APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF AUGUST 20, 2020.

Commissioner Wendy Mitchell **motioned** to approve the minutes of the August 20, 2020 regular Board meeting. Commissioner Dennis Alfieri **seconded** the motion, which was **passed** four to zero with two abstentions. Roll call vote: Aye: Alfieri, Gonzales, Mitchell, Castellanos. Nay: None. Abstain: Washington Davis, Ferraro. Motion carried.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT.

Executive Director Scott Chaney stated that the Horse Racing Integrity and Safety Act was moving through the U.S. Congress, and the Board had not taken a formal position on it. He said amendments to Board Rule 1688, Use of Riding Crop, took effect October 1, 2020. He stated that the Board's website had a new search engine for equine fatalities and a racing reform recommendations chart. Mr. Chaney also reported that August 2020 saw a decrease in overall handle of 3.13 percent compared to August 2019. Further comments regarding this agenda item can be found in the Board transcript, pages 5–12.

EQUINE MEDICAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT.

Dr. Rick Arthur, Board Equine Medical Director, stated that racing could be done safely in hot weather and track staff were prepared and on alert. He said there were air quality issues due to the wildfires throughout California and shared guidelines with track management, official veterinarians, and safety stewards. Management canceled racing and limited training when warranted. Dr. Arthur reported there were four racing and two training fatalities in August 2020, along with four non-exercise fatalities in the stable area. Additionally, there were eight medication violations, all of which were Class 4 medications. Further comments regarding this agenda items can be found in the Board transcript, pages 12–34.

RACING DATES FOR THE YEAR 2021

Regular Board Meeting
October 22, 2020

ISSUE:

Every year, the California Horse Racing Board (Board) hears from industry stakeholders regarding the allocation of race dates for the following year. This discussion is initially held at the Race Dates Committee (Committee) meeting, prior to being presented to the Board at their regular meeting for final approval of the allocated race dates. In the past, there has been discussion of adopting a multi-year allocated race dates calendar, but to date one has not been obtained.

Prior to the August 2020 Committee meeting, Board staff reached out to various stakeholders for their proposals for a 2021 race dates calendar. Those proposals and prior calendars are included for reference. Additionally, a tentative calendar was drafted to incorporate stakeholder proposals for ease of viewing. Currently, the calendar lacks the following stakeholder proposals:

Watch and Wager requests the following 2021 race dates to be raced at Cal Expo:

- December 26, 2020 – May 8, 2021 for the Winter/Spring meet
- October 29, 2021 – December 24, 2021 for the Fall meet

Proposals were not received for both Los Alamitos Quarter Horse and Golden Gate Fields.

Additionally, the proposals from California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) and Sonoma County Fair (SCF) contained overlapping dates. Specifically, CARF requested the following dates:

- Pleasanton County Fair: June 18, 2021 – July 11, 2021
- State Fair at Sacramento/Cal Expo: July 16, 2021 – August 1, 2021

SCF provided the following dates as alternatives:

- Pleasanton County Fair: June 10, 2021 – July 4, 2021
- State Fair at Sacramento/Cal Expo: July 8, 2021 – July 25, 2021
- Sonoma County Fair: July 29, 2021 – August 8, 2021

For 2021, the following specific dates are requested: Los Alamitos April 7 through April 20, December 1 through December 24---Los Angeles County Fair September 8 through September 28.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REQUEST FROM THE CALIFORNIA AUTHORITY OF RACING FAIRS (CARF) TO APPROVE THE CARRYOVER OF FUNDS FROM THE 2020 ALAMEDA COUNTY FAIR AND 2020 CALIFORNIA STATE FAIR AT PLEASANTON INTO A MANDATORY PAYOUT TO THE FIRST DAY OF A DESIGNATED FAIR MEET IN 2021

Regular Board Meeting
October 22, 2020

ISSUE:

At the September regular California Horse Racing Board (Board) meeting, the Board voted to re-allocate The California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) Big Fresno Fair dates to the Pacific Racing Association (PRA) due to the cancellation of the Fresno Fair as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result of the re-allocation of these dates, CARF has requested permission to pay out the mandatory jackpot carryovers from the 2020 Alameda County Fair and 2020 California State Fair to the first day of a designated fair meet in 2021.

CARF has indicated that they have \$20,175.85 in the Gold Rush Pick-6 pool and \$82,518.77 in the Gold Strike Super High-5 pool.

CARF is requesting permission to have a mandatory payout on a specified date when their meet reopens in 2021, pending approval of the 2021 race dates calendar.

ANALYSIS:

The race meet applications submitted by CARF delineates the regulations which govern the Pick 6 and Pick 5 pool. The Pick 6 is governed by Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) [Rule 004-105-G](#), Method 7. The Pick 5 is governed by California Horse Racing Board (Board) [Rule 1976.9](#).

Pick 5

Board Rule 1976.9 provides the rules governing the Pick 5. Subsection (h) states:

“Permission to distribute the Pick (n) carryover on a specific date and performance shall be obtained from the Board. The mandatory payout request must contain the intended date and performance for the distribution.”

Here, the request to designate a mandatory payout date during the next race meet must be approved by the Board.

Additionally, subsection (j) states:

“If the Pick (n) carryover must be carried over to the corresponding Pick (n) pool of a subsequent meet, it shall be deposited in an interest-bearing account approved by the Board. The Pick (n) carryover plus accrued interest shall then be added to the net Pick (n) pool of the following meet on a date and performance designated by the association, with Board approval.”

Here, the interest-bearing account which will hold the funds until the approved mandatory payout date must also be approved by the Board.

Staff recommends the Board hear from CARF on the specified date of performance and the interest-bearing account the funds will be held in.

Pick 6

The Pick 6 is governed by ARCI Rule 004-105-G, Method 7. Section 004-105-G-9 states:

A written request for permission to distribute the Pick (n) carryover on a specific performance may be submitted to the Commission. The request must be for a specified date no greater than one (1) year from the date the request is submitted and contain justification for the distribution, an explanation of the benefit to be derived, and the intended date and performance for the distribution.

Here, a request from CARF to designate a mandatory payout date during the next race meet must be approved by the Board. The request cannot exceed 1 year from the date the request is submitted.

Additionally, Section 004-105-G-11 states:

“A written request for permission to transfer the Pick (n) carryover to another Pick (n) pool operated by the same pool host may be submitted to the Commission. The request must contain justification for the transfer, including an explanation of the benefit to be derived, a description of the method by which the pool host will present the information to the public that identifies the racetrack(s) for which the pool will be operated and the intended date(s) and performance(s) of the transfer.”

