APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 15, 2012

Vice-Chairman Israel asked for approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of November 15, 2012. Commissioner Choper **motioned** to approve the minutes. Commissioner Beneto **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

PUBLIC COMMENT

John Bucalo, representing Barona Resort and Casino Off-Track Betting, commented on the financial imbalance between satellite facilities and groups conducting advance deposit wagering (ADW). He said that with a two percent commission satellites could not stay solvent. Vice-Chairman Israel stated that the commission was statutory and if it was going to be changed it would be up to the Legislature. Jack Liebau, representing Hollywood Park, stated that changes needed to be considered in racing's business model, particularly in the takeout. He said that from 2007 to 2012 the total handle went down 36 percent. In that same time on-track handle went from 16 to 14 percent of total handle, while ADW handle went from 11 to 17 percent of total handle. Mr. Liebau stated that with every new change, tracks had taken on more of the risk; and that this risk should be borne by everybody. Commissioner Choper stated that both Mr.

Bucalo's and Mr. Liebau's comments were about the same thing: the diminishing pie; and that the only solution was to get together, as unselfishly as possible, and do something about it. Vice-Chairman Israel stated that a serious market survey by a real research firm needed to be conducted.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF RACE DAY CHARITY PROCEEDS OF THE LOS ANGELES TURF CLUB II IN THE AMOUNT OF \$37,073 TO 11 BENEFICIARIES.

Vice-Chairman Israel stated that the Los Angeles Turf Club II proposed to distribute \$37,073 in race day charity proceeds to 11 beneficiaries. He said all of the beneficiaries were horse related charities. Commissioner Beneto **motioned** to approve the request by Los Angeles Turf Club II to distribute its race day charity proceeds. Commissioner Rosenberg **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING A REPORT FROM THE CALIFORNIA MARKETING COMMITTEE REGARDING ITS 2013 MARKETING AND PROMOTION PLANS PURSUANT TO BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE SECTION 19605.73 (b)

Craig Dado, representing the California Marketing Committee (CMC), stated that the fundamental challenge faced by the CMC was the lack of funding. In 2004 CMC funding was as high as six million, in 2012 two million, and projections for 2013 were also about two million. He said that for the 2013 budget the emphasis of the CMC was in two specific areas: handle generation, and product enhancement. The CMC had four programs of handle generation: the Significant Player Program, a brand new Pick 6 promotion, minisatellite support, and racing information. Mr. Dado stated that, at the Board's suggestion, the CMC was no longer funding

the phone racing results line. Santa Anita was picking up the cost of the line, and after its current meet was over it was up to Hollywood Park to continue it. The CMC also had four programs of product enhancement: the Two Year Old Stakes Program, the Golden State Series, the Del Mar Paddock Sale, and the horse recruitment efforts which allocated money to the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) and all other tracks, with the exception of Del Mar, to assist them in bringing new horses to California. Commissioner Rosenberg asked if there was a limit on the number of horses at Del Mar's paddock sale and if in-state horses could be sold there. Mr. Dado stated that the number of horses was limited to around 36 due to the capacity of the barns during the sale and concurrent race meet. He said that California horses were not sold at the paddock sale because the sale's goal was to bring out-of-state horses into California. Commissioner Choper asked Mr. Dado to elaborate on the deep cuts in satellite marketing. Mr. Dado stated that two members of the six member CMC board, by law, represented the satellite interest; however, over time the downsizing of the CMC budget collaterally reduced the portion for satellite marketing from \$425,000 to \$180,000. To increase efficiency the satellite marketing had become more focused on database type marketing and trying to get the current players to return more often. Commissioner Rosenberg asked if racing association satellite facilities or Indian casino satellite facilities received any benefit from these marketing funds. Mr. Dado replied that they did not, stating that some members of the CMC board did not agree with how satellite marketing funds benefitted only CARF satellites. He said that Chris Korby, Executive Director of CARF, was working on a plan that would help determine if that policy should be revised. Vice-Chairman Israel stated that the ten percent administrative costs for CMC were high for such a small budget. Mr. Dado stated that most of the administrative costs were for the salary for Shannon McDonald, the CMC Executive Director, who had not asked for or received a

raise in many years. He said the CMC looked for a complimentary position to defer some of her expenses, and that there was a plan in the works but it was not finalized. Commissioner Winner asked if the CMC would be willing to conduct the market research that Vice-Chairman Israel had referred to during public comments. Mr. Dado stated that CMC would be perfect for such a task and that they could plan on having one completed for 2014. Vice-Chairman Israel stated that Commissioner Winner was an expert in market research and suggested he make himself available for consult on this project. Commissioner Winner stated that he would be. John Bucalo, representing Barona Resort and Casino Off-Track Betting, stated that the CMC was entirely funded by money taken out of wagers from all of the satellite facilities, and that Barona and other non-CARF satellites were being left out of CMC marketing programs. Mr. Bucalo said he was aware that CMC had a rebate program but that the Barona customers were excluded from participation. He said that satellites had two representatives on the CMC board, but neither of them had spoken to him or asked him for ideas. Mr. Dado stated that although CMC funding came from satellite wagers, it did not come out of the satellite's portion. The CMC was funded by a portion of the wagers that would otherwise go into purses and track commissions. He said that the Barona patrons were eligible for rebates; they just needed to sign up for a Cal Racing card and use them in the machines when they bet. Vice-Chairman Israel stated that both Mr. Dado and Mr. Bucalo should get together and establish a plan to get Barona's patrons better access to the Cal Racing cards. Mr. Dado stated that Mr. Bucalo should contact Chris Korby, and although Barona was not a CARF member, Mr. Korby's seat on the CMC board represented all satellite facilities. Commissioner Rosenberg asked for clarification on how the Pick 6 Supplement cap was going to work. Mr. Dado stated that the supplement expenses for 2013 were estimated to be around \$300,000. The CMC capped its support at \$150,000, and the

remainder would be supplied jointly by the tracks and the Thoroughbred Owners of California. Mr. Dado said the Pick Six Supplement was new and had only been run for two weeks, too early to analyze; but CMC expected Santa Anita to commit through February, 2013. Mr. Dado, speaking on behalf of Del Mar, stated that Del Mar was planning to participate, but that it was waiting to fully commit. Jack Liebau, representing Hollywood Park, stated that Hollywood Park was also interested but was waiting to commit as well. Vice-Chairman Israel thanked CMC for its report.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE TO OPERATE A MINISATELLITE FACILITY AT THE TILTED KILT PUB AND RESTAURANT IN DOWNTOWN SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

Rick Baedecker, representing Southern California Off Track Wagering Incorporated (SCOTWINC), stated that the Tilted Kilt was a great location, surrounded by density, and had easy access. He said that if the Board approved the application the minisatellite could open in as soon as a week. John Bucalo, representing Barona Casino and Resort Off Track Betting, asked if Surfside Race Place at Del Mar (Surfside) had given permission for the Tilted Kilt's application, and if there was a deal between the two that the permission was made contingent upon. Mr. Baedecker stated that there was a side agreement between Surfside and the Tilted Kilt, involving co-promotion and revenue sharing, but that Surfside's permission was not contingent on the agreement. Caroline Perry, representing the San Diego Padres, stated that the Tilted Kilt was a member of the East Village Square Owners Association and as such signed its Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) explicitly prohibiting gambling within any of its buildings. Commissioner Choper stated that the referenced CC&Rs specifically banned casinos only and that under California Law there was a big difference between horse racing and casinos. Ms. Perry stated that the

intent of the CC&Rs was for a more general definition of "casino" as a place of wagering or gambling. Commissioner Rosenberg stated that the San Diego Padres accept advertising from casinos such as Sycuan. Ms. Perry stated that advertising could not be accepted from casinos that ran a sports book. Mr. Baedecker stated that Sycuan had a satellite horse racing wagering facility. Ms. Perry stated that it was not right outside the park. Commissioner Rosenberg **motioned** to approve the application for a minisatellite wagering facility by East Village Kilt, LLP doing business as Tilted Kilt Pub and Eatery for a period of five years. Commissioner Winner **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE BETFAIR HOLLYWOOD PARK 2013 ALLOCATED FALL RACE DATES.

Jack Liebau, representing Hollywood Park (HP), stated that HP was to notify the Board by January 1, 2013, or thereabouts, as to whether HP would run its fall race meeting. He said Chairman Brackpool and Executive Director Breed were informed by email that HP was confirming it would run its fall race dates. Lou Raffetto, representing Thoroughbred Owners of California thanked HP for deciding to run the fall meet. He said he hoped it would keep operating beyond the fall of 2013; however, everyone still needed to look ahead to when HP ceased to race. Commissioner Rosenberg asked what month race dates were normally approved. Vice-Chairman Israel stated September. Commissioner Rosenberg said that in previous years HP agreed to give six months notice. Mr. Liebau stated that the practice started in 2005, when HP was purchased. At that time HP committed to continue in business for three years, and after that to continue with a six month notice. Vice-Chairman Israel asked if the agreement between HP and the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) was informal. Mr. Liebau stated yes; it was between HP, TOC, and the California Thoroughbred Trainers. He said when dates were

allocated in August, 2012 the TOC gave HP five minutes notice regarding conditions that would be placed on its race dates. Commissioner Rosenberg stated that depending on the success of the negotiations over the fate of HP the Board would be faced with the same situation the next time it allocated race dates.

Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE HOLLYWOOD PARK RACING ASSOCIATION, LLC AT HOLLYWOOD PARK APRIL 22, 2013 THROUGH JULY 16, 2013.

Hollywood Park Racing Association (HPRA), LLC filed its application to conduct a thoroughbred horse racing meeting at Hollywood Park:

- April 22 through July 16, 2013, HPRA will host simulcast only wagering for Southern California on days when live racing is not presented. Live racing will commence April 25, 2013 through July 14, 2013, or 49 days, one less than 2012. The association proposes to race a total of 434 races, or 8.8 per day. In 2012 they raced 8.78 races per day with an average of 7.48 runners per race. In 2012 they were allocated 50 race days the (actual) average daily purse for the meet was \$453,525. The (estimated) average daily purse for this meet is \$462,859.
- The race dates proposed are the dates the Board allocated.

- Racing 4 days per week, Thursday through Sunday, with 8 races on Thursdays and Fridays. 9 or 10 races on a selected basis on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, with 11 races on May 4, 18 and June 8 (Triple Crown).
- First post 1:00 p.m. daily.
 - 11:00 a.m. post Saturday, May 4th Kentucky Derby, May 18th Preakness and June 8th Belmont Day.
 - May 4, 18 and June 8th post times will be adjusted to coordinate with Triple Crown races.
- Business and Professions Code section 19464(b) specifies no application for license to conduct a horse racing meeting shall be granted unless the applicant has deposited with the Board a surety bond in the amount of \$100,000, or a greater amount, as determined by the Board, which is sufficient to ensure payment of employees wages and benefits including, but not limited to, health, welfare and pension plans. The surety bond shall be maintained during the period of the meeting that all payments are made. In the event of a dispute over the amount owed, the dispute shall be resolved through the grievance

procedures set forth in the labor agreement of the union representing the class of employees affected.

