose of which is to assist horsemen and backstretch personnel who are being affected adversely as a result of alcohol or substance abuse. In addition to the above distributions, a separate 20 percent shall be made to a nonprofit corporation or trust, the directors or trustees of which shall serve without compensation except for reimbursement for reasonable expenses, and which has as its sole purpose the accumulation of endowment funds, the income on which shall be distributed to qualified disabled jockeys.

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for Board discussion and action.
Staff recommends the Board approve the charity race day distribution as presented.

**ADDEMDUM TO PACIFIC RACING ASSOCIATION
REQUEST FOR AUTHORITY TO DISTRIBUTE
2012-2013 CHARITY DAYS PROCEEDS**

California Equine Retirement Foundation, Inc. – CERF is an organization that has developed into a full-care ranch to provide a full range of services to former race horses in need of rehabilitation toward retirement or placement in to a new career. CERF maintains 75 plus horses ranging in age from one year to 35 years, each having specific needs to insure proper health and optimal fitness. Each horse has its own paddock where appropriate portions are placed in feeders in the morning and again in the late afternoon. During the day hay is placed in outside feeders for grazing while the horses are turned out. Periodic re-evaluations are made to determine if any changes are needed in any individual's dietary regime. This program provides horses with proper nutrition to maintain health, fitness and longevity.

California Thoroughbred Foundation – CTF is a 503(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides multiple benefits to individuals involved in the Thoroughbred industry. These include scholarship programs for veterinary medicine students at UC, Davis and maintenance of the Carleton F. Burke Memorial Library.

California Thoroughbred Horsemen's Foundation – CTHF is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit foundation that provides assistance to the low income backstretch community occupied with the care of Thoroughbred race horses at California's major race tracks and fair circuits and CHRB recognized off-track training centers. The organization maintains three clinics throughout the state which see over 10,000 people each year, including numerous children who are prepared medically to return to school each year.

CARMA – The California Retirement Management Account is organized to raise money for retired California race horses. Their mission statement provides that they assist Thoroughbred retirement facilities that care for and retrain horses whose careers have ended after competing in California Thoroughbred races. Their services include tracking of retired California race horses and in working to find homes for retired equines. CARMA also manages a grant request process and distributes funds to qualified retirement facilities caring for such horses. CARMA is dedicated to the goal of providing funding for the rehabilitation, retraining and/or retirement of Thoroughbred horses that have raced in California.

Edwin Gregson Foundation – A nonprofit charitable foundation organized for the purpose of improving the lives of backstretch workers and their immediate family members at California race tracks. The organization provides backstretch workers with many educational programs, including "English as a second language," bible studies and provides numerous programs, including computer training programs at its recreation facility, computer games and various magazines in English and Spanish. It organizes family outings for the workers and their children, including trips to Magic Mountain in Valencia, California, Raging Waters, Galaxy soccer games, Dodger baseball games and excursions to the Long Beach Aquarium. The organization also maintains a recreational hall at Santa Anita Park for the benefit of the backside workers and their children.

Neigh Savers Foundation – Neigh Savers creates new beginnings for retired racing Thoroughbreds by building relationships, both on and off the track, to help as many horses as possible. Through rescue, rehabilitation and retraining the organization provides the foundation needed for racing Thoroughbreds to successfully transition into new careers. Whether the horse is an Off-Track Thoroughbred (OTTB) ready to end its racing career or one that has been injured on the track or has found itself standing at an auction or on a feedlot with no other options, Neigh Savers strives to make a difference, one OTTB at a time.

Permanently Disabled Jockeys' Fund – This is a statutorily mandated distribution per Business and Professions Code Section 19556 (c). It provides support to disabled jockeys, as its name implies.

Racetrack Chaplaincy of America (Northern California Council) – The stated mission of the organization is "The overall mission of RTCA, through its councils and chaplains, is to make disciples for Jesus Christ through teaching, preaching, and ministering to the spiritual, emotional, physical, social, and educational needs of those persons involved in all aspects of the horse racing industry."