Section 004-105-G-13 states:

“Notwithstanding subsections (9) and (11), if for any reason the Pick (n) carryover must be held over to the corresponding Pick (n) pool of a subsequent meet, the carryover shall be deposited in an interest-bearing account approved by the Commission. The Pick (n) carryover plus accrued interest shall then be added to the net Pick (n) pool of the following meet on a date and performance so designated by the Commission.”

Similarly, the interest-bearing account which will hold the funds until the approved mandatory payout date must also be approved by the Board.

Staff recommends the Board hear from CARF on the specified date of performance and the interest-bearing account the funds will be held in.

TO BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE LACF AT ITS DECEMBER 2, 2020 THROUGH
DECEMBER 22, 2020 RACE MEETING AT THE LOS ALAMITOS RACE COURSE.

Regular Board Meeting
October 22, 2020

ISSUE:

California Horse Racing Board (Board) [Rule 1581, Racing Secretary to Establish Conditions](#), allows the racing secretary to establish the conditions for any race run during the race meeting. In instances where the racing secretary wishes to set a condition based on a participating horse's use or non-use of a drug substance or medication, or the presence or lack of presence of a drug substance or medication, the association must first obtain approval from the horseman's organization and the Board. Beginning in March 2019, all racing associations in California have come to the Board seeking approval of agreements with the respective horseman's organizations involving the reduction of Lasix as well as a mandatory stand down for intra articular injections.

BACKGROUND:

[Business and Professions Code \(BPC\) section 19440](#) provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of the Horse Racing Law. Responsibilities of the Board shall include, but not be limited to, adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. [BPC section 19590](#) states the Board shall adopt rules governing, permitting, and regulating wagering on horse races under the system known as the pari-mutuel method of wagering. [BPC section 19562](#) provides that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations and conditions, consistent with the provisions of this chapter, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California.

ANALYSIS:

The ability to set conditions on a race is governed by Board Rule 1581. Rule 1581 states:

The racing secretary may establish the conditions for any race, the allowances or handicaps to be established or specific races, the procedures for the acceptance of entries and declarations, and such other conditions as are necessary to provide and conduct the association's race meeting. Any conditions that are based on a participating horse's use or non-use of a drug substance or medication, or the presence or lack of presence of a drug substance or medication in a biological test sample taken from a participating horse, shall be agreed to in advance in writing by the acknowledged horsemen's organization, which, in the case of Thoroughbreds, shall be the owner's organization, and approved by the Board before entries are taken for the race. If such conditions are based on the results of a biological test sample other than an official test sample collected by the CHRB, a description of the testing methods and procedures the racing association or fair will use to collect and analyze the biological test samples shall be submitted to the Board for approval. For purposes of this section "biological test sample" refers to any biological sample, including but not limited to, blood, urine, hair, tissue, or saliva, that is taken from a horse.

Pursuant to Board Rule 1581, any condition involving medication must be agreed to by the horsemen's organization, which in the case of thoroughbred racing, is the TOC. Additionally, any agreement must be approved by the Board before entries are taken.

RECITALS:

- A. LARA is a racing association licensed to operate Thoroughbred horse racing at the Los Alamitos Racetrack located in Los Alamitos, California. TOC represents the collective interests of all California Thoroughbred owners.
- B. LARA and TOC desire to enter into an agreement in which new rules and regulations are approved in order for LARA to be consistent with International Federation of Horse Racing Authorities (“IFHA”), and this agreement is intended to satisfy the requirements set forth in Rule 1581 of the California Horse Racing Board Rules.
- C. The purpose of this agreement is to protect the safety and welfare of horses and riders and to enhance public confidence in the integrity of the sport of Thoroughbred racing.

AGREEMENT:

1. 2 Year Old Races. All foals born in 2018 (2-year-olds of 2020) will race during the Los Angeles County Fair at LARA 2020 winter meet with no race-day medication, which includes, without limitation, the use of Lasix.
2. 3 Year Olds and Up Races. All horses foaled prior to 2018 racing during the Los Angeles County Fair at LARA winter race meet shall only permitted to receive a maximum of half the dosage of Lasix (furosemide) otherwise permitted under California regulations (i.e. horses can receive a maximum furosemide dose of 250 milligrams).
3. Every horse within the enclosure and every horse at a LARA auxiliary training facility is subject to out-of-competition testing (OOCT) by LARA veterinary professionals and no owner, trainer or other person having the care of a horse shall refuse to submit such for testing.

4. All parties agree to strict limitations on the use of any analgesic and anti-inflammatory medications during racing and training.
5. Joint Injections. No horse, of any age, shall be permitted to race at Los Alamitos if it has received a corticosteroid intra-articular joint injection as follows:
 - a. Within fourteen (14) days of race day if such injection is for any joint other than any of the metacarpophalangeal joints.
 - b. Within thirty (30) days of race day if such injection is performed on any metacarpophalangeal joint. Additionally, no horse shall be permitted to have a timed work for ten (10) days after receiving a corticosteroid intra-articular joint injection in any of the metacarpophalangeal joints.
6. No horse which has been administered a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medication within the previous 48 hours shall participate in a race at Los Alamitos or a recorded work at Los Alamitos or any of its auxiliary training facilities. All parties agree OOC may be conducted to verify compliance.
7. A commitment to continuing collaboration for improving the safety and welfare of horses and riders.
8. The parties will file this agreement with the California Horse Racing Board (“CHRB”) and support approval.
9. This Agreement covers the Los Angeles County Fair at LARA’s 2020 winter race meet (the “Meet”) and shall expire on the last day that a Thoroughbred racehorse is permitted to be in the Los Alamitos enclosure or at a LARA auxiliary training facility as part of the Meet.

Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY FAIR AT LOS ALAMITOS RACE COURSE DECEMBER 2, 2020 THROUGH DECEMBER 22, 2020.

Los Angeles County Fair (LACF) filed its application to conduct a horse racing meeting at Los Alamitos Race Course December 2, 2020 through December 22, 2020, or 9 days; 3 days less than the number in 2019. LACF proposes to race a total of 78 races; 24 less than in 2019. Live racing will commence December 4, 2020 through December 20, 2020. LACF is not participating in the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) combined horse racing meeting.

- The proposed race dates are the approved dates allocated to the fair.

- The Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) providers are TVG, Xpressbet, Twin Spires, and NYRAbets.

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code (BPC) [section 19604](#), specific provisions must be met before an ADW provider can accept wagers.

Summary of BPC section 19604

*To accept wagers on races **conducted in California** from a resident of California.*

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- A written agreement allowing those wagers exists with the racing association or fair conducting the races on which the wagers are made.
- The agreement shall have been approved in writing by the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which the wagers are made.

