STAFF ANALYSIS

July 12, 2018

Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY FAIR AT LOS ALAMITOS RACE COURSE SEPTEMBER 5, 2018 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 25, 2018.

Los Angeles County Fair (LACF) filed its application to conduct a horse racing meeting at Los Alamitos Race Course September 5, 2018 through September 25, 2018, or 12 days; the same number of days as in 2017. LACF proposes to race a total of 102 races; the same as in 2017. Live racing will commence September 6, 2018 through September 23, 2018. LACF is not participating in the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) combined horse racing meeting.

- The proposed race dates are the approved dates allocated to the fair.

- Racing Thursday through Sunday. 9 races per day Saturdays and Sundays; 8 races per day on Thursdays and Fridays.
- Racing concurrently with Golden Gate Fields.
- 2017 Race Meeting at Los Alamitos ran Thoroughbreds only: Average number of runners per race: 6.93.
- First post 1:00 p.m.
- Wagering program will use CHRB and ARCI rules.
 - Early wagering 8:30 a.m. – 10:00a.m.
 - \$2 Daily Double (DD) – placement of last DD will depend on number of races. DD takeout rate of 20%.
 - \$1 Trifecta on all eligible races.
 - \$0.10 Superfecta wagering on all eligible races.
 - Incoming simulcasts will not follow host track format.
 - \$2 Pick 6 last six races 70% carryover, 30% minor. Alternate runner provision
 - \$0.50 Pick 4 starting second race and last four races. Alternate runner provision.
 - \$0.50 Pick 5 starting first race. Minimum wager fifty cents, 14% takeout. One tier payoff: 100% carryover.
 - \$1 Pentafecta (Super H5) in the last race of the day only selecting the first five finishers in the same race. 100% payoff on all tickets five winners. No consolation. 100% carryover if no ticket has five winners.

- The Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) providers are TVG, Xpressbet, Twinspires, Watch and Wager and NYRAbets.

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19604, specific provisions must be met before an ADW provider can accept wagers.

Summary of Business and Professions Code section 19604

To accept wagers on races conducted in California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- A written agreement allowing those wagers exists with the racing association or fair conducting the races on which the wagers are made.
- The agreement shall have been approved in writing by the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which the wagers are made.

To accept wagers on races conducted outside of California from a resident of California.

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- There is a hub agreement between the ADW provider and one or both of (i) one or more racing associations or fairs that together conduct no fewer than five weeks of live racing on the breed on which wagering is conducted during the calendar year during which the wager is placed, and (ii) the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which wagering is conducted.



calendar days following receipt, be deposited in a segregated and separate liability account in a depository approved by the CHRB and shall be at the disposition of the Paymaster of Purses, who shall pay or distribute such funds to the persons entitled thereto. All funds generated from off-track simulcast wagering, interstate wagering, and out-of-state wagering which are obligated by law for distribution in the form of purses and breeders' awards, shall also be deposited within 3 calendar days following receipt into such liability account. In the event the fair is obligated to the payment of purses prior to those obligated amounts being retained from pari-mutuel wagering for such purpose, or as a result of overpayment of earned purses at the conclusion of the meeting, the fair shall transfer from its own funds such amounts as are necessary for the Paymaster of Purses to distribute to the horse owners statutorily or contractually entitled thereto. The fair is entitled thereafter to recover such transferred funds from the Paymaster of Purses' account; and if insufficient funds remain in the account at the conclusion of the meeting, the fair is entitled to carry forward the deficit to its next succeeding meeting as provided by Business and Professions Code section 19615(c) or (d). In the event of underpayment of purses which results in a balance remaining in the Paymaster of Purses' account at the conclusion of the meeting after distribution of amounts due to horsemen and breeders and horsemen's organizations, the fair may carry forward the surplus amount to its next succeeding meeting; provided, however, that the amount so retained does not exceed an amount equivalent to the average daily distribution of purses and breeders' awards during the meeting. All amounts in excess shall be distributed retroactively and proportionally in the form of purses and breeders' awards to the horse owners and breeders having earned purses or awards during the conduct of the meeting.

Pursuant to the Interstate Horseracing Act and applicable California law, the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) agrees to the use of Los Alamitos Race Course (LARC) race signals under the terms and conditions set forth below.