This subdivision does not apply to any person or association licensed to operate a horse race meeting prior to January 1, 2001, which has conducted a race meeting in each of the immediate three previous consecutive calendar years.

- Hollywood Park Racing Association, LLC's initial race meeting was conducted after 2001. Therefore, it is subject to the provisions of the Business and Professions Code section 19464(b).
- Pursuant to Business and Profession Code 19464(b) Hollywood Park Racing Association is required to submit a \$100,000 surety bond payable to the Treasurer of the State of California to ensure payment of employee wages and benefits. The Hollywood Park \$100,000 surety bond on file will expire March 31, 2014.
- Request Jennifer Paige be appointed horse identifier pursuant to CHRB Rule 1525, Racing Officials Appointed by the Board.
 - Track safety inspection has been requested and will be completed before the beginning of the race meet.
- Inspection of backstretch worker housing has been requested and will be completed before the beginning of the race meeting.
- Wagering program will use CHRB and ARCI rules.
 - Early wagering 8:30 a.m. on the day of.
 - \$.50 Pick 5 will be offered on the first five races. The major share of the pool will be designated as 100%.
 - Pick 6 on last 6 races - 70% of net pool to be retained for the jackpot and no cap be set.
 - Pick 4 on races 2 through 5 and on the last 4 races - designate the major share of pool as 0%.
 - Offering option of an alternate selection in the place Pick all, Pick 5, Pick 6 and Pick 4.
 - Super High Five on the last race in accordance with ARCI Pick(n) Position(x) pools rules.
- The Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) providers are TVG, Xpressbet and Twinspires the television providers will be TVG and HRTV.

Pursuant to Business and Profession Code section 19604, specific provisions must be met before an ADW provider can accept wagers.

Summary of B&P code 19604

To accept wagers on races conducted in California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- A written agreement allowing those wagers exists with the racing association or fair conducting the races on which the wagers are made.
- The agreement shall have been approved in writing by the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which the wagers are made.

To accept wagers on races conducted outside of California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- There is a hub agreement between the ADW provider and one or both of (i) one or more racing associations or fairs that together conduct no fewer than five weeks of live racing on the breed on which wagering is conducted during the calendar year during which the wager is placed, and (ii) the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which wagering is conducted.

NOTICE TO APPLICANT: No application for a license to conduct a race meeting shall be granted unless the applicant has deposited with the Board a surety bond in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or a greater amount, as determined by the board, which is sufficient to ensure payment of employee wages and benefits including, but not limited to, health, welfare, and pension plans. The surety bond shall be maintained during the period of the meeting and for an additional period, as determined by the board, sufficient to assure that all payments are made. This subdivision does not apply to any person or association licensed to operate a horse race meeting prior to January 1, 2001, which has conducted a race meeting in each of the immediate three previous consecutive calendar years. The \$100,000 surety bond amount maybe increased to an amount determined by the Board at the time the application is scheduled for hearing pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19464(b).

Hollywood Park Racing Association will be the Southern California host for simulcast only wagering to be offered on all days when live racing is not presented during the period from April 22 through July 16.

This letter shall serve as TOC's authorization for Hollywood Park (HP) to transmit the audiovisual signal of HP Thoroughbred races to, and accept wagers on those races placed through, the out-of-state betting systems ("Guests") in accordance with the conditions of, and at Host Fee rates no lower than those specified in the rate sheet provided to TOC by Monarch Content Management ("Monarch") on behalf of HP, during the HP racing season commencing April 25, 2013, continuing through July 14, 2013.

As a condition of TOC's authorization of the acceptance of wagers on HP races by Guests which engage in phone and/or Internet wagering, herein called "ADW," HP shall take all reasonable steps to distinguish between ADW and other wagering handled through such Guests, including requiring tote vendors of both HP and Guest to facilitate the separation of ADW and non-ADW data in reports used by HP and/or CHRIMS to account for and settle balances between HP and Guest.

TOC's authorization shall not serve, nor should it be construed as, a precedent to future requests for permission to simulcast to the Guests specified herein or to any other Guest. TOC reserves the right to cancel or withdraw its authorization for any Guest, at any time, upon 48 hours written notice.

Pursuant to AB-701, raising the takeout to fund Workers' Compensation costs, HP shall collect the incremental increase in takeout as an addition to the money room adjustment, for the transmittal to the Fund in accord with such legislation. Should any Guest herein authorized fail to enter into a contractual obligation with HP to allocate this additional takeout in this manner, TOC authorization for that site is hereby immediately rescinded.



Subject: Emergency Medical Action Plan for Injured Jockeys

Since May 1, 2003 we at Hollywood Park have had in place an emergency medical action-plan for injured jockeys. There is now a new law requiring such an action plan. Pursuant to the Business and Professions Code section 19481.3 (b) each racing association shall adopt and maintain an emergency medical action plan for injured jockeys and shall be posted in English and Spanish within the jockeys room.

The system we have in effect follows the exact guidelines required by the above statute. The emergency action plan we deploy goes as follows:

“Upon the observed or reported injury of a jockey, medical assistance will be immediate. The responding medical technician, track doctor or security will contact communications (via hand held radio or calling 310 4191555). Security will then activate the emergency contact procedure. This procedure will be the responsibility of the Safety Director or his designee. The Safety Director will contact the Chief of Medical Staff at Centinela Hospital and prepare for the injured jockeys arrival. The phone number of Centinela Hospital is 310- 4198636 and is located at 555 East Hardy Street, Inglewood.

The Chief of Staff will ensure that his personnel are standing by to receive the injured jockey. The Chief of Staff will also contact any specialists who are contracted for the care of an injured jockey. This will lay the foundation for a rapid admittance and treatment of the injured Jockey. A Security Agent will also be dispatched to respond to the emergency room to assist family members of the injured jockey and to also maintain the integrity of the injured jockeys needs. It will also be the responsibility of the Security Agent to keep the Director of Safety informed as to the condition and progress of the injured jockey. It will be the responsibility of the Security Agent to obtain a copy of the accident from the T.V. department. The Security Agent will prepare a report as to the accident and treatment. The agent will also ensure that all workers compensation information pertaining to the jockey is accurate and current.”

The plan shall be posted in each jockey room in English and Spanish. (c) Prior to every race meeting, the racing association or racing fair shall contact area hospitals to coordinate procedures for the rapid admittance and treatment of emergency injuries. (d) Each racing association or racing fair shall designate a health and safety manager and assistant manager, who shall be responsible for compliance with the provisions of this section and one of whom shall be on duty at all times when live racing is conducted. The health and safety manager may, at the discretion of the racing association, be the person designated to perform risk management duties on behalf of the association.



BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE SECTION 19605.25

Regular Board Meeting
February 21, 2013

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19605.25 provides that the Board may approve an additional 15 minisatellite wagering facilities in each zone. Business and Professions Code section 19605.25(a)(1) states no minisatellite wagering facility may be within 20 miles of a racetrack, a satellite wagering facility, or a tribal casino that has a satellite wagering facility. If the proposed minisatellite wagering facility is within 20 miles of one of the above-referenced satellite facilities, then the consent of each facility within a 20-mile radius must be given before the proposed minisatellite wagering facility may be approved by the Board.

At its January 17, 2013 Regular Meeting the Board approved the application for license to operate a minisatellite wagering facility at the Tilted Kilt Pub and Restaurant (Tilted Kilt) in downtown San Diego, California. The Tilted Kilt application represented that "*Tilted Kilt is located within the protective circles of both Del Mar racetrack and Surfside Satellite Wagering. Both entities have agreed to grant waivers; the Del Mar racetrack waiver is included as Exhibit F [of the application].*"

On February 4, 2013 a representative of the Sycuan Band of the Kumeyaay Nation (Sycuan Tribe) submitted a letter stating that the proposed Tilted Kilt minisatellite wagering facility is located within a 20-mile radius of the existing Sycuan Tribe satellite wagering facility. The letter stated that because the Sycuan Tribe's satellite facility was within a 20-mile radius and the Sycuan Tribe did not consent to the Tilted Kilt minisatellite wagering facility, the Board should not have approved the application. The Sycuan Tribe contends the approval violated Business and Professions Code section 19605.25, and must be revoked. Staff verified the Sycuan Tribe's claim to the best of its ability by using two independent web sites to determine the distance between the Tilted Kilt and the Sycuan Tribe satellite wagering facility. The site, Distance Finder at distance.aniri.ro, calculated the distance at 32 km, or 19.88 miles. The site, DistanceFromTo at distancefromto.net, calculated the distance at 19.82 miles. If the Board determines the Sycuan Tribe's claim is valid, and the parties do not reach an agreement, it's option is to rescind the Tilted Kilt's license to operate a minisatellite wagering facility.

Southern California Off Track Wagering, Inc. (SCOTWINC) has indicated it made an error in its calculation of the distance between the Sycuan Tribe satellite facility and the Tilted Kilt. SCOTWINC is currently working to arrive at a solution that will allow the Tilted Kilt to operate as a minisatellite wagering facility

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for Board discussion and Action. A SCOTWINC representative is prepared to address the Board.

My client, the Sycuan Band of the Kumeyaay Nation ("Sycuan Tribe"), recently learned that at your January 17, 2013, meeting the California Horse Racing Board ("Board") approved a license application for a minisatellite wagering facility to be located at the Tilted Kilt Pub and Restaurant ("Applicant") in downtown San Diego. In reading the meeting transcript, it appears the Board is aware that the Sycuan Tribe operates a satellite wagering facility. However, it is clear that neither the Applicant nor the Board conducted the due diligence necessary to determine whether the Applicant was required to obtain the Sycuan Tribe's consent to the issuance of this license.

Pursuant to California Business and Professions Code Section 19605.25, if a proposed minisatellite facility is located within a 20-mile radius of an existing satellite wagering facility, the Board may not approve the location unless the consent of each facility within the 20-mile radius is obtained. As verified by the enclosed maps, the Sycuan Tribe's facility is indeed within a 20-mile radius of the proposed site. Because the Sycuan Tribe did not consent to the proposed facility, the Board should not have approved the application. As issuance was in clear violation of the law, the Board must immediately revoke the license.

The Sycuan Tribe appreciates your immediate attention to this matter as it is clear from the meeting transcript the Applicant intends to begin operations within the very near future.