*To accept wagers on races **conducted outside of California** from a resident of California.*

- The ADW provider must be licensed by the Board.
- There is a hub agreement between the ADW provider and one or both of (i) one or more racing associations or fairs that together conduct no fewer than five weeks of live racing on the breed on which wagering is conducted during the calendar year during which the wager is placed, and (ii) the horsemen's organization responsible for negotiating purse agreements for the breed on which wagering is conducted.

- XpressBet LLC. dba XpressBet.com has submitted all documents required in compliance with BPC section 19604.

- NYRAbets, LLC has submitted all documents required in compliance with BPC section 19604.
- Simulcasting conducted with other out-of-state racing jurisdictions pursuant to BPC [section 19602](#); and with authorized locations throughout California.
- Request Jennifer Paige be appointed horse identifier pursuant to Board [Rule 1525](#), Racing Officials Appointed by the Board.
- Track safety inspection has been requested and will be completed before the race meeting begins.
- Inspection of backstretch worker housing has been requested and will be completed before the race meeting begins.
- At the August 2020 regular Board meeting, the Board approved an exemption for Los Alamitos to obtain a fire clearance compliant with Board Rule 1927.
- San Luis Rey Downs and Santa Anita Park are listed as auxiliary stabling facilities. At the

August 2020 regular Board meeting, the Board approved an extension for San Luis Rey Downs to obtain a fire clearance and an exemption for Santa Anita Park to obtain a fire clearance 45 days prior to the start of the race meet, pursuant to Board Rule 1927.

1. Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) Race Meet Agreement.



The Dr. Grande inspects the other fifty percent of horses entered on a particular day. During the afternoon, Dr. Grande serves as the CHRB veterinarian and she is employed by the CHRB.

Pursuant to the Interstate Horseracing Act and applicable California law, the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) agrees to the use of Los Alamitos Race Course (LARC) race signals under the terms and conditions set forth below.

Pursuant to Section 30, Intrastate Advance Deposit Wagering ("ADW") of the Race Meet Agreement between TOC and LARC, and the Geo-Location Agreement (Exhibit A) between TOC and each ADW provider, LARC shall be permitted to transmit race signal to California-licensed ADW providers TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpires, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network to accept wagers on LARC and other Thoroughbred races during the 2020 Winter race meeting, December 3 through December 20, 2020, as follows:

1. California wagering on LARC races:

- a. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpires, and NYRA may deduct a Hub Fee of 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- b. BetAmerica and Watch and Wager may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.2% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- c. Game Play Network (GPN) may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Traditional ADW and 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Game ADW at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- d. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpires, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network may deduct a Hub Fee of 1.5% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents located within the enclosure of a Thoroughbred racetrack or fair on days when they are running live race meets, as more fully set forth in Exhibit A.

Game Play Network (GPN) may deduct a Hub Fee of 4.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Traditional ADW and 5.0% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents through GPN's Game ADW at all locations other than within the enclosures of Thoroughbred racetracks and fairs on days when they are running live race meets.
- d. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpires, NYRA, BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network may deduct a Hub Fee of 1.5% of gross handle for ADW wagers accepted by California residents located within the enclosure of a Thoroughbred racetrack or fair on days when they are running live race meets, as more fully set forth in Exhibit A.
- e. For all wagers identified in sections 2.a.-c. above, the remainder of the takeout shall be distributed in conformity with the Market Access Fee provisions of California law (Section 19604 et seq).

3. Out-of-state wagering on LARC races:

- a. TVG, XpressBet, TwinSpires and NYRA shall pay a Host Fee of no less than 8.5% of gross out-of-state handle wagered by out-of-state account holders, plus a 1.25% California Purse Fee per SB 1072.
- b. BetAmerica, Watch and Wager, and Game Play Network shall pay a Host Fee of no less than 60% of takeout (which includes a 1.25% California purse fee per SB 1072) of gross out-of-state handle wagered by out-of-state account holders.

This agreement in no way binds TOC to the same terms and conditions with respect to future race meetings. TOC's authorization shall not serve, nor should it be construed as, a precedent to future requests for permission to transmit race signals, and facilitate wagering on those signals, to the ADW providers specified herein or to any other ADW provider. TOC reserves the right to cancel or withdraw its authorization for any ADW provider, at any time, upon 48 hours written notice. These terms and conditions are subject to receipt by TOC of written confirmation of these terms, signed by authorized representatives of TVG, Xpressbet, TwinSpires, NYRA, BetAmerica, Game Play Network, and Watch and Wager.





A qualified and licensed physician shall be on duty at all times during live racing, except that this provision shall not apply to any quarter horse racing at the racetrack if there is a hospital situated no more than 1.5 miles from the racetrack and the racetrack has an agreement with the hospital to provide emergency medical services to jockeys and riders. An ambulance licensed to operate on public highways provided by the track shall be available at all times during live racing and shall be staffed by two emergency medical technicians licensed in accordance with Division 2.5 (commencing with Section 1797) of the Health and Safety Code, one of whom may be an Emergency Medical Technician Paramedic, as defined in Section 1797.84 of the Health and Safety Code. (b) Each racing association and racing fair shall adopt and maintain an emergency medical plan detailing the procedures that shall be used in the event of an on-track injury. The plan shall be posted in each jockey room in English and Spanish. (c) Prior to every race meeting, the racing association or racing fair shall contact area hospitals to coordinate procedures for the rapid admittance and treatment of emergency injuries. (d) Each racing association or racing fair shall designate a health and safety manager and assistant manager, who shall be responsible for compliance with the provisions of this section and one of whom shall be on duty at all times when live racing is conducted. The health and safety manager may, at the discretion of the racing association, be the person designated to perform risk management duties on behalf of the association.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROCEDURES FOR ON-TRACK INJURY TO JOCKEYS

FIRST RESPONSE

*In the event of an accident, the LARA Trackside Human Ambulance which follows each race and is staffed by state certified Paramedics and EMT's will respond immediately to the location of the accident.

*Paramedic and EMT's will make an evaluation of the injuries and if deemed necessary they will call for the Security Dept. to call for Fire Department Paramedics. The Security Dept. communications desk is manned at all times during racing hours.