Pursuant to Section 30, Intrastate Advance Deposit Wagering ("ADW") of the Race Meet Agreement between TOC and LARC, and the Geo-Location Agreement (Exhibit A) between TOC and each ADW provider, LARC shall be permitted to transmit race signal to California-licensed ADW providers TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpines, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network to accept wagers on LARC and other Thoroughbred races during the 2018 LA County Fair race meeting, September 6-23, 2018, as follows:

1. California wagering on LARC races:

- a. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpines, and NYRA may deduct a Hub Fee of 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- b. BetAmerica and Watch and Wager may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.2% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- c. Game Play Network (GPN) may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Traditional ADW and 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Game ADW at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- d. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpines, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network may deduct a Hub Fee of 1.5% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents located within the enclosure of a Thoroughbred racetrack or fair on days when they are running live race meets, as more fully set forth in Exhibit A.
- e. For all wagers identified in sections 1.a.-c. above, the remainder of the takeout shall be distributed in conformity with the Market Access Fee provisions of California law (Section 19604 et seq).

2. California wagering on out-of-state Thoroughbred races:

- a. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpire, and NYRA may deduct a Hub Fee of 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- b. BetAmerica and Watch and Wager may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.2% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- c. Game Play Network (GPN) may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Traditional ADW and 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Game ADW at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- d. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpire, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network may deduct a Hub Fee of 1.5% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents located within the enclosure of a Thoroughbred racetrack or fair on days when they are running live race meets, as more fully set forth in Exhibit A.
- e. For all wagers identified in sections 2.a.-c. above, the remainder of the takeout shall be distributed in conformity with the Market Access Fee provisions of California law (Section 19604 et seq).

3. Out-of-state wagering on LARC races:

- a. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpire and NYRA shall pay a Host Fee of no less than 8.5% of gross out-of-state handle wagered by out-of-state account holders, plus a 1.25% California Purse Fee per SB 1072.
- b. BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network shall pay a Host Fee of no less than 60% of takeout (which includes a 1.25% California purse fee per SB 1072) of gross out-of-state handle wagered by out-of-state account holders.

This agreement in no way binds TOC to the same terms and conditions with respect to future race meetings. TOC's authorization shall not serve, nor should it be construed as, a precedent to future requests for permission to transmit race signals, and facilitate wagering on those signals, to the ADW providers specified herein or to any other ADW provider. TOC reserves the right to cancel or withdraw its authorization for any ADW provider, at any time, upon 48 hours written notice. These terms and conditions are subject to receipt by TOC of written confirmation of these terms, signed by authorized representatives of TVG, Xpressbet, TwinSpire, NYRA, BetAmerica, Game Play Network, and Watch and Wager.





EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROCEDURES FOR ON-TRACK INJURY TO JOCKEYS

FIRST RESPONSE

*In the event of an accident, the LARA Trackside Human Ambulance which follows each race and is staffed by state certified Paramedics and EMT's will respond immediately to the location of the accident.

*Paramedic and EMT's will make an evaluation of the injuries and if deemed necessary they will call for the Security Dept. to call for Fire Department Paramedics. The Security Dept. communications desk is manned at all times during racing hours.

ON SITE EVALUATION AND JOCKEY PROTOCOL

- If involved in a spill during a race, regardless of how serious the jockey deems the spill to be, they are instructed that if it is safe and they are clear of any loose horses they are to remain as still as possible until instructed to move by the responders.
- If responders request that the jockey be stabilized and placed on a backboard, jockeys are instructed to comply with that request or risk disciplinary action.
- If Paramedics are called the injured jockey will be stabilized and taken to meet Paramedics at the pre-designated location just outside of the Los Alamitos back fence. The OC Fire Paramedics will then evaluate the injuries and determine whether or not the injured rider should be transported to a trauma hospital.
- It is the current policy of the Orange County Emergency Services that all injuries sustained from falling from a horse at a speed of a gallop or more be treated as a trauma event. Fire Department paramedics will be instructed to transport the rider to a trauma hospital for examination. If the rider refuses transport to the trauma hospital they must sign a Refusal of Medical Treatment form. It will then be up to the Board of Stewards to determine if that rider can continue with his riding assignments.
- In the case of multiple injuries in a single race, the two fully staffed and equipped track ambulances that are on site for every race will respond and will immediately call the Security Dept. to call for the necessary number of Paramedic backup. In this case paramedic units will be instructed to enter the track through the backstretch gate which is unlocked at all times.