Tranquility Farm – This organization is a 501(c)(3) charity whose principal activity is to accept the donation of Thoroughbred horses from the race tracks and breeding farms and whose goal is to give such horses the best opportunity to find an adoptive home. For those Thoroughbreds that are not readily adoptable, the organization offers comfortable retirement wherever possible, giving priority to horses that were significant competitors or producers. Tranquility Farm requests, but does not require, that owners contribute sponsorship to help defray the costs of rehabilitation and retraining. No horse is denied acceptance at Tranquility Farm based upon its owner's financial contribution.

United Pegasus Foundation – This is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that aids the rescue of superannuated Thoroughbreds and provides care for such animals at its farm in Tehachapi, California. On occasion the organization purchases older horses at auction and acquires other Thoroughbreds at the request of owners and trainers. The retired Thoroughbreds are maintained in pleasant quarters and peaceful surroundings to live out the balance of their lives. This organization depends entirely upon donations for the purchase of food and other amenities required to maintain the Thoroughbreds.

Winners Foundation – The Winners Foundation provides confidential assistance on a one-to-one basis to employees and family members of California race tracks who are seeking help for alcohol, gambling and drug addiction. Each situation is geared to best support an individual's desire to change his or her life for the better. The Foundation has developed a large referral base and maintains close relationships with community based services such as anonymous 12 step groups, city and county assistance agencies, detox centers, halfway houses and out-patient and in-patient hospital treatment programs. This service is provided to any employee or family member of anyone involved in the California Thoroughbred horse racing community, free of charge. This includes backstretch workers, as well as all employees of Del Mar, Fairplex, Golden Gate Fields, Hollywood Park, Oak Tree, Santa Anita and the California Association of Racing Fairs.

ISSUE

Discussion and action by the Board on the approval of safety steward contracts for David Nuesch and Richard Lewis, for Fiscal Year 2014-15

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Section 2.06 of the State Contracting Manual, state boards and commissions with contracts in excess of \$5,000, must provide a copy of a motion approving and authorizing execution of the agreement/contract.

A recent safety steward examination resulted in four individuals being added to the ranks of those eligible to serve as a California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) safety steward. David Nuesch and Richard Lewis will assume assignments where vacancies occur in both the northern and southern region. Mr. Lewis will be assigned as a safety steward at Humboldt County Fair in Ferndale and The Big Fresno Fair; as well as assist during a schedule adjustment at Golden Gate Fields. Mr. Nuesch will be assigned as safety steward at the Del Mar Race Track.

Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY FAIR AT LOS ALAMITOS RACE COURSE SEPTEMBER 4-23, 2014.

Los Angeles County Fair (LACF) filed its application to conduct a horse racing meeting at Los Alamitos Race Course:

- September 4-23, 2014, or 11 days, two less than 2013. The fair proposes to race 106 races and will be simulcasting on September 4th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 22nd, and 23rd.

Senate Bill 721 (Padilla), Chapter 50, Statutes of 2014, added Business and Professions Code section 19549.17, which authorizes the Los Angeles County Fair to conduct live racing meetings in or outside Los Angeles County. The Los Angeles County Fair can conduct racing at facilities operated by thoroughbred racing associations who are authorized to conduct races in the southern zone.

At the June 19, 2014 Regular Meeting, the Board voted to allow the Los Angeles County Fair to move its September race meeting, to the Los Alamitos Race Course.

- The proposed race dates are the approved dates allocated to the fair.

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19604, specific provisions must be met before an ADW provider can accept wagers.

Summary of Business and Professions Code section 19604

To accept wagers on races conducted in California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- A written agreement allowing those wagers exists with the racing association or fair conducting the races on which the wagers are made.
- The agreement shall have been approved in writing by the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which the wagers are made.

To accept wagers on races conducted outside of California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- There is a hub agreement between the ADW provider and one or both of (i) one or more racing associations or fairs that together conduct no fewer than five weeks of live racing on the breed on which wagering is conducted during the calendar year during which the wager is placed, and (ii) the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which wagering is conducted.

Documents received in compliance with Business and Professions Code section 19604:

- ODS Technologies, L.P. dba TVG Network has submitted all documents required in compliance with Business and Professions Code section 19604.



Program for Enhanced Security for Stakes Races

During the thoroughbred racing season at Los Alamitos all stakes races with a purse of \$100,000 or more will be subject to enhanced security procedures conducted by Los Alamitos Race Course personnel.