ON SITE EVALUATION AND JOCKEY PROTOCOL

- If involved in a spill during a race, regardless of how serious the Jockey deems the spill to be, they are instructed that if it is safe and they are clear of any loose horses they are to remain as still as possible until instructed to move by the responders.
- If responders request that the Jockey be stabilized and placed on a backboard, jockeys are instructed to comply with that request or risk disciplinary action.
- If Paramedics are called the injured Jockey will be stabilized and taken to meet Paramedics at the pre-designated location just outside of the Los Alamitos back fence. The OC Fire Paramedics will then evaluate the injuries and determine whether or not the injured rider should be transported to a trauma hospital.
- It is the current policy of the Orange County Emergency Services that all injuries sustained from falling from a horse at a speed of a gallop or more be treated as a trauma event. Fire Department Paramedics will be instructed to transport the rider to a trauma hospital for examination. If the rider refuses transport to the trauma hospital they must sign a Refusal of Medical Treatment for. It will then be up to the Board of Stewards to determine if that rider can continue with his riding assignments.
- In the case of multiple injuries in a single race, the two fully staffed and equipped track ambulance that are on site for every race will respond and will immediately call the Security Dept, to call for the necessary number of Paramedic backup. * Si la solicitud del EMT requiere que el jinete sea estabilizado y colocado sobre una camilla, los jinetes son instruidos de cumplir con la petición o estarán en riesgo de acción disciplinaria.

* Si se llamó a los paramédicos, el jinete herido será estabilizado y llevado a reunirse con los paramédicos en el lugar pre-diseñado a las afueras de Los Alamitos en la valla al fondo de las pista. Los Bomberos Paramédicos del Condado de Orange evaluarán las lesiones y determinarán si el jinete lesionado debe ser transportado a un hospital de trauma.

* Si las lesiones no se consideran grava por el EMT o paramédicos, el jinete será dirigido ya sea a una sala de emergencias o al médico del hipódromo para ser evaluado. Será la póliza del doctor del hipódromo que, con excepción de los accidentes más leves, se evaluará el jinete herido de inmediato por un médico en una sala de emergencias. Si un jinete rechaza las recomendaciones de tratamiento del EMT, los paramédicos o del Doctor del Hipódromo, se les pedirá que firmen un formulario de Rechazo de Tratamiento Médico y su capacidad para continuar de montar en las carreras del programa de ese día, será determinado por los Comisarios Deportivos de CHRB.

* En el caso de lesiones múltiples en una sola carrera, las dos ambulancias de la pista totalmente equipadas van a responder y se le llamará de inmediato al Departamento de Seguridad para que llame a los paramédicos. En este caso, las unidades de paramédicos serán instruidos que entren por la puerta a través de la pista que siempre está abierta.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION REGARDING THE REQUEST FOR AN EXEMPTION TO
OBTAIN A FIRE CLEARANCE APPROVAL FOR WATCH AND WAGER LLC, AT CAL
EXPO, PURSUANT TO CHRB RULE 1927, FIRE PREVENTION

Regular board Meeting
October 22, 2020

ISSUE:

California Horse Racing Board (Board) Rule 1927, Fire Prevention, specifies that a written fire clearance from the fire authority having jurisdiction over the racing and stabling areas must be submitted to the Board before any license shall be granted. The written clearance shall certify that an inspection has been made of the inclosure and any additional location where any excess number of horses will be stalled within 45 days prior to the commencement of the race meeting, and that the facilities conform to the standard of fire safety outlined in Board Rule 1927.

The Board heard an application for license to conduct a horse racing meeting by Watch and Wager, LLC (WAW) at Cal Expo from October 30, 2020 through December 22, 2020 at the September 24, 2020 regular Board meeting. At the meeting the Board granted the license while also approving a time extension for WAW to secure a fire clearance compliant with Board Rule 1927, giving WAW until October 8, 2020 to secure the Board Rule 1927 compliant fire clearance. Should WAW be unable to secure a Board Rule 1927 compliant fire clearance by October 8, 2020, the Board may consider a further extension to allow WAW more time to comply.

ANALYSIS:

Board [Rule 1927](#) requires associations to make provisions for fire prevention before any license is granted by the Board and provides that a written clearance from the fire authority having jurisdiction, stating that an inspection has been made of the inclosure and any additional location where any excess horses will be stalled, must be presented to the Board before a license to conduct a horse racing meeting shall be granted. The clearance shall certify in writing that the fire safety provisions conform with the standard of fire safety described in Board Rule 1927, and the fire safety inspection shall be made within 45-days of the commencement of the start of the race meet. If an association is unable to obtain a fire clearance that satisfies these requirements, Board Rule 1927 provides that the association may petition the Board for an extension or exception. Furthermore, Board Rule 1927 provides that when considering a petition for an extension or exception, the Board shall take into consideration any written recommendations from the fire authority having jurisdiction, as well as all other matters pertinent to the petition.

The Board granted an extension to WAW at the September 24, 2020 regular Board meeting, giving WAW until October 8, 2020 to deliver to the Board a fire clearance compliant with Board Rule 1927. However, local fire authority resources have been

spread thin due to increased wildfire activity in the area, as well as restrictions imposed on staff and scheduling due to the COVID-19 pandemic. If WAW is unable to meet the Board's October 8, 2020 deadline, and the Board determines to give WAW supplemental time to complete its inspection and deliver the fire clearance, the Board would be required to approve a further time extension pursuant to Board Rule 1927.

BACKGROUND:

BPC [section 19420](#) provides that jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the Board. BPC section 19440 states the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. BPC [section 19460](#) provides that all licenses granted under this chapter shall contain such conditions as are deemed necessary or desirable by the Board for the best interests of horse racing and the purposes of this chapter. Board Rule 1927 provides that applicants to conduct a horse race meeting in California shall first make provisions for fire prevention and protection, and submit to the Board a written clearance from a fire authority having jurisdiction, stating that an inspection has been made of both the inclosure and any additional locations where any excess number of horses will be stalled, that the inspection ensures that the fire safety provisions meet the Board's standards described in Board Rule 1927, and that the inspection was conducted within 45-days of the commencement of the race meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action.

STAFF ANALYSIS
DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED
AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1845, AUTHORIZED BLEEDER MEDICATION, TO
ELIMINATE THE REQUIREMENT TO RETAIN SYRINGES UTILIZED FOR
FUROSEMIDE

Regular Board Meeting
October 22, 2020

ISSUE:

At the August 2020 regular meeting, the California Horse Racing Board (Board) approved the temporary suspension of Board [Rule 1845\(h\)](#) until December 25, 2020. This desired change is a cost savings effort by the tracks and horsemen. Any action to temporarily suspend a rule requires consideration and approval by the Board. Effective October 1, 2020, changes to Board Rule 1845 went into effect which resulted in a renumbering of Rule 1845. Specifically, the referenced subsection 1845(h) is now be 1845(i).