DIVISION 8. SPECIAL BUSINESS REGULATIONS [18400. - 22948.7.] (*Division 8 added by Stats. 1941, Ch. 44.*)

CHAPTER 4. Horse Racing [19400. - 19668.] (*Chapter 4 repealed and added by Stats. 1959, Ch. 1828.*)

ARTICLE 9.2. Satellite Wagering [19605. - 19608.8.] (*Article 9.2 added by Stats. 1990, Ch. 131, Sec. 15.*)

19605.25. (a) The California Horse Racing Board may approve an additional 15 minisatellite wagering sites in each zone, if all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) No site is within 20 miles of a racetrack, a satellite wagering facility, or a tribal casino that has a satellite wagering facility. If the proposed facility is within 20 miles of one of the above-referenced satellite facilities, then the consent of each facility within a 20-mile radius must be given before the proposed facility may be approved by the board.
 - (2) An agreement in accordance with subdivision (a) of Section 19605.3 has been executed and approved by the board. In addition to the requirements set forth in that provision, the agreement shall specify which components of its racing program, including live, out-of-zone, out-of-state, and out-of-country races, an association or fair will make available to the site. The terms and condition of the agreement, including all fees payable pursuant to paragraph (3) of that provision, a portion of which may be paid to horsemen in the form of purses, shall be subject to the approval of the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements with the association or fair.
 - (3) The site is approved by the board.
 - (4) The wagers are accepted in an area that is accessible only to those who are at least 21 years of age.
 - (5) The board has approved the accommodation, equipment used in conducting wagering at the site, communications system, technology, and method used by the site to accept wagers and transmit odds, results, and other data related to wagering.
- (b) Parimutuel clerks shall be available to service the self-service tote machines at these locations, and to cash wagering vouchers on a regularly scheduled basis.
- (c) Until January 1, 2013, if the proposed minisatellite wagering site is in the northern zone in a fair district where the fair has operated a satellite wagering facility for the previous five years, the approval of the fair must be obtained even if the proposed location is more than 20 miles from the existing satellite wagering facility operated by the fair.
- (d) For purposes of commissions, deductions, and distribution of handle, wagers placed at minisatellite sites shall be treated as if they were placed at satellite wagering facilities authorized under Section 19605, 19605.1, or 19605.2. Section 19608.4 shall apply to minisatellite wagering facilities.
- (e) The written consent of the San Mateo County Fair shall be obtained prior to the approval of any minisatellite wagering site located within a 20-mile radius of its fairground.
- (f) Minisatellite wagering facilities created pursuant to this section are not eligible for satellite wagering commission distributions pursuant to Section 19604.
- (g) The board, in adopting regulations to implement this section, shall minimize the expense to both the

operator of the minisatellite facility and the host racetrack.

(h) If there are more than 15 applications for minisatellite wagering facilities in any zone, the board shall determine which facilities will generate the largest handle, and give priority to the approval of those facilities. The board shall license a minisatellite facility for up to five years, and then review the operation and the size of the handle, and determine if it is in the best interest of horse racing to relicense the facility or, in the alternative, license another minisatellite facility that might generate a greater handle.

(i) Except as may be provided in the agreement required pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (a), no association or fair shall be required to make all or part of its racing program available to a minisatellite wagering facility. Notwithstanding subdivision (e) of Section 19608.2, all costs incurred by the organization executing that agreement in excess of the amounts distributable to the organization from wagers placed at the site on that racing program, shall be borne by the minisatellite wagering facility.



Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO OPERATE A MINISATELLITE WAGERING FACILITY BY LAKE CENTER DRIVE, LP DBA SAMMY'S OF LAKE FOREST, LAKE FOREST.

Lake Center Drive, LP (Sammy's of Lake Forest), filed an application for a license to operate a minisatellite wagering site in its Sammy's of Lake Forest restaurant in Lake Forest, California. Southern California Off-Track Wagering Inc. (SCOTWINC) has acted as the coordinator during the application process. The city of Lake Forest has granted Sammy's of Lake Forest a conditional Use Permit for a restaurant with minisatellite wagering. One of the conditions of the Use Permit is that the CHRB has issued all necessary approvals for the minisatellite wagering facility. Sammy's of Lake Forest minisatellite application requests that the CHRB grant a conditional license beginning February 21, 2013 through February 20, 2018, for a period of up to five years. The CHRB conditional license would require that Sammy's of Lake Forest meets all of the city of Lake Forest's conditions. If granted a conditional license by the CHRB, Sammy's of Lake Forest will begin remodeling of the facility that should be completed in late spring 2013. Once the city of Lake Forest and the CHRB conditions are met Sammy's of Lake Forest minisatellite will become operational until February 20, 2018.

- The Sammy's of Lake Forest is a restaurant located in Lake Forest, California. The proposed wagering site will be located in the Southern zone.

Business and Professions Code section 19605.25 (a) (1) provides no minisatellite may be within 20 miles of a racetrack, a satellite wagering facility, or a tribal casino that has a satellite wagering facility. If the proposed facility is within 20 miles of one of the above-referenced satellite facilities, then the consent of each facility within a 20-mile radius must be given before the proposed facility may be approved by the Board.

- SCOTWINC has provided there is no racetrack(s), satellite wagering facility or tribal casino that has a satellite wagering facility located within 20 radius miles of the applicant.

- Estimated number of pari-mutuel terminals machines available: 8 reversible manned pari-mutuel wagering stations and 20 self-service machines. Seating Capacity is 222; the number of tables in the minisatellite wagering area is 85. Seventy-two HD, LCD flat screen televisions as follows: eighteen 60 inch; twenty-seven 55 inch; fifteen 42 inch; twelve 36 inch. Plus, each private carousel will be equipped with a monitor and two video walls with nine screens each.
- Staffing: Mutuel Supervisor; two clerks on most weekdays and three or more on weekend days as needed; self service attendant (to be determined as needed); one security officer during all hours of operation.

The management of Sammy's is committed to a very aggressive marketing and promotional plan that will start with an extensive employee training program. It is a given that many of Sammy's customers will be newcomers to horseracing and it is imperative that all of the employees at Sammy's are well trained in order to be the sport's goodwill ambassadors to these new customers. In that vein, Sammy's will also be working with the various racing associations to organize group outings for Sammy's customers to see live horse racing. It is our strong belief that the best way to make newcomers truly appreciate the sport is to expose them to live racing in a group setting among friends. This approach is directed towards developing fans of horse racing, who in turn will become regular customers of Sammy's. The management at Sammy's will also be working with the various racing associations to ensure that the marketing funds generated from the handle at Sammy's are used with maximum efficiency and impact. Whenever possible, we plan to participate in on-track promotions such as calendar giveaways or mystery mutuel vouchers, with the idea being to give our customers the feeling of being at the races. In addition, the entire back room is being designed for maximum television monitor coverage. The front dining and bar areas of the facility are being designed as dual purpose areas which will service both race patrons and local customers coming to Sammy's for lunch, dinner or evening entertainment. A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST, CALIFORNIA APPROVING USE PERMIT 7-12-2725 FOR THE OPERATION OF A RESTAURANT WITH MINI SATELLITE HORSE RACE WAGERING AND LATE NIGHT HOURS, A FAÇADE REMODEL TO THE EXISTING BUILDING AND SITE MODIFICATIONS AT 23221 LAKE CENTER DRIVE

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2012, Bruce Lehman filed a Use Permit application for a restaurant with mini satellite horse race wagering with late night hours, façade remodel to the existing building and site modifications at 23221 Lake Center Drive, in the Community Commercial District in the Lake Forest Planned Community; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Forest Planned Community requires a Use Permit for mini-satellite wagering facilities and uses with late night hours; and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2012, the City gave public notice by advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation, and on August 10, 2012 posted the public notice at City Hall and the El Toro and Foothill Ranch branches of the public library, and mailed to all property owners within 300 feet of the project boundary; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Development Services has reviewed the project's potential effects on the environment and has recommended that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301, Class 1 for existing facilities; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2012, the Planning Commission continued the item to September 13, 2012;

WHEREAS, on September 13, 2012, the Planning Commission conducted a noticed public hearing at which time interested persons had an opportunity to testify in support of, or opposition to, the Use Permit and at which the Planning Commission considered the Use Permit;

WHEREAS, the public hearing was continued to the October 25, 2012 Planning Commission meeting, and subsequently to the November 8, 2012 Planning

Commission meeting, at which the Planning Commission gave further consideration to the Use Permit.

NOW THEREFORE, THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST DOES RESOLVE, DETERMINE, FIND AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS. The Lake Forest Planning Commission hereby finds, based on consideration of the whole record before it, as follows:

1. CEQA: The approval of the permit application is in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, Article 19, the proposed project is exempt under Section 15301. CEQA Section 15301 exempts projects which involve additions to an existing building, that is less than 2,500 square feet. The project falls under this Class 1 exemption for existing facilities because the project includes a façade remodel and the addition of a 381 square foot outdoor patio area.

2. General Plan Consistency: The use or project proposed is consistent with the General Plan.

The General Plan Land Use Designation for the property is Commercial. The proposed use, does not conflict with the Commercial Land Use Designation. Furthermore, the project is consistent with the following applicable General Plan Policies:

- *General Plan Policy 2.2 in the Land Use Element states that the City should promote high quality in design of development projects. The façade remodel incorporates new entry ways, a new color scheme and new materials which provides the building with articulation and architectural interest. The remodel includes the elimination of the wood eyebrow on the building and introduces stucco material to the building, which is consistent with materials used on buildings in the adjacent area. Accordingly, the façade remodel will enhance the aesthetics of the existing restaurant building.*
- *General Plan Policy 3.1 states that the city should ensure that new development fits within the existing setting and is compatible with the physical characteristics of available land, surrounding land uses and public infrastructure availability. As detailed in Finding 4 of this resolution, the building, including the landscaping, parking lot and architecture is compatible with the surrounding buildings and the proposed use is compatible with the surrounding uses.*

- *General Plan Policy 4.1 states that the City should ensure that all development proposals within the planned community areas conform to applicable development plans and agreements. As stated in Finding 3 of this resolution, the project is in compliance with all the regulations in the Lake Forest Planned Community.*

Therefore, the proposed project, as conditioned, is consistent with the General Plan and all applicable goals and policies.

3. Zoning Code: The use, activity, or improvement(s) proposed by the application is consistent with the provisions of the Zoning Code.

The project site is zoned Community Commercial in the Lake Forest Planned Community. The proposed restaurant with mini-satellite horse race wagering with late night hours (open after midnight) requires approval of a Use Permit. Furthermore, the project is in compliance with all applicable zoning code requirements, including setback, building height, and parking. The parking is being satisfied in accordance with Section 9.168.110 of the City's Municipal Code which allows up to a 5% reduction in parking for the purpose of accommodating modifications to an existing development to meet current legal requirements or regulations for purposes of accessibility and safety. With the approval of this Use Permit, the project will be in compliance with all applicable zoning code requirements.

4. Compatibility: The location, size, design and operating characteristics of the proposed use will not create significant noise, traffic, or other conditions or situations that may be objectionable, detrimental or incompatible with other permitted uses in the vicinity.

The proposed use is a freestanding building located adjacent to an office building, the Rockfield Showplace retail commercial center and the Interstate 5 freeway. The project is not adjacent to any residential properties. Most of the activities at the restaurant/wagering facility will occur within the interior of the building. The project includes an outdoor patio area, which as conditioned, will not include any speakers, wagering or live entertainment. Therefore, there will be minimal noise impacts from the restaurant, even with the late hours proposed. A traffic generation study was conducted that concluded the proposed use would not generate any more traffic than the previous restaurant use. Furthermore, the project has been designed to make the building architecture more compatible with the surrounding area by replacing the deteriorating wood eyebrow with

stucco and painting the building neutral brown and tan colors. Therefore, the proposed use, as conditioned, will not create significant noise, traffic, or other conditions that may be objectionable, detrimental, or incompatible with surrounding uses.