For all stakes with purses of \$100,000 or more there will be security personnel assigned to each barn with a horse(s) entered in that race. This security guard will monitor all individuals entering the barn and they will all be equipped with a video recording device to record that activity.

As per our agreement with the TOC, this added surveillance will commence no later than 6 hours prior to the post time of the subject race.

For the \$500,000 Los Alamitos Derby to be run on July 5, this enhanced security program will be in place 48 hours prior to the running of the race.

This enhanced security coverage will be in addition to a minimum of 2 armed security personnel who will be patrolling the barn area on a 24-hour per day basis.

The main race track lighting system is comprised of (970) 1000 watt 277 volt metal halogen light fixtures. The emergency lighting system is comprised of (305) 1500 watt quartz light fixtures. If the main system experiences a brief loss or interruption of power the metal halogen lights will fail. Due to the type of fixture they may take up to 20 minutes to reach full illumination. In the event of an interruption of this type the back-up emergency quartz lighting system automatically comes on. This happens instantly and the back-up emergency system can remain on for up to 90 minutes.



CHRB Item 15.1 – Explanation of lack of paramedic staff

Unlike Los Angeles County, which allows for the licensing of private paramedic services, all paramedic services in Orange County fall under the jurisdiction of the Orange County Health Care Agency, Department of Emergency Medical Services and that agency does not license private paramedic services within the county.

All paramedic services within Orange County are provided by the Orange County Fire Authority and there is no provision within current guidelines that allow for OCFA units to be staged for activities of private events such as horse racing.

Because of this guideline, all racing events at Los Alamitos are covered by two fully equipped ambulances staffed by state certified EMT's. These EMT's and our ambulance service also fall under the jurisdiction of the Orange County Emergency Medical Services and our operations at the track are reviewed on an annual basis. I have included our last review with the suggestions of OCEMS which have been implemented by our track.

It is important to note that while our track is not covered by paramedics, the protocol for having paramedics on the scene in case of an accident has been reviewed and approved by the OCEMS.

The nearest paramedic staffed fire station to Los Alamitos Race Course is literally across the street. This proximity is no accident. The OCEMS will tell you that the site was chosen for the specific reason of its proximity to the race track.

In case of an accident that requires paramedic response, our Huntington Ambulance EMT's will stabilize the patient and will meet the OCFA paramedic unit at the pre-designated location directly across the street from the fire station. This location is accessed through a gate on our backstretch that we have shown on the enclosed graphic.

Not only does the OCEMS approve of this system, as you can see from our latest review, they believe having experienced EMT's handle the initial care of the jockey before handing the patient off to paramedics has benefits.

Dear Brad:

After visits to the Los Alamitos horse racing facility, reviewing patient care reports, and using input from jockeys, trainers, track administration, the current ambulance provider, paramedics at the nearest OCFA fire station and agency staff, Orange County Emergency Medical Services is comfortable with the current provider continuing to provide ambulance transportation and medical care at Los Alamitos Race Track.

We would make the following recommendations to improve the track EMS operations:

1. Ensure track personnel activate the 9-1-1 system immediately using the tower observer (steward, etc.) on every call in which a jockey falls at high speed during racing or training.
2. Require that all contract ambulance employees complete and maintain certification in the 16 hour International Trauma Life Support course, or an equivalent, along with their EMT, CPR etc. Statewide, many paramedics and EMTs have not taken this certification but it is especially appropriate for track medical personnel whose main focus will be on patients for whom mechanism of injury is often high speed trauma.
3. Educate the jockeys on Orange County EMS trauma policies that require that all patients who fall at full gallop/racing/training speed be transported to a designated Orange County Trauma Center for evaluation and treatment.
4. Consider that the contracted ambulance provider have on every transport unit an 800 MHz radio available capable of direct communication with responding Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) personnel. Contract ambulance staff would also receive training on operating this radio.
5. Consider the contract ambulance provider participate in the Orange County Medical Emergency Data System (OC-MEDS) which is a web-based, electronic Patient Care Report system to ensure compliance with OC EMS triage and treatment policies. The current call volume (1-3/month) is low enough that the provider would not have to buy additional hardware. Access and manual data entry of the patient care record can be done on any internet connected computer.
6. The ambulance provider, in conjunction with Race Track management, could coordinate with OCFA an orientation meeting with one of the three OCFA shifts at the closest fire station each month. Initial orientation should include the identification of the entry gate at the parking lot adjoining the track; track operations unique physiological characteristics of the jockeys such as, dehydration, etc.)