ANALYSIS:

Board Rule 1845, Authorized Bleeder Medication, governs the requirements for the administration of furosemide (aka Lasix). Subsection (i) of Rule 1845 states the following:

The syringe used to administer furosemide shall be provided to and securely stored by the Board until all testing of the horse is completed. In the event of a positive test finding as defined in this article, the Board may order, or the owner or trainer may request, the retained syringe be tested for prohibited substances. The results of the test may be used in any action before the Board.

[Board Rule 1406](#), Suspension of Rule, allows the Board, for good cause, with or without a hearing, to temporarily suspend the application of any of its rules upon any conditions it may impose. Every application for such action and any such action by the Board shall, insofar as possible, be in writing. If not in writing, it shall be confirmed in writing as soon thereafter as possible.

At the August meeting, subsection (i) of Board Rule 1845 was suspended for every racing association until December 25, 2020. In an effort to codify and make permanent those changes, the Board is considering proceeding with amending Board Rule 1845(i) through the regulatory process and make this change permanent.

BACKGROUND:

Subsection (h) of Board Rule 1845 went into effect on December 26, 2017. Before its implementation, Rule 1845 provided that a representative of the Board could request that the veterinarian administering the bleeder medication surrender the syringe used in the administration of furosemide for possible testing. The addition of subsection (h), now (i), which requires that the syringe used in the administration of furosemide be provided to, and retained by, the Board until all testing of the horse is completed was thought necessary because of an underlying concern that the Lasix injection could be the source of a drug positive.

Since subsection (h), now (i), went into effect, the retention of syringes has proved to be cumbersome, costly, and ineffective in achieving its original goal. It is estimated that only three Lasix syringes have been tested out of approximately 150,000 injections. None of the tested syringes altered the outcome of any violation.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action.

CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD
TITLE 4. CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS
ARTICLE 15. VETERINARY PRACTICES
RULE 1845. AUTHORIZED BLEEDER MEDICATION

1845. Authorized Bleeder Medication.

(a) The only authorized bleeder medication for the control of exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage (EIPH) shall be furosemide, and it shall only be administered by a single intravenous injection, in a dosage of not less than 150 mg and not more than 250 mg, on the grounds of the racetrack where the horse will race, and no later than four hours prior to the post time of the race for which the horse is entered. It shall only be administered to a horse that is registered on the authorized bleeder medication list.

(1) Furosemide is prohibited for two-year-olds entered to race as specified in Board Rule 1843.5(a).

(b) A horse is registered on the authorized bleeder medication list as follows:

(1) The trainer and the owner's veterinarian shall determine whether furosemide is medically necessary to control EIPH and is not otherwise contraindicated for that horse; and

(2) Prior to entry for race, the official veterinarian approves form CHRB-194 (Rev. 01/16), Authorized Bleeder Medication and Medical History Request, which is hereby incorporated by reference, submitted to the official veterinarian by the trainer and owner's veterinarian.

(c) Once registered, any horse that will be administered furosemide shall:

(1) Arrive on the grounds of the racetrack where the horse will race no later than five hours prior to the post time of the race for which the horse is entered; and

(2) Be assigned to a pre-race security stall prior to the scheduled post time for the race in which it is entered and shall remain there until it is taken to the receiving barn or the paddock to be saddled or harnessed for the race.

(A) The pre-race security stall shall be identified by the posting of a form CHRB-234 (New 09/15), Detention Stall Sign, which is hereby incorporated by reference. The trainer shall post the Detention Stall Sign no later than eight hours prior to the post time of the race for which the horse is entered or, for a horse arriving from off the grounds of the racetrack, when the horse is placed in the pre-race security stall.

(B) While in the pre-race security stall, the horse shall be in the care, custody, control, and constant view of the trainer, or a licensed employee assigned by the trainer. The trainer shall be responsible for the condition, care and handling of the horse while it remains in the pre-race security stall.

(C) The official veterinarian may permit a horse to leave the pre-race security stall to engage in track warm-up heats prior to a race.

(d) Furosemide shall be administered only after:

(1) The trainer, owner, or the owner's veterinarian has consulted with the furosemide veterinarian regarding the condition of the horse and the furosemide veterinarian has examined the horse sufficient to establish a veterinary-client-patient relationship within the meaning of California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2032.1; or

(2) The trainer, owner, or owner's veterinarian has consulted with the official veterinarian or racing veterinarian and the furosemide veterinarian has examined the horse sufficient to establish a veterinary-client-patient relationship within the meaning of

California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2032.1, and that the consulting official veterinarian or racing veterinarian directly supervises the furosemide veterinarian, or California registered veterinary technician, who administers furosemide.

(e) The person who administers furosemide pursuant to subsection (f)(1) of this regulation shall notify the official veterinarian of the treatment of the horse. Such notification shall be made on form CHRB-36 (New 08/04), Bleeder Treatment Report, which is hereby incorporated by reference, not later than two hours prior to post time of the race for which the horse is entered.

(1) The trainer or a licensed employee of the trainer shall be present and observe the furosemide administration.

(f) The horsemen's organization, trainers' organization, and racing association shall enter into an agreement to provide for race-day furosemide administration. The agreement to provide for race-day furosemide administration shall be submitted to the Board in accordance with Rule 1433 of this Division. The agreement shall describe the racing association's program for the administration of race-day furosemide, the minimum level of staffing necessary to carry out the program, and the projected costs to horsemen for such administration.

(1) Furosemide shall be administered by a furosemide veterinarian or California-registered veterinary technician under the direct supervision of the furosemide veterinarian. The furosemide veterinarian or California registered veterinary technician who provides race-day furosemide administration shall be employed by the racing association and shall not have a current business relationship, or prior veterinarian-client-patient relationship, with participating licensees within 30 days of the date he or she is

employed to administer furosemide.

(2) All parties present during the administration of furosemide shall certify in writing that they have witnessed the furosemide administration by signing the form CHRB-36 (New 08/04), Bleeder Treatment Report. The furosemide veterinarian or California registered veterinary technician shall place the syringe used to administer furosemide in an evidence bag which will be sealed in front of the witnesses. The witnesses shall sign the sealed evidence bag. The syringe used to administer furosemide shall be provided to and securely stored by the Board in accordance with subsection (hi) of this regulation.

(3) "Furosemide veterinarian" is defined as the veterinarian, licensed by the Board, and hired by the racing association to administer race-day furosemide to horses registered on the authorized bleeder medication list.

(4) "Owner's veterinarian" is defined as the veterinarian, licensed by the Board, and hired by the owner to provide veterinary care to horses.

(g) A horse registered to be administered furosemide shall receive 250 mg of furosemide intravenously unless an alternative dose of not less than 150 mg and not more than 250 mg has been determined after consultation between the trainer, owner, or owner's veterinarian, and the furosemide veterinarian pursuant to subsection (d).