5. General Welfare: The application will not result in conditions or circumstances contrary to the public health and safety and the general welfare.

The project, as conditioned, is subject to compliance with all applicable State, County, and City design, building, and other safety related laws, codes, and regulations, including, but not limited to, the California Building Code, Uniform Fire Code and the regulations from the California Horse Racing Board. Furthermore, the project as conditioned, will comply with all measures identified in the approved security plan. Therefore, the proposed use will not endanger the public health, safety or welfare.

6. Development Fees for Provision of Public Facilities.

The proposed project is located in an existing building for which all applicable development fees were paid at the time the building was constructed.

7. City Design Guidelines: The project has been reviewed in accordance with Citywide Design Guidelines, and is consistent with the purpose and intent of the guidelines.

In accordance with the design guidelines, the façade remodel is creating new identifiable entries into the restaurant, providing new articulation to the façade facing the street and adding new landscaping to soften the appearance of the building. Furthermore, the proposed restaurant is part of the "Lake Forest Planned Community Freeway Area" Design Guideline district. Pursuant to the Guidelines, the project incorporates landscaping that softens the appearance of the building along the freeway. In addition, the elevation along the freeway will be improved with the removal of the satellite dish, replacement of the deteriorating wood with stucco and the repainting of the building. Accordingly, the project has been reviewed in accordance with the Citywide Design Guidelines and is found consistent with the purpose and intent of the Guidelines.

SECTION 2. PLANNING COMMISSION ACTIONS. The Planning Commission hereby takes the following actions:

1. Approve a categorical exemption for the project under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301, (Class 1) and file a Notice of Exemption with the Clerk for the County of Orange as provided under Public Resources Code Section 21152(b) and CEQA Guidelines Section 15062. A copy of the Notice of Exemption is on file and available for public review at Lake Forest City Hall, 25550 Commercentre Drive, Suite 100, Lake Forest, CA 92630.
2. Approve Use Permit 7-12-2725 subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:
Use Permit 7-12-2725

1. Indemnification: The applicant shall indemnify, protect, defend, and hold the City, and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, authorized volunteers and instrumentalities thereof, harmless from any and all claims, demands, lawsuits, writs of mandamus, and other actions and proceedings (whether legal, equitable, declaratory, administrative or adjudicatory in nature), and alternative dispute resolution procedures (including, but not limited to arbitrations, mediations, and other such procedures), judgments, orders, and decisions (collectively "Actions"), brought against the City, and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof, that challenge, attack, or seek to modify, set aside, void, or annul, any action of, or any permit or approval issued by the City and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof (including actions approved by the voters of the City) for or concerning the project, whether such Actions are brought under the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Environmental Quality Act, the Planning and Zoning Law, the Subdivision Map Act, Community Redevelopment Law, Code of Civil Procedure Sections 1085 or 1094.5, or any other federal, state, or local constitution, statute, law, ordinance, charter, rule, regulation, or any decision of a court of competent jurisdiction. It is expressly agreed that the City shall have the right to approve, which approval will not be unreasonably withheld, the legal counsel providing the City's defense, and that applicant shall reimburse City for any costs and expenses directly and necessarily incurred by the City in the course of the

defense. City shall promptly notify the applicant of any Action brought and City shall cooperate with applicant in the defense of the Action.

2. Expiration: Use Permit No. 7-12-2725 shall expire 24 months from the date of this approval if building permits for the project have not been issued or if the use has not been established and an extension of time has not been approved by the Director of Development Services. (PLNG)

Prior to any construction to the building or site, the following shall be completed:

3. The applicant shall obtain all necessary building, plumbing, electrical or mechanical permits for the proposed modifications. (BLDG)

Prior to the issuance of building permits, the following shall be completed:

4. The Water Quality Management Plan shall be approved by the Public Works Department. (ENG)
5. The construction plans shall indicate that all downspouts from the building shall be directed into the landscaped areas, unless otherwise approved by the engineering division. (ENG)
6. The final conditions of approval shall be printed on each plan set submitted for building permits. (PLNG)
7. The construction plans shall include a detail of the striping for the parking stalls, which shall comply with the City's standards. (PLNG)
8. The landscape plans shall be revised to include vines on the proposed green screen around the new patio. (PLNG)
9. The construction plans shall be revised to screen any existing and proposed roof-mounted mechanical equipment that is visible from the freeway. (PLNG)
10. The applicant or responsible party shall submit the plan(s) listed below to the Orange County Fire Authority for review and approval:
 - a. Architectural (service codes PR200- PR285). (OCFA)
11. The applicant shall revise the site plan and landscape plan to accommodate a landscape island at the end of the row of parking on the

southeast property line adjacent to the Rockfield Showplace parking lot and reduce the number of parking stalls in this row of parking to 15 spaces. The landscape island shall be expanded to maximum extent possible without obstructing the row of parking. The landscaping shall be consistent with the landscaping at the site and include a minimum of one tree. These revisions shall be subject to the review and approval of the Director of Development Services.

Prior to any work in the City's right-of-way, the following shall be completed:

12. An encroachment permit shall be obtained for any work in the City's right-of-way, including but not limited to the landscaping in the City's parkway.

During construction of the project, the following shall be completed:

13. Grading and construction activities shall be prohibited between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Monday through Friday; 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. Saturday; and at any time on Sunday or a federal holiday. (PLNG)
14. Prior to concealing interior construction, the applicant or responsible party shall submit the plan(s) listed below to the Orange County Fire Authority for review and approval:
 - a. Fire sprinkler system (service codes PR 430-455) if the building is currently sprinklered and the system requires modification.
 - b. Hood and duct extinguishing system (service code PR 355) – if applicable. (OCFA)

Prior to the finaling of building permits, the following shall be completed:

15. The satellite dish on the roof of the building shall be completely removed from the site. (PLNG)
16. The trash bins shall include attached lids, in accordance with the approved Water Quality Management Plan. (ENG)
17. A storm insert shall be installed for the drain located in the trash enclosure area, in accordance with the approved Water Quality Management Plan. (ENG)
18. All storm drains on the property shall have the appropriate storm stenciling and signage, in accordance with the approved Water Quality Management Plan. (ENG)

19. The applicant shall submit a letter of certification to the Director of Development Services from the project architect certifying that all improvements have been constructed in accordance with the approved building plans. Determination of consistency shall be subject to the review and approval of the Director of Development Services. (PLNG)
20. The applicant shall have installed the landscaping and irrigation in accordance with the approved construction plans. The applicant shall submit a landscape installation verification letter from the project's landscape architect or landscaper indicating that the landscaping for the project was installed in accordance with the approved plan. (PLNG)

Prior to the operation of the mini-satellite wagering, the following shall be completed:

21. The applicant shall submit evidence to the Director of Development Services demonstrating the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) has issued all necessary approvals for the mini-satellite horse wagering facility, including but not limited to wagering equipment, and operation plans. (PLNG)
22. Prior to the operation of the business, the applicant shall submit a security plan for review and approval of Lake Forest Police Services and the Director of Development Services. The security plan shall include, but not be limited to, a written description of the process for hiring security personnel or the security firm that is being contracted, required qualifications of the security personnel or firm, the number of security personnel that will be on-site, hours that the security personnel will be on-site, specific locations in the building that security will be patrolling, description of how security is to be stationed at the restaurant entrance to ensure the facility is restricted to customers 21 years of age or older, locations of security surveillance both inside and outside the building, security for money that is on-site and specific measures to ensure parking lot safety at night. (POL)

The use shall be operated and maintained in substantial conformance with the following:

23. The business shall not be open between the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., unless specifically approved by amendment to the Use Permit by the Planning Commission. (PLNG)

24. The applicant shall comply with the approved security plan. Any amendments to the security plan shall be approved by the Lake Forest Police Services and the Director of Development Services. (POL)
25. The facility shall be restricted to customers 21 years old or older. Any changes to this condition of approval shall require an amendment to the Use Permit by the Planning Commission and an amendment to the approved security plan. (PLNG)
26. Pursuant to Chapter 5.36 of the Lake Forest Municipal Code, live entertainment shall only be allowed with a valid entertainment permit. A fee shall not be required for entrance to any live entertainment at the facility and there shall be no third party promotions of any live entertainment events at the facility. (PLNG)
27. Only a type 47 (On-Sale General for Bona Fide Public Eating Place) alcohol license shall be allowed at the restaurant, unless specifically approved by an amendment to this Use Permit by the Planning Commission. (PLNG)
28. If the business changes ownership, the new owner shall show evidence to the City's planning division of the California Horse Racing Board's approval of the change in ownership. (PLNG)
29. All Best Management Practices identified in the approved Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) shall be implemented. (ENG)
30. The business shall comply with City's Noise Ordinance (Chapter 11.16 of the Lake Forest Municipal Code). (PLNG)
31. There shall be no speakers or live entertainment in the patio area or anywhere outside of the building, unless approved by an amendment of this Use Permit by the Planning Commission or temporarily allowed by a Temporary Outdoor Promotion Permit and/or a Special Event permit. (PLNG)
32. Business identification signs are not a part of this approval. All business identification signage will be subject to separate approval in compliance with the City's Sign Ordinance. Any freeway oriented signage will require approval of a Minor Planned Sign Program by the Planning Commission. (PLNG)

33. The project shall be operated in substantial conformance with the project description and plans as conditioned and approved by the Lake Forest Planning Commission on November 8, 2012 and on file with the Development Services Department. Any changes to the approved facility shall be subject to additional review as determined by the Development Services Director. (PLNG)



The California Commerce Club Inc. d/b/a Commerce Casino filed an application for a license to operate a minisatellite wagering site at its facility, the Commerce Casino in Commerce, California, for a period of up to five years. It is currently licensed through April 25, 2013 as a minisatellite wagering facility.

- Commerce Casino is a card club located in the southern zone. Its card club license is valid through March 31, 2013. The proposed minisatellite wagering site will be located in the California Commerce Club (facility).

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE REQUEST FROM
RANCHO PASEANA TRAINING CENTER IN SANTA FE, CALIFORNIA TO BECOME AN
AUTHORIZED TRAINING CENTER

Regular Board Meeting
February 21, 2013

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19440 provides that the Board shall adopt regulations for the control of horse racing. Article 3.5, Track Safety Standards, of the Board's Rules and Regulations describes in detail the provisions that any association, fair or training facility must comply with to be used for timed and reported workouts. Within Article 3.5, Rules 1471, General Provisions and Conditions; 1472, Rail Construction and Track Specifications; 1473, Renovation of Dirt Racetrack; and 1474, Maintenance of Dirt Racetrack, address the requirements to be granted the status of an authorized training center.