- 7. OC-EMS could coordinate an annual safety briefing with jockeys/trainers at which contract ambulance personnel explain (in Spanish, or with translators) the care patients receive on the track, in the ambulance or at the hospital - including a spinal immobilization demonstration, description of the capabilities of a trauma center, etc.)
- 8. The ambulance provider will have AEDs on the two transport vehicles at the racetrack and EMTs will be trained in their use.

As we discussed at the track, the first 5-10 minutes of most trauma calls are focused on the Basic Life Support skills of stabilizing the patient's airway and spine, evaluating for injuries and packaging them for transport.

At this time, intermediate techniques such as the Combitube are controversial in an urban setting, especially when the nearest Advanced Life Support fire station is less than a half mile away.

We believe there is a benefit to having horse-racing-specific EMS personnel who are familiar with track operations, personnel and geography.



(d) Each racing association or racing fair shall designate a health and safety manager and assistant manager, who shall be responsible for compliance with the provisions of this section and one of whom shall be on duty at all times when live racing is conducted. 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EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROCEDURES FOR ON-TRACK INJURY TO JOCKEYS

FIRST RESPONSE

*In the event of an accident, the LARA Trackside Human Ambulance which follows each race and is staffed by state certified EMT's will respond immediately to the location of the accident.

*EMT's will make an evaluation of the injuries and if deemed necessary they will call for the Security Dept. to call for Paramedics. The Security Dept. communications desk is manned at all times during racing hours.

ON-SITE EVALUATION AND JOCKEY PROTOCOL

- If involved in a spill during a race, regardless of how serious the jockey deems the spill to be, they are instructed that if it is safe and they are clear of any loose horses they are to remain as still as possible until instructed to move by the EMT's.
- If EMT's request that the jockey be stabilized and placed on a backboard, jockeys are instructed to comply with that request or risk disciplinary action.
- If Paramedics are called the injured jockey will be stabilized and taken to meet Paramedics at the pre-designated location just outside of the Los Alamitos back fence. The OC Fire Paramedics will then evaluate the injuries and determine whether or not the injured rider should be transported to a trauma hospital.
- If the injuries are not deemed serious by either the EMT's or Paramedics, the rider will be directed either to a local emergency room or the Track Physician for evaluation. It will be the policy of the Track Doctor that with the exception of the most minor accidents the injured jockey be evaluated immediately by an emergency room doctor in a medical setting. Should a jockey refuse treatment recommendations from EMT's, Paramedics or the Track Doctor, they will be required to sign a Refusal of Medical Treatment form and their ability to continue riding on that day's program will be determined by the CHRB Stewards.
- In the case of multiple injuries in a single race, the two fully staffed and equipped track ambulances that are on site for every race will respond and will immediately call the Security Dept. to call for the necessary number of Paramedic backup. In this case paramedic units will be instructed to enter the track through the backstretch gate which is unlocked at all times.



Barretts Race Meet at Los Alamitos



OVERVIEW

In June of 2014, the California Horse Racing Board unanimously approved the Los Angeles County Fair Association's (LACFA) request to relocate its traditional race meet dates to Los Alamitos race track in Orange County. Additionally, California State Governor Jerry Brown signed amended legislation (SB 721) that authorizes the CHRB "to allocate racing weeks to licensed racing associations or fairs, and to specify the racing days, dates, and hours for horse racing meetings."


With both legislation and regulatory authorization in place, LACFA will be hosting its traditional September race meet at Los Alamitos Race Course in September, 2014. As such, substantial communication, audience engagement and marketing efforts must be undertaken in order to inform horse racing enthusiasts of the nature and circumstances of this move.

SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS

LACF's facilities are marginally adequate for "fair racing," but not for Thoroughbred racing at the highest level. LACF does not have the capital and financial resources necessary to upgrade its existing facilities to a premier level. The costs of such necessary upgrades, including expenses associated with compliance with the Clean Water Act which would be required for year around use, have been previously reviewed and evaluated, and are estimated to be \$40 million or more. Even if the necessary capital was available, such an investment could not be economically justified. Despite LACF's significant efforts in recent years to leverage the increasing attendees at the Fair to bolster grandstand racing attendance, which is free, on-track handle in the grandstand has steadily declined over the years. For example, over the last seven years, handle in the grandstand has declined by 66%. During the past five years, grandstand handle decreased by 35%, while total Fair attendance grew by 5%.



Barretts Race Meet at Los Alamitos




If the 2014 race meet was conducted at LACF, we would be forced to lower our purses levels because of the declining handle trend and prior year overpayments, thereby further decreasing the potential to attract premiere horses and trainers. Relocating LACF's 2014 and 2015 racing dates from LACF to Los Alamitos is in the best interests of the public, fair racing, and the Southern California racing circuit for the following reasons:

1. Los Alamitos has a new one mile racetrack that has been well received by owners and trainers. Training and racing over a mile track is preferable to LACF's five eighths of a mile track that is sometimes characterized as a "bull ring."
2. Unlike at LACF (scheduled to close as an offsite training facility on July 10, 2014), horses are stabled on a year round basis at Los Alamitos and their paddock area is considered much better than the facilities at LACF. Horses stabled on-site are more likely to compete at a Los Alamitos race meet than at LACF.
3. It is likely that purses at Los Alamitos will be higher than at LACF because of increased potential handle. Handle is expected to be higher because:
 - a. Racing would be conducted on a one mile track instead of five-eighths of a mile track.
 - b. Los Alamitos is perceived as a major league racetrack by out of state bettors, partially resulting from the recent national publicity about Kentucky Derby winner California Chrome being trained and stabled here.
 - c. The population and demographics of Orange County represent a fertile new market of opportunity. Nearly \$1.8 million was wagered at Los Alamitos at their Derby Day, as compared to just over \$705,000 at Fairplex.
 - d. Nationally recognized trainers have their horses stabled at Los Alamitos, and it is likely their participation in races at this

venue will further validate Los Alamitos as a major racetrack and viable replacement for Hollywood Park.

- e. More moderate climate and temperatures at Los Alamitos in September.
 - f. Ability to attract a better racing product at Los Alamitos.
4. Los Alamitos will be able to market the live Thoroughbred racing experience in its mostly untapped market area (Orange County), and thereby have the opportunity to increase Thoroughbred racing's fan base.


LOS ALAMITOS WILL PROVIDE:

Driving new fans to Barretts's/Los Alamitos Thoroughbred meet is a key goal for LARA. To accomplish this goal we are making a sizeable commitment to local print and air media. This local media package includes -

- Orange County Register Print and Digital. LARA will spend \$26,000 with the Orange County Register for pre-meet and actual race day print advertising and promotion. This advertising for our 11-day Thoroughbred season is part of a year-round promotion commitment to the OC Register that will include the entries and results for southern California racing returning to the OC Register sports section.

REACHING ADW PLAYERS


The purpose of targeting ADW players with a specific marketing/advertising push is two-fold. One goal is to encourage the players who are betting at home and have a potential menu of every race in the country to focus on the Los Alamitos races. A second goal is to entice the substantial number of ADW players who live within a 15-mile circle of Los Alamitos to leave their coach and come to the track.

To accomplish this goal LARA has entered into a marketing/advertising partnership with TVG. Prior to the opening of our meet we hope to reach a similar partnership agreement with ExpressBet/HRTV. The elements of this package include -

- **Pre Meet Awareness Spots.** These spots will be designed to brand our LACF meeting well before opening day. Once again we will be using familiar faces to send the message that the Los Alamitos thoroughbred meeting will feature nationally known horsemen. We will be running a minimum of 95 pre-meet 30-second awareness spots leading up to the September meeting. These spots will run nationally on TVG.