(h) In the event of an adverse reaction or other emergency related to the administration of furosemide, the furosemide veterinarian, or California registered veterinary technician, who administered furosemide shall attend the horse until the arrival of the owner's veterinarian.

~~(i) The syringe used to administer furosemide shall be provided to and securely stored by the Board until all testing of the horse is completed. In the event of a positive~~

~~test finding as defined in this article, the Board may order, or the owner or trainer may request, the retained syringe be tested for prohibited substances. The results of the test may be used in any action before the Board.~~

(ji) A horse that has been administered furosemide must show a detectable concentration of the drug in post-race serum, plasma, or urine samples, as follows:

(1) The official laboratory shall measure the specific gravity of post-race urine samples to ensure samples are sufficiently concentrated for proper chemical analysis. The specific gravity of such samples shall not be below 1.010.

(2) If the specific gravity of the post-race urine sample is determined to be below 1.010, or if the urine sample is not available for testing, quantitation of furosemide in serum or plasma shall then be performed. Concentrations may not exceed 100 nanograms of furosemide per milliliter of serum or plasma.

(kj) A horse registered on the official authorized bleeder medication list must remain on the list unless the trainer or owner's veterinarian requests the horse be removed. The request must be made using form CHRB-194 (Rev. 01/16), and must be submitted to the official veterinarian prior to the time of entry. A horse removed from the authorized bleeder medication list may not be placed back on the list for a period of 60 calendar days unless the official veterinarian determines it is medically necessary for the horse. If a horse is removed from the authorized bleeder medication list a second time in a 365-day period, the horse may not be placed back on the list for a period of 90 calendar days.

(~~k~~) If the official veterinarian observes a horse bleeding externally from one or both nostrils during or after a race or workout, and determines such bleeding is a direct result

of EIPH, the horse shall be ineligible to race for the following periods:

- First incident -14 days;
- Second incident within 365-day period -30 days;
- Third incident within 365-day period -180 days;
- Fourth incident within 365-day period -barred from racing lifetime.

For the purposes of counting the number of days a horse is ineligible to run, the day after the horse bled externally is the first day of such period.

(~~m~~) The owner(s) of a registered horse shall:

(1) Pay all costs associated with the materials used in the administration of furosemide, including the syringe and medication, and reasonable administrative costs as set under the race-day furosemide agreement entered into by the horsemen's organization, trainers' organization, and the racing association.

(2) Consent to the procedures in this section and agree that the pre-race examination conducted under the direction of the official veterinarian or racing veterinarian shall constitute a veterinary-client-patient relationship within the meaning of California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2032.1.

The trainer plays a vital role in the conditioning and training of a horse prior to a race. The decisions the trainer makes about training, workouts, and rest can affect the performance of the horse. The trainer is also ultimately responsible for the condition of the horse prior to entry to race and for ensuring the horse is free of medications and illicit substances, healthy to run, and fit to compete.

Given the great responsibility placed on a trainer, there exists a risk to the industry and the wagering public through "program" or "paper" trainers. A program trainer is generally a licensed trainer who is listed on the official race program as the trainer of record for the entered horse. In reality this is in name only, as the actual training and conditioning of the horse has been completed by someone other than the listed trainer, and sometimes by an individual whose license has been suspended or revoked. The California Horse Racing Board (Board) has faced issues in the past where a horse owner will use a program trainer until their horse comes up with a positive drug test and the trainer is suspended. The owner will then find someone else who either has or can get a trainer's license and is willing to have their name put on the program for a stipend – until one of the horses they saddle gets a positive test, resulting in frequent turnover of program trainers. Program training is unfair to both the wagering public and other licensees because the person responsible for the training of the horse is unknown and puts the horse and rider at risk. Although instances of program training are pursued against licensees who engage in such behavior, the proposed amendments to Board [Rules 1501](#) and [1502](#) seek to clarify and expressly prohibit this activity.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed amendment to Board Rule 1501, Worker's Compensation Insurance Required, will add a subsection (b) to require that no licensee, for the purpose of avoiding the requirements for workmen's compensation insurance, shall place any horse in the care of or attendance of any other person. This subsection was originally found in Rule 1502 but is being moved for clarity, as it relates to worker compensation insurance requirements.

The proposed amendment to Board Rule 1502, Program Training Prohibited, will clarify that program training is prohibited, and any licensee who engages in program training may be suspended or fined. This is necessary to clarify that any licensee who engages

in program training will be held liable for their actions. Subsection (b) provides that program training occurs when a licensed trainer is identified as the trainer of record in the official program but has not engaged in the actual training of the horse either personally or through the assistant trainer. Subsection (c) provides that actual training, as it is used in this regulation, shall mean any responsibility required of a licensed trainer under this division or any act traditionally performed by a licensed trainer including, but not limited to: (1) determining when a horse will walk, gallop, or workout; (2) determining the feed or supplements given to the horse; (3) consulting with a licensed veterinarian when needed. This subsection is necessary to clarify what actions constitute training.

BACKGROUND:

Business and Professions Code (BPC) [section 19420](#) provides that jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in this State where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the Board. BPC [section 19440](#) provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include, but are not limited to, adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. BPC [section 19460](#) states all licenses granted under this chapter are subject to all rules, regulations, and conditions prescribed by the Board. BPC [section 19464](#) provides that no application for a horse owner's license or for a license to conduct a race meeting shall be granted unless the applicant's liability for workers' compensation is secured in accordance with [Division 4](#) (commencing with Section 3700) of the Labor Code.

The proposed regulation was noticed to the public on August 14, 2020. The 45-day public comment period opened August 14, 2020 and closed on September 28, 2020. Two comments were received during the 45-day public comment period, one from the Post Time Self Insurance Group and Finish Line Self Insurance Group, Inc., and the other from California Thoroughbred Trainers, and are attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. Staff recommends that the Board adopt the proposed regulation as presented.

(a) No person may be licensed as a trainer, owner, trainer-driver, or in any other capacity in which such person acts as the employer of any other licensee at any authorized race meeting, unless his liability for worker's compensation has been secured in accordance with the Labor Code of the State of California and until evidence of such security for liability is provided the Board. Should any such required security for liability for worker's compensation be cancelled or terminated, any license held by such person shall be automatically suspended and shall be grounds for revocation of the license. The trainer of a public stable shall provide evidence that the policy of insurance securing his liability for worker's compensation has been endorsed or amended to include, as an additional insured, each person for whom he trains horses to the extent that such person is exposed to liability as the employer of a jockey, unless such person has procured coverage for such exposure and has furnished evidence of such coverage to the Board.