ANALYSIS

Rancho Paseana Training Center (RPTC), located in Rancho Santa Fe, California, has requested permission to conduct timed workouts for Del Mar, Santa Anita and Hollywood Park. RPTC has stated in writing that these works will not be a vehicle for RPTC to collect stabling and vaning fees, they are meant only as a means of convenience for owners and trainers and will be conducted on Saturdays only. CHRB backside and trackside inspections have been conducted and RPTC is in compliance with all applicable regulations.

Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District conducted a general facility and landscaping inspection on January 31, 2013 and February 1, 2013 and found RPTC to be in compliance. These inspections are conducted on an annual basis. Rural/Metro Ambulance will be providing medical support services. The response time of Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District is less than five minutes.

The Del Mar Turf Club, The Los Angeles Turf Club and Betfair Hollywood Park have submitted letters indicating they will accept works from RPTC. As an authorized training center, RPTC will come under the jurisdictional oversight of the CHRB.

RPTC has fulfilled the requirements of the items listed in document CHRB-30B; Requirements for Approval to Operate an Auxiliary Stabling Area or Authorized Full Time Training Facility.

Rancho Paseana is a premier racehorse facility in sunny San Diego County that has been providing years of quality training and rehabilitation for Thoroughbred horses. The Training facility is nestled between the Pacific Ocean and the scenic hills of Rancho Santa Fe, CA. We are conveniently located fewer than five miles east of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club and approximately two hours south of either Santa Anita Park or Hollywood Park. Rancho Paseana is seeking approval from the California Horse Racing Board to be designated as a recognized Thoroughbred Training Facility with official clocked workouts.


Our Facility features a newly redone and well-maintained three-quarter mile dirt training track with ideal footing for any racehorse. CHRB-30B (Rev 9/08)

The California Horse Racing Board's requirements for approval to operate as an auxiliary stabling area or authorized full-time training facility are as follows:

1. The facility premises must be secure; that is, enclosed by perimeter fencing and guarded against unauthorized entry of unlicensed or disqualified persons, and against the unauthorized removal of any racehorse stabled at the facility. The premises must be patrolled during hours of darkness for security and fire detection purposes.
2. All persons within the facility engaged in any racing occupation must possess a valid California Horse Racing Board occupational license. Horses stabled at the facility must be eligible to compete at a California race meeting, be properly registered, properly identified, and not be in the care of, custody of, or owned by a disqualified person. A record must be maintained of the entry and departure of unlicensed visitors to the facility and of all racehorses stabled at the facility.
3. The buildings of the facility must meet the Board's fire prevention standards and have been inspected within the preceding twelve months by the fire authority having jurisdiction, with a fire clearance letter from that fire authority provided to the Board.
4. Every auxiliary stabling or full time authorized training facility shall post in its stable and backstretch worker housing areas the fire regulations applicable on its grounds. The notices shall be in English and Spanish, and posted no more than 100 feet apart or as approved by the local fire authority. No person shall violate the posted fire regulations. The facility shall also post:
 - a. Its emergency evacuation plan, which shall state the nearest exit in case of fire or other emergency.
 - b. The location of the nearest fire alarm box.
 - c. The telephone number of the fire department or other pertinent instructions as to the method for reporting a fire in the area.
5. The racecourse at the facility must have been surveyed and properly marked with the prescribed distance poles. During established training hours, there must be a track attendant on duty with immediate access to a communication or telephone system for emergency use.
6. An ambulance and properly qualified attendants shall be available at all times during training and workout hours, OR the facility may submit an Emergency Procedures Plan for accidents to the Executive Director for approval. The Emergency Procedures Plan shall include the following:
 - a. A list of two emergency medical services used by the facility and two alternative services if the primary services are not available, including response times.
 - b. Names of facility employees trained in basic first aid and holding current CPR certification.

- c. Type and location of communication equipment used to contact emergency medical services.
 - d. Locations where emergency telephone numbers for ambulance, fire, and police services will be posted in public view.
7. The services of an official clocker must be obtained and a regular schedule posted as to the day(s) and times during which recorded workout services are available. Any official clocker at the facility shall record only those workouts actually observed and must identify each horse for which an official workout is being recorded.
 8. The facility cannot be established for any exclusive use; that is, the facility must be open to licensed trainers having eligible racehorses in their care. This does not preclude facility management from exercising lawful discretion as to the persons or horses permitted access to the facility.
 9. Facility management must provide the Board with documented evidence of their surety for Workers' Compensation and for general liability.
 10. In the case of Thoroughbreds, the racecourse of the facility must be accessible to the Daily Racing Form so that official workouts held at the facility will be included in the past performance record for the respective horses.
 11. Facility management and all persons permitted access to the secured stabling facility must be notified (by a sign or other direct method) that by entering the facility, consent is given to the Board to search his/her assigned stabling premises, personal belongings, and vehicle.
 12. Facility management must agree to comply with all Board rules and regulations relating to the conduct and operation of a stable area.
 13. Facility management must agree to comply with all Board rules and regulations relating to Track Safety Standards.

If you believe your facility meets the established requirements, or can be brought into compliance within a reasonable period of time, contact the Chief Investigator, at the headquarters office, and arrange for a site compliance inspection at a mutually convenient time. Following the inspection, your request for approval as an auxiliary stabling area or authorized full-time training facility will be presented before the Board for consideration.

RE: CHRB – Requirements for approval to operate an auxiliary stabling area or Authorized Training Facility for Official Workouts Only Please Note: Rancho Paseana is seeking approval to operate as a Training Facility for Official Workouts only. We are not planning to race or transport horses from this training center to the racetracks to be run the same day.

1. The facility perimeter is enclosed by eight foot high v-mesh fencing. Each of the four entrances has a wrought Iron Gate that is controlled by an electronic keypad combination system. The training entrance has the added security of a second gate manual gate that is required to be closed during training hours.
 - a. The property is patrolled regularly 24 hours a day by Rancho Santa Fe Protection Services. A night watchman is on duty 7 nights a week. The Farm Manager and alternate Emergency coordinator both reside on the property.
2. Clifford W Sise Jr is a licensed trainer by through the CHRB. All employees of Craig Stables Inc (dba Rancho Paseana) involved with the horses (grooms, hot walkers, exercise riders, etc) will obtain a license by the CHRB.
 - a. All horses entering the Training Center are identified by Tatoo Number and/or markings with Registration number in correspondence with The Jockey Club's records.
 - b. The horse owner is identified for billing purposes. They often times already have a CHRB owner's license or are instructed on how to obtain one.
 - c. All unlicensed visitors or guest are instructed to call ahead and must be permitted through the gate and accompanied by a Rancho Paseana employee/ CHRB license person. They are also requested to sign our guest book.
 - d. Any transportation company or horse hauler entering the property is required to submit an insurance binder or written proof of general liability.
 - e. All visitors, guests, contractors, etc are notified by posted sign upon entering that this training center is compliant with all CHRB rules and regulations.
3. The Training Center is inspected annually by the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District. The fire extinguishers/hoses are inspected annually by America's Finest Fire Protection Safety Services. A Fire Safety Self-Inspection is complete monthly by our maintenance director.
4. The bilingual fire regulation notices are posts as required by the local fire authority. This includes the Emergency Evacuation procedure and Site Map.

5. The racetrack and marking poles has been surveyed. The track certification of approval is on file and can be submitted to the Board for review. A foreman and/or trainer are required have a mobile phone and oversee the racetrack during training hours.
 6. The Fire department, Ambulance and Police have an emergency response time of less than 5 minutes. An Emergency Horse Transport unit is ready and waiting on the sidelines during scheduled workout days. A veterinarian is always on-call and Helen Woodward Equine Hospital is in our backyard, within walking distance. An Emergency procedure plan with site map is posted outside the training center office in public view and will be submitted to the board for review.
 7. An official clocker has agreed to come regularly (ideally one morning per week) to record workouts. The schedule will be posted.
 8. The training center is open licensed and insured trainers having eligible horses in their care provided stalls are available.
 9. Workers Compensation Notice is posted as required by State and Federal Law. "Documented evidence" or binders for Workers' Compensation (currently State Fund) and general liability (currently Allied Insurance) can be provided to the CHRB.
 10. Rancho Paseana is a training center for Thoroughbred racehorses, and we welcome the Daily Racing Form to observe and document official workouts.
 11. All persons entering Rancho Paseana are notified by posted signs, guest book, and employee training that our facility is compliant with all CHRB rules and regulations. This includes the given consent for the Board to search assigned stabling premises, etc.







STAFF ANALYSIS
PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION BY THE BOARD

CATEGORIES LIST BY CLASSIFICATION, TO ADD AND/OR RECLASSIFY
SPECIFIED DRUG SUBSTANCES.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19580 provides that the Board shall adopt regulations to establish policies, guidelines and penalties relating to equine medication to preserve and enhance the integrity of horse racing in this state. Section 19581 of the Business and Professions Code states that no substance of any kind shall be administered by any means to a horse after it has been entered to race in a horse race, unless the Board has, by regulation, specifically authorized the use of the substance and the quantity and composition thereof. Business and Professions Code section 19582 provides that violations of Business and Professions Code section 19581, as determined by the Board, are punishable in regulations adopted by the Board, and that the Board may classify violations based upon each class of prohibited drug substances, prior violations within the previous three years and prior violations within the violator's lifetime.

A proposal to amend Rule 1843.2, Classification of Drug Substances was discussed at the August 24, 2012 Medication and Track Safety Committee (committee) Meeting. The proposal would amend Rule 1843.2 to reflect changes to the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) drug classifications. The committee agreed to recommend to the Board that Rule 1843.2 be amended as proposed to bring it in line with the RCI Model Rule drug classifications.

At its October 2012 Regular Meeting, the Board discussed the proposal to amend Rule 1843.2. After discussion, the Board directed staff to initiate a 45-day public comment period.

ANALYSIS

The current CHRB drug classification system under Rule 1843.2, Classification of Drug Substances, was adopted in 2008 and is based on the RCI drug classifications as they existed in 2007 when the addition of Rule 1843.2 was first proposed. Since its adoption in 2008, Rule 1843.2 has not been updated. In an effort to promote national uniformity the CHRB drug classification scheme was based on the RCI drug classifications with very few exceptions. The RCI has added or reclassified over 100 drugs since 2008. The proposed amendment of Rule 1843.2 will update the regulation to reflect the RCI changes except as noted in the list below, which are recommendations that differ from the RCI recommendations. The recommendations are based on the consensus recommendations of CHRB Equine Medical Director Dr. Rick Arthur, and Dr. Knych and Dr. Stanley of UC Davis:

- **Venoms Not Otherwise** classified to be added as a Drug Class 1 drug with a Category A penalty to address unforeseen use of other venoms as was the case with the frog venom dermorphin.