EXOTIC WAGERS

Barretts Race Meet at Los Alamitos will have the same racing format as 2012 and bring back the successful Player's Pick 5. The \$0.50 wager will feature a 14% takeout and provide a new wagering option for hardcore handicappers. The popular \$0.50 Late Pick 4 will return in 2013.

FRIDAY FINALE

The Friday Finale, a 1-1/8 mile race, will be the last race of the day. In addition, this race will be the final race of the Pick 6 and the Late Pick 4. With a minimum of 10 starters, \$10,000 will be added to the purse. The objective of this race is to create interest and excitement while increasing handle opportunities on- and off-track. (TBD)

Los Alamitos will offer free clubhouse/grandstand admission to any visitor that brings in a Los Angeles County Fair admission ticket.

GROUP RACING EXPERIENCE

During its July meeting, Los Alamitos in partnership with the Orange County Register organized a Party at the Races for the newspaper subscriber's rewards program named Register Connect. Managed by the OC Register staff on the paper's website, the Party at the Races received over 3,000 requests from readers for a potential attendance of 12,000 people during the weekend of July 12-13. Our ongoing commitment to racing is evident in our continued success with Finish Line Sports Grill. This on-campus wagering facility and restaurant is a sports and racing fan's dream with more than 70 big screen televisions, ticketless wagering, a 400-seat arena, indoor and outdoor dining and viewing, and exceptional food and drinks.



During the meet, Finish Line Sports Grill offers FREE admission and parking making this venue the ultimate experience for the fan who wants to be close to the action without coming to the Fair. Of course our preference is to have the fan on-track, but this venue provides an exceptional alternative right here on our campus.

Finish Line Sports Grill has its own ongoing marketing campaign which includes direct mail, online advertising, e-blasts, local print advertising and customer appreciation offers. We will tap heavily into this audience to encourage wagering on the Barretts Race Meet at Los Alamitos race meet.

OWNERS & TRAINERS

At Barretts Race Meet at Los Alamitos, we view our owners and trainers as key customers and patrons. We provide concierge-level service to these individuals including credentials, hospitality and special meeting areas.

DAILY MAINTENANCE DURING TRAINING HOURS

There are two maintenance breaks during morning training hours at 7:30 am and 10:00 a.m. During these breaks the track is watered if needed and harrowed to a depth of 3 inches with two tractors making a total of two passes each approximately 80 feet in width.

DAILY POST TRAINING HOURS MAINTENANCE

At the close of training each day the track is harrowed and then bladed from rail to rail to ensure an even amount of material across the entire width of the entire track. A concrete curb under the inside rail is used as a grade marker. This is used to as a guideline to maintain a uniform and consistent racing surface.

Following the grading, the track is then cut to a depth of 4 inches using a California cutting harrow. This is done to avoid having our running base becoming too hard. Following the cutting of the track, the track is harrowed repeatedly and watered as needed. This is done to set up our 3 inch racing cushion over our 3 inch sub base. In total there is 10 inches of material over the actual permanent base of the Los Alamitos track.

On race days, the harrowing and watering process will continue up to first post. It is the goal to maintain the Los Alamitos track at a moisture level of between 10 to 12 % for racing purposes. The track will be harrowed between every race and water will be added as needed to maintain this 10 to 12% moisture content. It is expected that during our July meet we will be watering the track between every race.

WEEKLY MAINTENANCE PROGRAM


Once a week the track is ripped and tilled to a depth of 6 inches. This is done to ensure that the desired mix of sand, silt and clay and organic material stays constant in our cushion and sub base as well as to prevent the track from soil compaction which makes the track harder and less forgiving.

The hardness of our sub base is tested regularly with a Pentrometer and Kleg Hammer to test soil compaction.

San Joaquin County Fair, as well as all Racing Fairs, provides emergency care which provides for comprehensive medical care for jockeys, track staff and allied personnel. Emergency care focuses on immediate stabilizing, comfort and evacuation of injured racetrack personnel to appropriate hospital care facilities.

Staffing

Two Paramedics, from American Medical Response, are located in an on-track ambulance that follows at a safe distance from the horses racing during each race. This ambulance and crew are present whenever horses are on the track (during both racing and training hours) and are responsible for initiating basic life support measures, including immediate medical stabilization, care, and evacuation to medical care facilities.