(b) No licensee, for the purpose of avoiding the requirements for workmen's compensation insurance as set forth in this article, shall place any horse in the care of or attendance of any other person.

(1) Determining when a horse will walk, gallop, or workout;

(2) Determining the feed or supplements given to the horse;

(3) Consulting with a licensed veterinarian when needed.

We are writing in reference to Proposals to Amend CHRB Rules 1501 and 1502.

In general, we agree with the comments previously submitted by Post Time Self-Insurance Group [PTSIG], dated September 21, 2020.

In that connection, we call to your attention Rule 1597, Association to Maintain Records of Horses on Its Grounds.

It is critically important for the purposes of proper administration of the Board's workers' compensation rules, that the Associations participate meaningfully -- including at their authorized off-site training facilities, as well as the operating track conducting racing -- in properly identifying horses arriving and in their placement only with trainers having verified workers' compensation insurance, including and especially for the period from their arrival until entry in a race.

PTSIG has made available on-line to racing associations a dynamic, continually updated record of all its member trainers in California. We are particularly concerned that track managements and stable offices have systems in place to verify that horses are only stabled with trainers whose workers' compensation is current, and that all trainers to whom any horses are assigned are currently insured.

We don't have a specific proposal of how to amend or add to the proposed language to be certain this responsibility is observed, but trust that CHRB staff and counsel can properly advise the Board.

Re Proposed amendment to CHRB Rule 1502

Dear Mr. Voss,

I am writing to you on behalf of the two self-insurance groups that insure ninety nine percent of all licensed California horse trainers for their workers' compensation exposure. It is the opinion of Post Time Self Insurance Group and Finish Line Self Insurance Group, Inc. that the prohibition on program training needs to be more specific and start at the stable gate, as soon as the horse has been admitted entrance to the backstretch, and not at the starting gate.

One of the stated purposes of the amendments is to address the use of "program" training. While the proposed amendments to these CHRB rules is a great start, Post Time Self Insurance Group (PTSIG) & Finish Line Self Insurance Group (FLSIG) are of the opinion that it is not inclusive enough to fully address this important issue. The main goal is to protect the health and safety of the horse and rider, which in turn will greatly benefit all stakeholders in the California racing industry. The duty to protect the horse and rider starts with the CHRB through its plenary power authority to make rules and regulations. This duty flows to the trainer, the ultimate guardian of the horse, whose decisions about training, workouts, rest, and nutrition will affect the performance of the

horse through its racing career. This responsibility is so great that it cannot be delegated through “program” training and the prohibition on program training must be specific and begin at the stable gate, when the horse is first placed in the barn of a CHRB licensed trainer in good standing.

“Program” training is about integrity and this problem is not confined to CA. As stated in a 8/20/20 article ‘The Paper Trainer Game’ in the Paulick Report by Ray Paulick and Natalie Voss, licensees in other jurisdictions have long been frustrated at suspected cases of program training, wondering what the purpose of a license suspension or revocation is if a trainer can play the paper game. A paper trainer also causes problems for horseplayers, who often consider the connection to high win percentage trainers when placing their bets, if they know those connections are involved.


There is a whole regime of training activities that takes place prior to a trainer entering a horse into a race and having his name listed in the official program as associated with the horse. Just as important as holding the trainer accountable as the trainer of record in the official program, it is equally as important to hold that same trainer accountable from the moment that the horse is admitted through the stable gate and housed in a trainers barn.

As stated in the policy statement overview of the proposed amendments, program training is already a prohibited activity under CHRB rules and regulations, but the rules and regulations need to be updated to clarify the definition of program training.

A financially sound and affordable workers’ compensation insurance program is extremely important to California horse trainers and all stakeholders involved in California racing. Risk management and providing affordable workers’ compensation insurance to licensed trainers in California is the prime objective for PTSIG & FLSIG. While proposed CHRB rule 1502 addresses the prohibition of program training on race day, it needs to be extended to cover the morning workouts as well as all training and care for the horses, including nutritional support, from the onset of arrival at the stable gate to the trainers barn.

Exercise riders, in the morning workouts, account for a large percentage of injuries in our programs. In 2017, they were 45% of total injuries. In 2018 – 39%, 2019 – 38%. As these percentages are high, the monetary value of the injuries is even higher, as exercise riders are more susceptible to catastrophic injuries, just as the jockeys are. It is imperative to extend the prohibition on program training to the morning workouts to better protect the horses and the exercise riders. ***To that end, Post Time Self Insurance Group along with Finish Line Self Insurance Group, Inc. proposes that CHRB 1502 (b) (1) be amended to state that program training commences when a horse is admitted through the stable gate, to a trainer's barn and the trainer does not engage in the actual training of the horse either personally or through an assistant trainer.***

ISSUE:

Currently, the Racing Veterinarian and examining veterinarians are supervised by the racing association's racing office, which presents a conflict of interest. Rather, the Racing Veterinarian and examining veterinarians should be under the direct supervision of the Official Veterinarian.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed amendment to California Horse Racing Board (Board) [Rule 1560, Duties of the Official Veterinarian](#), would provide that the official veterinarian shall have the authority and jurisdiction to supervise the Racing Veterinarian. The proposed amendment to Board [Rule 1561, Duties of the Racing Veterinarian](#), would provide that the Racing Veterinarian shall have direct reporting responsibility and make required reports to the official veterinarian and the Board of Stewards. It would also provide that no licensed official or other employee of the association or fair shall have authority to override or interfere with the Racing Veterinarian's reporting responsibility or duties.

No comments were received during the 45-day public comment period.

BACKGROUND:

[Business and Professions Code \(BPC\) section 19440](#) provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually its responsibilities, including the administration and enforcement of all laws, rules, and regulations affecting horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. [BPC section 19460](#) provides that all licenses granted by the Board are subject to all rules, regulations, and conditions prescribed by the Board and shall contain such conditions as are deemed necessary or desirable by the Board for the best interests of horse racing. [BPC section 19562](#) states that the Board shall adopt rules, regulations, and conditions consistent with the provisions of this chapter, under which horse races with wagering on the results shall be conducted in California.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the proposed amendments be adopted as presented.