- **Snake Venoms** are currently Drug Class 2 with a Penalty Category A. Dr.'s Arthur, Knych and Stanley recommend Snake Venoms be classified as a Drug Class 1 drug with a Category A penalty. This is consistent with α -Cobratoxin (Cobra Venom) classification and penalty.
- **Carisoprodol** (Soma, Relaxin) is a legitimate therapeutic drug used as a muscle relaxant in some cases of muscle spasms. This is currently a CHRB Drug Class 2 with a Penalty Category B which Dr.'s Arthur, Knych and Stanley believe is appropriate for this medication and adequately controls its use. A Penalty Category A is unnecessary.
- **Darbepoetin** (Aranesp) is currently CHRB Drug Class 1 with a Penalty Category A. This is an erythropoiesis stimulating agent similar to Epogen. Erythropoiesis stimulating agents can be used for blood doping. Dr.'s Arthur, Knych and Stanley recommend this drug remain a CHRB Drug Class 1 with a Penalty Category A.
- **Somatrem** and **Somatropin** are recombinant growth hormones which would currently be CHRB Drug Class 1 with a Penalty Category A. The RCI recommend recombinant growth hormones stay Drug Class 1 with a Penalty Category A and these two drugs be specifically so classified.
- Related to the above a language change in Rule 1843.2 is recommended to clarify recombinant growth hormones and recombinant erythropoietins. Recombinant equine growth hormone and recombinant human growth hormone should be combined as **recombinant growth hormones**. This clarifies the use of recombinant growth hormones from other species such as recombinant bovine growth hormone. Similarly, recombinant human erythropoietin should be changed to **recombinant erythropoiesis stimulating agents**. All these should remain CHRB Drug Class 1 with a Penalty Category A.
- ARCI recommends **Dimethylsulfoxide (DMSO)** be moved to Drug Class 4 with a Penalty Category C. Dr.'s Arthur, Knych and Stanley support that change when the blood level exceeds 1 microgram in blood or 15 microgram in urine, the international standard. Otherwise DMSO should remain a Class 5 drug with Category D penalty.

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1843.2. Classification of Drug Substances.

The Board, the board of stewards, the hearing officer, or the administrative law judge, when adjudicating a hearing for a violation of Business and Professions Code section 19581, shall consider the classification of the substance as referenced in the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) Penalty Categories Listing by Classification (Revised ~~05/08~~ 02/13), hereby incorporated by reference, which is based on the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances (~~4/05~~ 12/11), as modified by the Board.

California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) Penalty Categories Listing by Classification

Class 1: Stimulant and depressant drugs that have the highest potential to affect performance and that have no generally accepted medical use in the racing horse. Many of these agents are Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) schedule II substances. These include the following drugs and their metabolites: Opiates, opium derivatives, synthetic opioids and psychoactive drugs, amphetamines and amphetamine-like drugs as well as related drugs, including but not limited to apomorphine, nikethamide, mazindol, pemoline, and pentylenetetrazol.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19420 provides that the Board has jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings. Business and Professions Code section 19440 states the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board include adjudication of controversies arising from the enforcement of those laws and regulations dealing with horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. Business and Professions Code section 19562 provides that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions, consistent with the provisions of this chapter, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California. Rule 1658, Vesting of Title to Claimed Horse, states that title to a horse which is claimed shall be vested in the successful claimant from the time the field has been dispatched from the starting gate and the horse becomes a starter. The successful claimant becomes the owner of the horse whether it is sound or unsound, or injured during the race or after it. However, the claim shall be void if the horse suffers a fatality during the running of the race or before it is returned to be unsaddled, or if the race is called off, canceled, or declared no contest.

A claiming race is a horse race in which each horse entered is made available for purchase, or claiming, at a fixed price which a buyer must agree to pay before the race is run. Claiming allows lesser quality horses to compete equally, as horses are entered for a price at which the owner or trainer feels is reasonable to lose it.

A claiming race is a venue through which a new owner may buy his first horse. It is also a venue where others claim (at bargain prices) horses they believe can compete at higher levels. However, claiming races can also be used by owners and trainers to rid themselves of horses whose performance is not what they expect, so the terms "*Caveat Emptor*" or "*Buyer Beware*" apply. The claimant does not get to examine the horse prior to putting in a claim, and the horse actually belongs to a successful claimant from the time the field is dispatched (unless there is reason to void the claim under the provisions of the rule).

In 2011 Rule 1658 was amended to allow the stewards to void a claim if the horse suffered a fatality during the running of the race or before it was returned to be unsaddled.

ANALYSIS

In July 2011, the Board adopted a modified version of an amendment to Rule 1658 which was recommended by the Medication and Track Safety Committee (Committee). The amendment allowed a claim to be voided by the stewards if the horse suffered a fatality during the running of the race or before the horse was returned to be unsaddled. The stewards have interpreted the provision to mean the horse must die or be euthanized before the horse leaves the track.

On December 2, 2011, the mare Dave's Revenge was pulled up just past the wire after running second in the fourth race at Hollywood Park. By order of the racing veterinarian, Dave's Revenge was removed from the track in the horse ambulance, and shortly thereafter euthanized after evaluation of her injuries. There was an \$8,000 claim in for Dave's Revenge. Even though the racing veterinarian fully expected the attending veterinarian would decide to euthanize Dave's Revenge, she was taken directly in the ambulance to the euthanasia location. Based on their interpretation of Rule 1658, the stewards allowed the claim to stand because the death did not occur before the horse was returned to be unsaddled. More recently, at the 2012 Del Mar meet, a similar scenario occurred when the filly Elivette was claimed and sent by ambulance to the barn of her new trainers and eventually euthanized. Injured horses are removed from the track by ambulance whenever the horse can be safely and humanely transported to allow the horse's owner, trainer and attending veterinarian make the irreversible decision to euthanize a horse.

The decision to euthanize a horse on the track or remove the horse by ambulance is made by the racing (association) veterinarian based on his or her professional opinion. This is a long held policy in California, is supported by recommendations of the American Association of Equine Practitioners for the management of horses injured on the track and is unrelated to whether a horse is claimed or not.

The Medication and Track Safety Committee revisited Rule 1658 at its January 10, 2012 meeting and presented a proposal to amend the rule at the Board's January 2012 Regular Meeting. The proposal was not adopted at the time due to an unclear understanding as to how the proposal would work logistically. In August 2012, the Committee drafted a new proposal to amend Rule 1658. The proposed amendment added a provision to the rule to void claims for horses placed on the Veterinarian's List as unsound or lame.

At its September 2012 Regular Meeting, the Board discussed the Committee's proposal to amend Rule 1658. The amendment would require the stewards to void a claim if the racing or official veterinarian determine the horse will be placed on the Veterinarian's List as unsound or lame before the horse is released to the successful claimant. After discussing the proposal, the Board directed staff to initiate the 45-day public comment period regarding the proposed amendment. During the comment period three comments in opposition were received. Six comments were received in favor of the proposed amendment. Among the six favorable comments were letters from The Jockey Club and the Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit. Those in favor of the proposed amendment stated the proposed rule supports integrity in horse racing and the health and safety of horse and rider.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE REQUEST FROM THE JOCKEYS' GUILD TO AMEND CHRB RULE 1632, JOCKEY'S RIDING FEE, TO CHANGE THE DEFINITION OF "WIN PURSE" SO THAT FEES PAID BY THE OWNER TO ENTER THE HORSE IN THE RACE ARE NO LONGER DEDUCTED PRIOR TO CALCULATING THE WINNING JOCKEY'S RIDING FEES.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19420 states jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the California Horse Racing Board. Business and Professions Code section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. Business and Professions Code section 19501 provides that the Board establishes the minimum wage that jockeys receive as the minimum jockey riding fee, and that jockeys may earn additional amounts if the horse they are racing places first, second or third. Business and Professions Code section 19562 provides that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions, consistent with the provisions of this chapter, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California. Board Rule 1632, Jockey's Riding Fee, provides a scale of jockey riding fees to be used in the absence of a contract or special agreement. This scale defines the pay earned by the jockey of the winning horse as ten percent of the Win Purse. For the purposes of Rule 1632 (d) Win Purse is defined as "the amount paid the winning horse less the fees paid by the owner to enter the horse in the race."

The Jockeys' Guild requested the Board amend Rule 1632 to change the definition of Win Purse to "the amount paid the winning horse." This would remove the language that allows for the subtraction of entry fees from stakes race purses before calculating the ten percent jockey fee.

ANALYSIS

A review of the rules and regulations of the Association of Racing Commissioners International as well as the states of Arizona, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Oregon found that Arizona, Maryland and Ohio all have rules, or practices, similar to California, allowing for the subtraction of stakes race entry fees from the winning purse before calculating the jockey fees. The Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) has shown that New York also allows for the entry fees to be subtracted before jockey fee calculation. The Jockeys' Guild stated that under Rule 1632 the definition of Win Purse results in lowering jockey fees for winning horses. As the most extreme example, the winning jockey of the 2012 Breeder's Cup Classic, run at Santa Anita, earned \$10,000 less than he would have had the race been run at Churchill Downs (2012 Breeder's Cup entry fee was two percent of gross purse, gross purse for

the Breeders Cup Classic was \$5,000,000; that would make the entry fee \$100,000, ten percent of which would be \$10,000).

The proposed amendment would result in an increase in California jockey fees for the winning horse in a stakes race. The owners' entry costs would no longer be subtracted from the Win Purse before the jockey fee is calculated. Staff contacted the TOC regarding the proposed amendment. The TOC stated it was opposed to the action.

(c) A jockey's fee is considered earned when the jockey is weighed out by the clerk of scales. The fee shall not be considered earned if the jockey elects to take himself off of his mount. If there is a substitution of jockeys, no additional jockey fee or double jockey fee need be paid except when ordered by the stewards.

(d) In this rule "Win Purse" means the amount paid the winning horse ~~less the fees paid by the owner to enter the horse in the race.~~

(e) If the parties agree on the fee to be paid the jockey, a contract or agreement in writing signed by the jockey or his agent and the owner or his authorized agent specifying the agreed upon fee if a winning mount, second place mount, third place mount and losing mount shall be delivered to the paymaster of purses before the running of the race in question. The paymaster of purses shall debit the owner's purse account under the contract or written agreement. If no contract or written agreement is submitted before the running of the race in question, the paymaster of purses shall debit the owner's purse account under the fee scale set forth in this rule.

(f) A jockey may not share in the fees of another jockey.

Dear Chairman Israel and Member of the Board,


I am writing on behalf of the Jockey's Guild to express its full support for modifying the CHRB's current rule, applicable only to stakes races, which provides that jockeys who finish first, second, or third in a race are paid on a percentage of the net purse, after deductions for owner's fees, rather than the gross purse as in the case of non-stakes races.

As far as we know, California is the only racing state that pays jockeys on the net purse in stakes races.

This has lead to a significant loss of income for California jockeys. For example, the most recent Breeder's Cup, we estimate that individual jockeys earned as much as \$15,000 less than they would have earned had the Breeder's Cup still been held in another state.

Essentially, the rule change would conform California's racing standards to the uniform practice in other racing jurisdictions.

Thank you for forwarding the information relating to the proposed modification of CHRB Rule 1632, Jockey's Riding Fee, which is being requested by the Jockeys' Guild.