The on site first aid facility contains all equipment and supplies necessary for advanced life support of any emergency. The facility is staffed by paramedics and EMT's.

Licensed Physician on duty is responsible for care on an ongoing basis of jockeys, track staff, and allied personnel requiring non-emergency medical care.

Physical Resources

San Joaquin Fair provides the services of a state-of-the-art Kimzey Horse Ambulance as well as a senior experienced driver who is responsible for the evacuation and disposition of injured horses at all racing fairs.

Redundant communications services are provided to ensure constant contact between all emergency care personnel. Two-way radio networks are established within the racing operations as well as fair emergency operations. All key emergency care personnel also carry cell phones and each is provided a laminated card containing all contact numbers.

14F Medical Protocols and Procedures: English

In case of an accident on the racetrack, the following procedures shall be implemented:

Track Ambulance

The track ambulance will travel immediately to the scene of an accident and assume triage and patient care responsibilities and evacuated.

Security

1. As soon as possible, a member of the track security staff shall report to the scene of the accident and thereafter take direction from the EMT responsible for management of the accident scene. The track security representative shall be responsible for keeping bystanders away from the accident scene.
2. A member of the track security staff shall proceed to the Jockey's Room to secure the ambulance transfer area, as well as prevent visitation from bystanders from entering the accident area.
3. A member of the track security staff shall be responsible for escorting emergency vehicles.
4. The security staff shall be responsible for all crowd control activities.

Racing Staff/Track Veterinarian

1. Upon arrival at the scene, the Outrider should hold the injured horse in order to prevent further harm to people, horses or property.
2. Horses with severe injuries should be transported off the track via the horse ambulance, whenever it is practical to do so.
3. The track veterinarian shall make the decision as to the necessity of euthanasia on the track.
4. A screen blocking the public's view of the injured horse shall be set up prior to the euthanasia procedure.
5. Outriders are responsible for the removal of any debris from the racetrack following the removal of the injured person or horse from the track.

Plant Staff

1. The Horse Ambulance shall travel immediately to the scene of an accident whenever it appears that a horse will require transport.
2. Members of the plant department who are near the accident site shall assist in screening the accident scene from the public view and shall take direction from the EMT that is responsible that is responsible for the management of the accident scene.

Announcer

1. The announcer shall make riders aware of the details of the situation (such as the location of a loose horse, the necessity to pull up, etc.), enabling them to take the necessary steps to mitigate additional problems.

Senior Management

1. A senior management representative should quickly proceed to the location on the racetrack where the accident has occurred. The manager should report to other members of the management team as to the accident status.
2. An additional member of the management team should report to the video department in order to monitor the scene and access the extent of video coverage to be transmitted to the public.
3. A member of the management team should provide input as to announcements to be made by the track announcer.
4. A member of the senior management team should be responsible for seeing that information regarding the accident is communicated to the family member of the injurec. Efforts need to be made to escort family members to the hospital, if necessary. In this regard, a current compilation as to who should be notified in the case of an injured jockey is kept on file.
5. All public address announcements and responses to press inquiries are within the sole purview of the senior members of the management team then available.

All Department Heads

All department heads shall communicate to their employees that, although intentions are good, the treatment of the injured rider must be left up to trained personnel, and all other employees must stay away from the scene of an accident.

The attending Paramedics shall arrive equipped with advance cardiac life support (ACLS) and full C-spine equipment.
- An "on-site evaluation" of injuries to the jockey(s) shall be made by Unit 41 Paramedics.



"ON-SITE EVALUATION"

- Based on the Paramedics "on-site evaluation" of injuries, a decision shall be made to either treat the injured jockey(s) on-site or to transport to the hospital.
 - If on-site treatment is deemed sufficient, Unit 41 Paramedics shall transport the injured jockey(s) directly to the First Aid Office where the Track Physician will be primary care provider or,
 - If off-site treatment is deemed necessary Unit 41 Paramedics will contact the Association Gate (channel 1) and have them call the 911 Arcadia Fire Department.



"INJURY TREATMENT"



Los Alamitos' inaugural thoroughbred race meeting offered eight thoroughbred programs on Thursday-through-Sunday afternoons, July 3-6 and July 10-13.