1561. Duties of the Racing Veterinarian.

The Racing Veterinarian shall examine each horse when it is first entered to race at the race meeting and ~~he~~they shall report to the stewards any horse which in ~~his~~their opinion is not of the age or condition which is satisfactory for the type of racing to be conducted at the meeting. The stewards may declare any such horse so reported as ineligible to be entered or started at the meeting until such time as the Racing Veterinarian certifies such horse to be raceably sound. The Racing Veterinarian shall be present in the paddock, on the race course, and at the starting gate during the saddling, the parade, and until the horses are dispatched from the gate for the race, and ~~he~~they shall examine any horse when there is a question as to the physical condition of such horse. ~~He~~They shall report any horse which in ~~his~~their opinion is incapable of physically exerting its best effort to win to the stewards who may declare such horse from the race. The Racing Veterinarian shall examine any horse which appears in physical distress during the race, at the finish of the race and ~~he~~they shall report such horse together with ~~his~~their opinion as to the cause of the distress to the stewards and to the official veterinarian. The Racing Veterinarian has the authority to treat any horse in event of an emergency, accident or injury, and ~~he is~~they are authorized to humanely destroy any horse which in ~~his~~their opinion is so seriously injured that it is in the best interests of racing to so act, and every horse owner and trainer in participating in a race in this State does consent thereto. The Racing Veterinarian shall recommend to the official veterinarian those horses which by reason of physical disability should be placed on the Veterinarian's List and ~~he~~they may recommend removal from the list of those horses which in ~~his~~their opinion can satisfactorily compete in a race.

The Racing Veterinarian shall have direct reporting responsibility to the official veterinarian and the Board of Stewards and in exercising their duties under this section shall make required reports to the official veterinarian and the Board of Stewards as provided herein. No licensed official or other employee of the Association or fair shall have authority to override or interfere with that reporting responsibility or the proper exercise of the duties and responsibilities of the Racing Veterinarian.

ISSUE:

In 2015, the California Horse Racing Board (Board) amended [Board Rule 1887, Trainer to Insure Condition of Horse](#), to add owners of ship-in horses as joint-absolute insurers and equally responsible for the condition of the horse entered to race. The title of the rule was changed to “Trainer or Owner to Insure Condition of Horse.” The primary purpose of the amendment was to address the use of “program” or “paper” trainers. The proposed amendment to Board [Rule 1588, Horse Ineligible to Start in a Race](#), will strengthen the Board’s ability to prevent program training. A new subsection (11)(B) provides that, except with prior approval of the stewards, and except for horses shipped directly from another racing jurisdiction, a horse that has not been in the care of a Board licensed trainer and stabled within a Board inclosure for seven consecutive days prior to the race, is ineligible to start in a race.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed amendment to Board Rule 1588, Horse Ineligible to Start in a Race, sets forth various conditions in which a horse would be ineligible to start in a race. Currently, subsection 1588(a)(11) provides that, except with prior approval of the stewards, a horse that has not been on the grounds of the association or its approved auxiliary stable area for at least 24 hours prior to the time the race is to be run is ineligible to start in a race. While this addresses horses already on the grounds that are subject to strict regulations, it does not address those horses that are shipped into California racing and training facilities. The proposed amendment to Board Rule 1588 will add new subsection 1588(a)(11)(B) to provide that, except with prior approval of the stewards, and except for horses shipped directly from another racing jurisdiction, a horse that has not been in the care of a licensed trainer and stabled within a Board inclosure for seven consecutive days prior to the race, is ineligible to start in a race.

BACKGROUND:

Business and Professions Code (BPC) [section 19440](#) provides the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. BPC [section 19562](#) states the Board may prescribe rules, regulations and conditions under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California.

The proposed regulation was noticed to the public on August 21, 2020. The 45-day public comment period opened August 21, 2020 and closed on October 5, 2020. No comments were received during the 45-day public comment period.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. Staff recommends that the Board adopt the proposed regulation as presented.

1588. Horse Ineligible to Start in a Race.

(a) In addition to any other valid ground or reason, a horse is ineligible to start in any race:

(1) if such horse is not registered by the Jockey Club if a thoroughbred, the United States Trotting Association if a standardbred, the American Quarter Horse Association if a quarter horse, the Appaloosa Horse Club if an appaloosa horse, the Arabian Horse Registry of America if an Arabian horse, or the American Paint Horse Association if a paint horse;

(2) if the parentage verification to both the sire and the dam of all horses foaled in 1992 and thereafter has not been certified by the Jockey Club if a thoroughbred, the United States Trotting Association if a standardbred, the American Quarter Horse Association if a quarter horse, the Appaloosa Horse Club if an appaloosa horse, the Arabian Horse Registry of America if an Arabian horse, or the American Paint Horse Association if a paint horse;

(3) if, unless the stewards permit otherwise, the certificate of foal registration, eligibility papers, or other registration issued by the official registry for such horse is not on file with the racing secretary at the time of entry;

(4) if such horse has been entered or raced at any recognized race meeting under any name or designation other than the name or designation duly assigned by and registered with the official registry;

(5) if the certificate of foal registration, eligibility papers or other registration issued by the official registry has been altered, erased, or forged;

(6) if the identification markings of the horse do not agree with the identification markings as set forth in the registration of such horse;

(7) unless he is eligible to enter said race and is duly entered for such race;

(8) when such horse is owned in whole or in part by an unlicensed person or is in the care of an unlicensed trainer;

(9) when such horse is on the Steward's List, the Starter's List or the Veterinarian's List;

(10) when, except with prior approval of the stewards for good cause, such horse is on the Veterinarian's List in another racing jurisdiction. Good cause includes:

(A) unforeseen administrative issues in removing the horse from the Veterinarian's List of another racing jurisdiction;

(B) the location of the horse prevents it from being evaluated by the official veterinarian of another racing jurisdiction and cleared from that jurisdiction's Veterinarian's List, and the horse is approved to race by a California official veterinarian;
or

(C) any other unforeseen event or reason that would prevent a horse that would otherwise not be on a Veterinarian's List from being cleared from the Veterinarian's List of another racing jurisdiction.

(11) when, except with prior approval of the stewards;

(A) such horse has not been on the grounds of the association or its approved auxiliary stable area for at least 24 hours prior to the time the race is to be run, or

(B) except for horses being shipped directly from another racing jurisdiction, such horse has not been in the care of a trainer licensed by the Board and stabled within a CHRB inclosure, including auxiliary stabling areas, for seven consecutive days prior to the race.

(12) when such horse does not carry a microchip or has not received a waiver from the stewards in accordance with Rule 1597.5.

(13) when such horse has received an intra-articular injection within the previous five days (120 hours) prior to the scheduled post-time for the race in which it is entered.

(14) when such horse has not raced at a recognized race meeting within 12 consecutive months since its previous start, until the horse has performed satisfactorily in a workout or standardbred qualifying race as provided in Rule 1866(e) and (f).

(15) when such horse is a first-time starter four (4) years of age or older, until the horse has performed satisfactorily in a workout or standardbred qualifying race as provided in Rule 1866(e) and (f).