The Thoroughbred Owners of California are adamantly opposed to such a change. First of all, I want to point out the fact that other major racing states, such as New York and Maryland also pay a fee based upon the "net" winnings to the owner. As a point of fact, New York takes it a step further in that, while the owner receives 60% of the advertised purse, the jockey receives 10% of 55% of the purse AFTER the owner's fees are deducted. In other words, if a purse in a stakes race is \$65,000, then the owner would receive \$39,000. Assuming a 2% fee to enter and run, the jockey would get \$3,445 (\$35,750-1,300x10%), not \$3,900. More importantly though, is the point that the owner does not "win" the entire winner's share. He is simply receiving back the portion of the fees he paid into the purse. They are not winnings. For comparison purposes, it would be similar to an individual who wagers \$1,000, only to collect \$1,100. Would it be fair for the government to tax him on winnings of \$1,100 when, in fact, he has only won \$100? I think this is a reasonable analogy and clearly makes our point.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19420 provides that jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in this State where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the California Horse Racing Board. Business and Professions Code section 19440 states that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering, and administration and enforcement of all laws, rules and regulations affecting horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. Business and Professions Code section 19460 provides that all licenses granted under this chapter are subject to all rules, regulations and conditions from time to time prescribed by the Board. Business and Professions Code section 19481 states that in performing its duties the Board shall establish safety standards governing track facilities in order to improve the safety of horses, riders and workers at the racetrack. Board Rule 1927, Fire Prevention, states association shall make adequate provision for fire prevention, protection against fire, and fire suppression within the inclosure. A reasonable standard of fire safety shall require that each building, barn or structure which is used by an association for the stabling of horses or human habitation, be equipped with an automatic sprinkler system and an automatic fire alarm system.

Fire safety is a continuing issue within the inclosure. To protect humans and equines the Board requires that racing associations install and maintain sprinkler systems and fire alarms. Racing associations are also required to undergo annual fire inspections, and periodic safety inspections. The disabling of smoke detectors is a problem that occurs especially in habitable rooms used for sleeping. Under Rule 2103, Habitable Rooms, such rooms are required to be provided with battery operated smoke detectors that are maintained in working order, or any other approved fire alarm system. Occupants may wish to smoke where it is otherwise prohibited, or to cook on portable hot plates. To enable such activities, the smoke detectors may be disabled. If a licensee is found to have disabled a smoke detector, the average fine is around \$25.

At the April 2011 Medication and Track Safety Committee Meeting, the issue of prohibiting the tampering with smoke detectors was discussed. The Committee wanted to find a way to prevent the smoke detectors from being disabled. It was agreed that the horsemen, Thoroughbred Owners of California, and California Thoroughbred Trainers needed to meet with the horse racing associations to work jointly to resolve the issue. For the period of February 13, 2012

through February 12, 2013, there have been 21 violations state wide of Rule 1928, Fire Regulations, for "tampering with smoke detector."

At the May 2012 Medication Advisory Committee Meeting, the concern regarding prohibiting the tampering of smoke detectors was again discussed. The Committee agreed to recommend to the Board a fine of no less than \$25 for the offender and no less than \$100 for the trainer whose employee is found to have violated the regulation.

In January 2013 the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) stated it had substantive issues with Rule 1927.1. Although the rule provided for minimum fines, the submitted text was unclear on imposed fine maximums, to whom the \$100 fine was for, and extent of the trainers culpability. OAL also determined that State Fire Marshal approval was needed as the proposed rule falls within the scope of Government Code 11359, requiring State Fire Marshal approval on any fire safety related regulation. Proposed Rule 1927.1 was therefore withdrawn, allowing the Board until August, 2013 for resubmission.

At the February 20, 2013 Medication and Track Safety Committee the proposed revisions to Rule 1927.1 were presented for discussion and action.

ANALYSIS

Rule 1927.1 has been rewritten to satisfy the requirements of OAL, clarifying the fine maximums and extent of the trainer's culpability. Rule 1927.1, Tampering With Smoke Detectors Prohibited, provides that no licensee shall tamper with, dismantle, or disable any automatic fire alarm system or smoke detector that is located on the grounds of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Board. If licensees are found to have violated the proposed regulation, they shall be subject to a hearing before the stewards, and a fine of at least \$25, but not more than \$100. The fine, while not excessive, is meant to prevent future incidents. In addition, the proposed regulation states that the stewards may find a trainer culpable if an employee of that trainer disables a fire alarm in that trainer's assigned area more than once in a 365 day period. The trainer may be fined a minimum of \$100, but not more than \$500. This is designed to encourage trainers to pay attention to what their employees may be doing with fire safety equipment.

If the Board approves the proposed revisions of Rule 1927.1 it will then be sent to the State Fire Marshal for approval before resubmission to OAL.

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. The Board may wish to hear from the Medication and Track Safety Committee.

1927.1. Tampering With Smoke Detectors Prohibited.

(a) No licensee shall willfully tamper with, dismantle, or disable any automatic fire alarm system or smoke detector that is located on the grounds of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Board.

(b) A violation of this regulation shall result in a hearing before the stewards who may impose a minimum fine of \$25 up to a maximum fine of \$100.

(bc) A licensed trainer who is assigned stalls, tack rooms or other areas within the inclosure may, after a hearing before the stewards, be held culpable for an employee's violation of this rule if the employee of the trainer if an employee of that trainer is found to have violated this regulation has within such assigned areas, committed a second or subsequent violation of this regulation within a 365 day period.

(1) The stewards may impose a fine of \$100 up to a maximum fine of \$500 on the trainer found culpable under subsection (c) of this regulation.

(e) A violation of this regulation shall result in a hearing before the stewards who may impose a fine of not less than \$25.

(1) The stewards may impose a fine of \$100 on the trainer whose employee is found to have violated this regulation.

BACKGROUND

When the California Horse Racing Board Enforcement Unit serves a disciplinary Complaint against a Licensee, the Licensee also receives a copy of the Governing Procedures that will be used in the prosecution of the matter. Attachment 1 is the current version of the Governing Procedures served by the Enforcement Unit.

The Governing Procedures are required to be given to the Licensee to inform him or her how the disciplinary hearing will be conducted. Importantly, the Governing Procedures set forth the rights of the Licensee, including the right to discover the evidence that supports the allegations in the Complaint, the right to have counsel represent the Licensee at the Hearing, the right to cross examine witnesses and present rebuttable evidence, as well as the appeal rights of the Licensee should the Board of Stewards uphold the Complaint.

Presently, there is only one form of Governing Procedures provided to the Licensee, regardless of the type of Rule violation alleged or the penalty to be requested. Staff Counsel and the Office of the Attorney General have reviewed the current Governing Procedures and propose adopting the three separate Governing Procedures, depending upon the type of Rule violation alleged and the penalty sought.

ANALYSIS

A. Attachment 2 is the proposed Governing Procedures for non-drug related violations before the Board of Stewards. Attachment 2 mirrors the current Governing Procedures with one important addition. Paragraph 9 distinguishes between a hearing seeking to revoke a license and a non-revocation hearing. The current Governing Procedures are silent in this important regard and do not provide the Licensee with a clear understanding of his or her rights. In the cases where the revocation of a license is sought, the totality of Chapter 5 (Administrative Adjudication: Formal Hearing) of the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) applies, Government Code section 11500 et seq, as mandated by Business and Professions Code section 19461. A revocation hearing will not be conducted by the Board of Stewards, but will be heard by an Administrative Law Judge, hearing officer or referee who will be taking evidence and drafting a proposed decision on behalf of the California Horse Racing Board to consider. Attachment 2 makes clear that the Board of Stewards may refer a matter to the California Horse Racing Board if license revocation is determined to be appropriate.

However, if license revocation is **not** sought, Business and Professions Code section 19461 does not require the disciplinary hearing to be conducted pursuant to Chapter 5 of the APA. In the

past and currently, non-revocation hearings before the Board of Stewards are conducted pursuant to the Governing Procedures in Attachment 1. Attachment 2 more clearly delineates how non-revocation disciplinary hearings before the Board of Stewards are to be conducted. Attachment 2 provides the non-revocation hearing will be conducted under Government Code section 11513 (Evidence; examination of witness), Government Code section 11514 (Affidavits) and Government Code section 11515 (Official Notice). Further, Attachment 2 conforms to the Administrative Adjudication Bill of Rights stated in Government Code section 11425.10.

Finally, Attachment 2 authorizes hearing officers to hear the appeals in addition to Administrative Law Judges and referees.

B. Attachment 3 is the proposed Governing Procedures for non-revocation Class 1, 2 or 3 Drug Violation cases. Attachment 3 is consistent with the Attachment 2, with an additional provision regarding a Licensee's right to elect to have the matter heard by the Board of Stewards or a hearing officer as permitted by Business and Professions Code section 19517.5.

Appeals from a non-revocation drug violation case will be heard directly by the California Horse Racing Board.

C. Attachment 4 is the proposed Governing Procedures for Class 1, 2 or 3 Drug Violation cases where revocation of license is the penalty sought. Again, a license revocation hearing requires the proceeding be conducted pursuant to Chapter 5 of the APA, Government Code section 11500 et seq.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the three proposed Governing Procedures be adopted as presented.

RECOMMENDED MOTION

The California Horse Racing Board hereby adopts the Governing Procedures attached to Agenda Item 14 as Attachment 2, Attachment 3 and Attachment 4.

GOVERNING PROCEDURE FOR HEARING
BEFORE BOARD OF STEWARDS

1. You are entitled to reasonable advance notice of the charges against you. You are also entitled to receive, in advance of the hearing, copies of all investigative reports and support documentation which the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) investigators relied upon in bringing the charges against you, as well as all documents which the CHRB intends to put in evidence at the hearings.
2. You will have an opportunity to present your side of the case and rebut the case against you, including the opportunity to cross-examine witnesses who testify against you. You must bring all of your witnesses and all of your evidence to the hearing.
3. You are entitled to be represented by an attorney at the hearing.
4. The hearing shall be open to the public.
5. All or part of the hearing may be conducted telephonically, to the extent that all parties agree, and to the extent that each participant has an opportunity to participate in and to hear the proceeding while it is taking place.
6. If you believe that a steward on the Board of Stewards who will hear your case is biased or prejudiced against you, or has an interest in the outcome of the proceeding, you may challenge the steward. Upon such challenge, the steward may either disqualify him/herself or put the decision to the Board of Stewards, who must then decide whether you have stated a basis for disqualification of the steward. If a steward is disqualified, another steward will be appointed to sit on the Board of Stewards for purposes of hearing the matter. If the challenged steward is not disqualified, you may challenge the decision not to disqualify the steward as a separate matter on appeal. The decision of a steward or the Board of Stewards regarding such challenge is final.
7. From the time that the Complaint and Notice to Appear issues until the Board of Stewards renders its decision, you may not communicate, in any manner, directly or indirectly, with the Board of Stewards, unless at the same time, the communication is shared with all parties to the proceedings including the CHRB. This rule applies equally to the CHRB and its representatives.
8. You may request a subpoena for the production of witnesses or documents at the hearing. The Executive Director of the CHRB shall issue subpoenas at the request of any party to the matter for the purpose of compelling attendance at the attendance of a witness or the production of documents at the hearing. The Board of Stewards will decide disputes.