• Si se llamó a los paramédicos, el jinete herido será estabilizado y llevado a reunirse con los paramédicos en el lugar pre-determinado a las afueras de Los Alamitos en la valla al fondo de las pistas. Los Bomberos Paramédicos del Condado de Orange evaluarán las lesiones y determinarán si el jinete lesionado debe ser transportado a un hospital de trauma.



STAFF ANALYSIS
DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED
AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1632, JOCKEY'S RIDING FEE, TO ADJUST THE
JOCKEY RIDING FEE SCALE PURSUANT TO BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE
SECTION 19501

Regular Board Meeting
July 12, 2018

ISSUE

Business and Professions Code section 19501 requires an increase in the scale of minimum (losing) jockey riding fees whenever the state minimum wage is increased by the percentage of that increase. The next increase in California's minimum wage will become effective January 1, 2019. The proposed amendment to Rule 1632, Jockey's Riding Fee, will amend subsection (b) to increase the losing mount jockey riding fees concurrent with the 2019 statewide increase in the minimum wage. In addition, subsection 1632(b) will be amended to remove the dollar amounts for second and third place mounts in the Less than \$10,000 as they are not necessary for the calculation of such fees. Direction regarding second and third place mount fees is otherwise provided under the provisions of subsections 1632(b)(3) through 1632(b)(5). Other changes to the regulation will modify subsection 1632(b)(5) for purposes of clarity.

ANALYSIS

The next increase in California's minimum wage will become effective January 1, 2019. The proposed amendment to Rule 1632 will increase losing mount jockey riding fees as required by statute. The amounts to be paid jockeys riding losing mounts will grow by 9.09 percent.

Subsection (b) of Rule 1632 currently provides specific dollar amounts to pay jockeys riding second and third place mounts in the "Less than \$10,000" category. However, direction regarding second and third place mount fees is otherwise provided under the provisions of subsections 1632(b)(3) through 1632(b)(5). The proposed amendment to subsection 1623(b) will delete the dollar amounts for second and third place mounts in the "Less than \$10,000" category, as they are not necessary for the Paymaster of Purses to use in calculating jockey riding fees.

The proposed increase in the losing mount jockey riding fees impacts second and third place mount fees. Subsection 1632(b)(5) provides additional direction regarding second and third place mount fees. The subsection has been amended for clarity to provide that the third place mount shall earn at minimum \$2 more than the losing mount, and the second place mount shall earn at minimum \$2 more than the third place mount. Subsection 1632(b)(5) ensures that losing mount fees are never equal to or greater than third place mount fees, and that third place mount fees shall be less than second place fees. This is necessary because the periodic increase in losing mount fees mandated by statute has resulted in situations in which the losing mount fee under subsection 1632(b) exceeds the third place mount fees. This is demonstrated by the most recent amendment of Rule 1632 (effective 01/01/18), which resulted in subsection 1632(b), gross purse of \$10,000 category, providing a losing mount fee that is \$2 more than the third place mount fee.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions Code section 19401 provides that the intent of Chapter 4 is to allow pari-mutuel wagering on horse races, while assuring protection of the public and providing uniformity of regulation for each type of horse racing. Business and Professions Code section 19420 states jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the California Horse Racing Board. Business and Professions Code section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. Business and Professions Code section 19562 provides that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions, consistent with the provisions of this chapter, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California. Business and Professions Code section 19501 states that the scale of minimum jockey riding fees for losing mounts shall be increased whenever the State minimum wage is increased by the percentage of that increase.

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. Staff recommends the Board direct staff to initiate a 45-day comment period regarding the proposed amendment.

1632. Jockey's Riding Fee.

(a) Winning jockey riding fees in the absence of a contract or special agreement are 10% of the Win Purse.

(1) The purpose of subsection (a) is not to set a minimum or maximum fee. It provides a fee if the parties have not made a written agreement to the contrary.

(2) All fees pursuant to subsection (a) are payable in the lower purse range until the next higher purse range is reached, unless there is a written agreement to the contrary.

(b) Jockey riding fees for losing mounts are:

(1) The purpose of subsection (b) is to set a minimum, but not a maximum riding fee. No non-winning jockey shall be paid less than the riding fee set forth in subsection (b).

(2) All fees pursuant to subsection (b) are payable in the lower purse range until the next higher purse range is reached unless there is a written agreement to the contrary. However, no such written agreement shall reduce the minimum required by subsection (b).