GOVERNING PROCEDURE FOR HEARING
BEFORE BOARD OF STEWARDS

9. A verbatim record of the proceedings will be made, using either a shorthand reporter or a tape recorder. You may request a tape recording or a transcript of the hearing from the CHRB. It will be provided to you free of charge.

10. You will receive a written decision after the hearing. The decision will be written by the majority, be based on the record, and include a statement of the factual and legal basis for the decision. The decision will also include a description of the penalty imposed, if any. The Board of Stewards will take action upon a majority decision. In the event of a split vote, each steward shall file a separate written decision on the matter.

11. You have 72 hours from the receipt of the written decision to appeal the Board of Stewards decision to the CHRB. You may request a stay of any penalty pending appeal.

12. If you timely appeal a Board of Stewards' decision, the matter will be heard on behalf of the CHRB by an administrative law judge (ALJ) or referee designated by the CHRB. On appeal, you bear the burden of showing that the law was improperly interpreted or applied by the Stewards and/or that the stewards' factual determinations were not supported by substantial evidence or that the best interest of racing in the State maybe better served by reversal or modification of the stewards decision. The ALJ/referee will draft a proposed decision and submit it to the CHRB.

13. The CHRB may adopt, modify and adopt, or reject the proposed decision of the ALJ/referee.

14. If you are dissatisfied with the CHRB's decision, you may appeal that decision to Superior Court.

ATTACHMENT 2

**GOVERNING PROCEDURE FOR DISCIPLINARY HEARING
BEFORE BOARD OF STEWARDS**

1. You are entitled to reasonable advance notice of the charges against you. You are also entitled to receive, in advance of the hearing, copies of all investigative reports and support documentation which the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) investigators relied upon in bringing the charges against you, and the CHRB will exchange with you copies of all documents which each party intends to put in evidence at the hearing.
2. You will have an opportunity to present your side of the case and rebut the case against you, including the opportunity to cross-examine witnesses who testify against you. You must bring all of your witnesses and all of your evidence to the hearing.
3. You are entitled to be represented by an attorney at the hearing.
4. The hearing shall be open to the public.
5. All or part of the hearing may be conducted telephonically to the extent that all parties agree and to the extent that each participant has an opportunity to participate in and to hear the proceeding while it is taking place.
6. If you believe that a steward on the Board of Stewards who will hear your case is biased or prejudiced against you or has an interest in the outcome of the proceeding, you may challenge that steward. Upon such challenge, the steward may either disqualify him/herself or put the decision to the Board of Stewards, who must then decide whether you have stated a basis for disqualification of that steward. If a steward is disqualified, another steward, will be appointed for purposes of hearing the matter. If the steward is not disqualified, you may challenge the decision not to disqualify the steward as a separate matter on appeal. The decision of the Board of Stewards regarding such challenge is final.
7. While the proceeding is pending, beginning with the issuance of the Complaint and Notice to Appear, you may not communicate, in any manner, directly or indirectly, with the Board of Stewards regarding any issue in the proceeding, unless, at or before the time the communication is made, the communication is shared with all the parties to the proceeding including the CHRB, and an opportunity is afforded to all parties to participate in the communication. This rule applies equally to the CHRB and its representatives. Nothing herein precluded communications made on the record at the hearing. Applicable exception to, and clarifications of, this rule are found in Government Code sections 11430.10 through 11430.80.
8. You may request a subpoena for the production of witnesses at the hearing and/or the production of documents at a reasonable time and place or at the hearing. The Executive Director of the CHRB shall issue subpoenas at the request of any party to the matter for the purpose of compelling attendance of a witness at the hearing or the production of documents. The Board of Stewards, hearing officer or referee will decide disputes.

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9. The Stewards may refer your matter to the CHRB if license revocation is determined to be appropriate. In that case, Chapter 5 of the Administrative Procedure Act will apply to the proceedings to revoke your license and will supplant any inconsistent provisions herein. Chapter 5 is Government Code sections 11500 et seq. If the matter is not referred to the CHRB, the proceedings will be held before the Board of Stewards, Hearing Officer or Referee under the evidentiary provisions of Government Code sections 11513, 11513 and 11515, but Chapter 5 will not otherwise apply.
10. A verbatim record of the proceedings will be made, using either a shorthand reporter or a tape recorder. You may request a record of the hearing from the CHRB. A tape or transcript of the hearing will be provided to you free of charge.
11. You will receive a written decision after the hearing. The written decision will include a statement of the factual and legal basis for the decision. The statement of the factual basis for the decision shall be based on the evidence of record and on matters officially noticed in the proceeding. The decision will also include a description of the penalty imposed, if any. The Board of Stewards will take action upon a majority decision. In the event the decision is not unanimous, one or more dissenting or concurring decisions shall be filed. Each steward shall file his/her own written decision or join in a written decision on the matter.
12. You may appeal the decision of the Board of Stewards' decision to the CHRB. Appeals must be received by a CHRB employee at any of its offices not later than 72 hours from the date of the decision.
13. If you timely appeal a decision, the matter will be heard on behalf of the CHRB by an administrative law judge (ALJ), a referee or a hearing officer designated by the CHRB. The ALJ, referee or hearing officer will draft a proposed decision and submit it to the CHRB. On appeal, you bear the burden of proving the facts necessary to sustain the appeal. The CHRB will consider evidence that was presented to the Board of Stewards. It will also consider whether the stewards mistakenly interpreted the law, whether new evidence of a convincing nature is produced, and whether the best interests of racing and the state may be better served by overruling the stewards' decision.
14. The CHRB may adopt, modify and adopt, or reject the proposed decision of the ALJ, referee or hearing officer.
15. If you are dissatisfied with the CHRB's decision, you may appeal that decision to the Superior Court.

ATTACHMENT 3

1. Your matter will be heard by the Board of Stewards or by a hearing officer. Below, the term "Presiding Officer" shall refer to the individual or individuals who will hear your case whether it be stewards or a hearing officer.
2. You are entitled to reasonable advance notice of the charges against you. You are also entitled to receive, in advance of the hearing, copies of all investigative reports and support documentation which the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) investigators relied upon in bringing the charges against you, and the CHRB will exchange with you copies of all documents which each party intends to put in evidence at the hearing.
3. You will have an opportunity to present your side of the case and rebut the case against you, including the opportunity to cross-examine witnesses who testify against you. You must bring all of your witnesses and all of your evidence to the hearing.
4. You are entitled to be represented by an attorney at the hearing.
5. The hearing shall be open to the public.
6. All or part of the hearing may be conducted telephonically to the extent that all parties agree and to the extent that each participant has an opportunity to participate in and to hear the proceeding while it is taking place.
7. If you believe that the Presiding Officer is biased or prejudiced against you or has an interest in the outcome of the proceeding, you may challenge the Officer. Upon such challenge, the Officer may disqualify him/herself. If your challenge is to a steward, the steward may put the decision to the Board of Stewards, who must then decide whether you have stated a basis for disqualification of the steward. If your challenge is to a hearing officer, the hearing officer may put the decision to the Executive Director. If a Presiding Officer is disqualified, another Presiding Officer will be appointed as a replacement. If the challenged Officer is not disqualified, you may challenge the decision not to disqualify the Officer as a separate matter on appeal. The decision of the challenged Presiding Officer, the Board of Stewards or Executive Director regarding such challenge is final.
8. From the time the Complaint and Notice to Appear issues until the CHRB renders its decision, you may not communicate, in any manner, directly or indirectly, with the Presiding Officer regarding

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any issue in the proceeding, unless, at or before the time the communication is made, the communication is shared with all parties to the proceeding including the CHRB, and an opportunity is afforded to all parties to participate in the communication. This rule applies equally to the CHRB and its representatives. Nothing herein precludes communications made on the record at the hearing. Applicable exceptions to, and clarifications of, this rule are found in Government Code sections 11430.10 through 11430.80.

9. You may request a subpoena for the production of witnesses at the hearing and/or the production of documents at a reasonable time and place or at the hearing. The Executive Director of the CHRB shall issue subpoenas at the request of any party to the matter for the purpose of compelling attendance of a witness at the hearing or the production of documents. The Presiding Officer will decide disputes.
10. The hearing will be conducted under the evidentiary provisions of Government Code sections 11513, 11514 and 11515. Otherwise, the only disciplinary proceedings to which Chapter 5 of the Administrative Procedure Act apply are license revocation proceedings, and the Board does not anticipate seeking a revocation of your license in this matter. Chapter 5 is Government Code sections 11500 et seq.
11. A verbatim record of the proceedings will be made, using either a shorthand reporter or a tape recorder. You may request a record of the hearing from the CHRB. A tape or transcript of the hearing will be provided to you free of charge.
12. The Presiding Officer will draft a proposed decision and submit it to the CHRB. The CHRB may adopt, modify and adopt, or reject the proposed decision of the Presiding Officer. The CHRB's written decision will include a statement of the factual and legal basis for the decision. The statement of the factual basis for the decision shall be based on the evidence of record and on matters officially noticed in the proceeding. The decision will also include a description of the penalty imposed, if any.
13. If you are dissatisfied with the CHRB's decision, you may appeal that decision to the Superior Court.

REPORT AND UPDATE
ON THE STATUS OF THE
EXCHANGE WAGERING RULEMAKING

Regular Board Meeting
February 21, 2013

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19604.5(e)(1) provides that the Board shall have full power to prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions under which exchange wagering may be conducted in California consistent with this section, including the manner in which exchange wagers may be accepted and the requirements for any person to participate in exchange wagering. Business and Professions Code section 19604.5(m) states the Board shall promulgate administrative rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of this section. At its November 2102 Regular Meeting the Board adopted the proposed addition of Article 27, Exchange Wagering, which comprises 25 regulations governing the conduct of exchange wagering in California. The following applies to the exchange wagering rulemaking file under the Administrative Procedures Act:

- The exchange wagering rulemaking file was submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) on January 31, 2013.
- OAL has 30-working days to review the file.
- Staff calculates OAL will provide a decision approximately March 15, 2012.
- Recent changes in the Government Code have resulted in new effective dates. Rather than a file becoming effective 30 days after OAL files it with the California Secretary of State, it will now be effective on a quarterly basis. If a file is submitted to the Secretary of State on March 1 to May 31, it will be effective July 1. However, staff has requested an effective upon filing date. If that is granted, and OAL approves the file, it would be effective March 15, 2013. If the request for an effective upon filing request is denied, the file would be effective July 1, 2013.
- If OAL denies the rulemaking file the CHRB has 120 days to make corrections.
- If the corrections are non-substantive, the file may be returned to OAL without readoption.
- If substantive provisions of the regulations have been significantly changed the CHRB must renotice for 45 days and readopt the regulations.
- Upon resubmission of a disapproved regulation to the OAL, it shall only review the resubmitted regulation for those reasons expressly identified in the written opinion, or for those issues arising as a result of a substantial change to a provision of the resubmitted regulation.