(3) To determine the horse owner's place purse or show purse when calculating non-winning jockey riding fees, the Paymaster of Purses shall use the purse agreement provided in the

Horsemen's Agreement for the race meeting at which the jockeys earned such fees. The losing mount fee shall be paid as provided under subsection (b) of this rule.

(4) For horse races with gross purses between \$10,000 and \$100,000 and up, a minimum of five percent of the horse owner's place purse or show purse plus \$10.00 shall be used when calculating the second place and third place non-winning jockey riding fees.

(5) If the losing mount fee is equal to or greater than the third place mount fee, the Paymaster of Purses shall adjust the mount fees so that the third place mount shall earn at minimum \$2 more than the losing mount, and the second place mount shall earn at minimum \$2 more than the third place mount.

(c) A jockey's fee is considered earned when the jockey is weighed out by the clerk of scales. The fee shall not be considered earned if the jockey elects to take himself off of his mount. If there is a substitution of jockeys, no additional jockey fee or double jockey fee need be paid except when ordered by the stewards.

(d) In this rule "Win Purse" means the amount paid the winning horse less the fees paid exclusively by the owner to enter the horse in the race;

(1) Entry, nomination or other fees paid shall not be deducted from a jockey riding fee if such fees are paid or reimbursed by any person or entity other than the owner.

(e) If the parties agree on the fee to be paid the jockey, a contract or agreement in writing signed by the jockey or his agent and the owner or his authorized agent specifying the agreed upon fee if a winning mount, second place mount, third place mount and losing mount shall be delivered to the paymaster of purses before the running of the race in question. The paymaster of purses shall debit the owner's purse account under the contract or written agreement. If no contract or written agreement is submitted before the running of the race in question, the paymaster of purses shall

debit the owner's purse account under the fee scale set forth in this rule.

(f) A jockey may not share in the fees of another jockey.

BACKGROUND

Pacific Racing Association II (PRA II) filed its application to conduct a thoroughbred horse racing meeting at Golden Gate Fields (GGF) August 22, 2018, through October 2, 2018. The application came before the Board at its June 21, 2018 Regular Board meeting. The PRA II application failed to include, among other items, an agreement to conduct simulcast wagering with all eligible satellite wagering facilities in northern California. The Board heard testimony on this matter from those in the industry, including the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), which indicated that the purse amounts would be significantly lowered if PRA II was allowed to run without an agreement to transmit its signal to the northern California simulcast wagering facilities. The Board made a motion to approve the race meet license application contingent upon the Board receiving by July 2, 2018, the outstanding items including agreements with each satellite wagering facility in northern California, as required by law.

ANALYSIS

California Business and Professions Code section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter including, the allocation of racing dates to associations in accordance with the law. Rule 1430 states, the Board shall allocate racing weeks and dates for the conduct of horse racing in this State for such time periods and at such racing facilities as the Board determines will best subserve the purposes of the Horse Racing Law and which will be in the best interests of the people of California in accord with the intent of the Horse Racing Law. Further, upon a finding by the Board that the allocation of racing weeks and dates for any racing year is completed, the racing weeks and dates so allocated shall be subject to reconsideration or amendment only for conditions unforeseen at the time of the allocations. Finally, the allocation of racing weeks and dates does not commit the Board to the granting of a license to conduct a horseracing meeting to any specific racing association nor for the allotted time period nor at the racing facility scheduled for such racing weeks and dates.

As of the July 2, 2018 deadline, the Board has received the California Thoroughbred Trainers agreement, the Workers Compensation Policy and the NYRAbets Advance Deposit Wagering agreement.

The following items remain outstanding:

1. Thoroughbred Owners of California agreement.
2. Agreements with all licensed northern California satellites.
3. Labor agreement with Local 280 (expire July 17, 2018)

Subsequent to the Board's allocation of race dates, Pacific Racing Association II (PRA) submitted a race meet application for August 22 through October 2, 2018. The application did not have agreements with any northern California satellite wagering facilities. Other items, including an agreement with the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), were also outstanding. At the June 21, 2018 Regular Board meeting, upon hearing testimony, the Board approved the race meet license contingent upon PRA submitting agreements with each satellite wagering facility in northern California, as required by law, as well as all other outstanding items listed in the staff analysis, by July 2, 2018. In the event PRA does not comply with the condition, this item was placed on the agenda for the Board to consider reallocation of the August 22 through October 2, 2018 race dates.
