### Wednesday

#### 06-23-10<sup>1</sup> OPENING DAY MATTERS

The stewards were busy early this morning taking care of opening day matters. Chief Financial Officer Randy Magee and Director of Operations/Satellite Manager Jeanne Wasserman each stopped by the stewards' office to make sure that the stewards' needs are met during this sixteen (16) day stand.

#### 06-23-10<sup>2</sup> MICHAEL MARTINEZ FILM REVIEW – RULING NO. 1

Jockey **Michael Martinez** appeared in the stewards' office to review his ride aboard #3 BLUSHING BEAR CAT who finished first in the ninth race on Sunday, June 20 (closing day) at the San Joaquin County Fair in Stockton. Jockey Martinez survived a stewards' inquiry (Ref: 06-20-10<sup>5</sup>) in this race.

Film review shows BLUSHING BEAR CAT racing to the lead in mid-stretch. Jockey Martinez is whipping left handed but drifting inward forcing fourth place rival #8 SLY PARK ROAD (James Wooten, Jr.) to steady sharply. Jockey Martinez stated, through interpreter Augustine Meza, that he was clear of SLY PARK ROAD and that there was a possible overreaction by the rider of that horse. The stewards disagreed with this analysis. Jockey Martinez was suspended for careless riding earlier this month at Golden Gate Fields. The stewards issued the following ruling:

Jockey **MICHAEL MARTINEZ**, who rode BLUSHING BEAR CAT in the ninth race at San Joaquin County Fair (Stockton) on Sunday, June 20, 2010, is suspended five (5) racing days (June 30 and July 1, 2, 3 and 4, 2010) for failure to make a proper effort to maintain a straight course entering the stretch and causing interference; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (d) & (f) (Riding Rules – careless riding).

The term of this suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races in California.

#### 06-23-10<sup>3</sup> MONTE GOMES MEETING - RULING NO. 2

Trainer **Monte Gomes** appeared in the stewards' office as ordered to discuss the late declaration of #6 DOUG'S BOY from the sixth race at the San Joaquin County Fair in Stockton.

Trainer Gomes needed an additional workout to make DOUG'S BOY eligible for this race. Trainer Gomes obtained the workout but decided not to participate at Stockton and wait

for a race at Pleasanton. The stewards mitigated the penalty below after Gomes appeared to have been part of some miscommunication. The stewards issued the following ruling:

Trainer **MONTE GOMES** is hereby fined one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for failure to handle his business in a proper manner resulting in the declaration of DOUG'S BOY from the sixth race on June 20, 2010 at the San Joaquin County Fair (Stockton); a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule 1530 (Cases Not Covered by Rules and Regulations).

06-23-10<sup>4</sup> **MUTTON BUSTING MISFORTUNE**

Prior to the running of the fourth race a delay was caused when approximately nine (9) sheep were released, ran loose on the racetrack and then into the track infield.

The sheep were part of a 'Mutton Busting' event (sheep ridden by 3 to 6 year olds) that failed. This event will be cancelled for the remainder of the fair. This occurrence led to a fourteen (14) minute delay in the running of the fourth race.

06-23-10<sup>5</sup> **COMMISSIONER VISIT**

California Horse Racing Board member John Harris visited the stewards' stand today during the opening day of the fair.

06-23-10<sup>6</sup> **FURTHER DELAY – Fifth Race**

A vehicle/trailer used to transport sheep that had been secured in the track infield became stuck and inoperable prior to the running of the fifth race. This incident led to a four (4) minute delay in the running of the fifth race.

Alameda County Fair Director of Operations Jeanne Wasserman will meet with the stewards tomorrow to discuss future special events that are being planned.

06-23-10<sup>7</sup> **INQUIRY – NO CHANGE – Eighth Race**

The stewards posted the inquiry sign after viewing #1 POCKETFULLAPROMISE (David Lopez) break very slow. #1 POCKETFULLAPROMISE (odds 30/1 - DNF) attempted to break early and was held back by an assistant starter in order to re-position the horse.

The stewards spoke with starter Robert Mooneyhan and jockey David Lopez following the race.

The majority of the stewards felt that no refunds were in order. The minority (Baker) felt the horse was held onto for a notably unusual amount of time and that a full refund should be made. No Change.

**Thursday**06-24-10<sup>1</sup>**JULIEN COUTON - RULING NO. 3**

Jockey **Julien Couton** missed his riding assignment in yesterday's fourth race (#2 ELEGANT LOOQ). Jockey Couton phoned the stewards today to state he had problems with travel connections from France yesterday. The stewards issued the following ruling:

Jockey **JULIEN COUTON**, who was scheduled to ride ELEGANT LOOQ in the fourth race at the Alameda County Fair (Pleasanton) on Wednesday, June 23, 2010, is hereby fined the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1872 (Failure to Fulfill Jockey Agreement) causing a late rider change.

06-24-10<sup>2</sup>**DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS MEETING**

The stewards met with Alameda County Fair Director of Operations Jeanne Wasserman today. The stewards wanted to review any future special events that will be held between races in the racing enclosure during this sixteen (16) day stand. (Ref: 06-23-10<sup>4</sup>)

06-24-10<sup>3</sup>**OFFICIAL CHANGES**

Clerk of Scales Gary Lawless is off sick. Patrol Judge Cheryl White will replace him. Racing Official Steve Martinelli will serve as a patrol judge.

06-24-10<sup>4</sup>**HORSE RESTRICTED**

Trainer **Alex Sywak** appeared in the stewards' office along with outrider Jane Schvaneveldt. The stewards were alerted to safety concerns involving the Sywak trained **AMBERMOSC** during morning training. The stewards told trainer Sywak that **AMBERMOSC** will not be allowed to train at Northern California racetracks during morning training hours pending further review.

06-24-10<sup>6</sup>**FORMER STAFF VISITS**

Retired CHRB investigators Robert Gai and Mike Kilpack paid the stewards a special visit during this afternoon's racing card.

06-24-10<sup>7</sup>**SMOOTH CARD**

Today's afternoon portion of work went well as we were free of stewards' inquiries and/or jockey objections.

**Friday**06-25-10<sup>1</sup>**MANUEL R. CALVARIO HEARING** (Case No. 09GG065)

A formal hearing was heard today for owner/trainer **Manuel R. Calvario**. Owner/Trainer Calvario is being charged with violations of California Horse Racing Board rule 1489(i) (Grounds for Denial or Refusal of License), rule 1900 (Grounds for Suspension or Revocation), rule 1930 (Obedience to Security Officers and Public Safety Officers) and Family Law Code Section 17520.

Along with the stewards present today were CHRB Senior Special Investigator Gabe Palomar, owner Manuel Calvario and Court Reporter Christine Niccoli.

This hearing revolves around delinquent child support payments due to Calvario's ex-wife. As of March 6, 2009 these payments amounted to approximately \$42,300.

On April 9, 2009 Golden Gate Fields' Board of Stewards gave owner/trainer Calvario one hundred fifty (150) days to be in compliance with San Mateo County (CA) Child Support Services.

Owner/Trainer Calvario was arrested by CHRB investigators at the San Joaquin County Fair in June 2009 (Ref: 06-18-09<sup>2</sup>) after San Mateo County Superior Court issued a bench warrant regarding this matter.

According to Investigator Palomar's report Calvario's ex-wife had received a total of \$700.00 from Calvario during 2009. Manuel Calvario showed proof of payment of \$1,000.00 so far in 2010. Mr. Calvario stated he was going to court next week in San Mateo County in order to become in compliance with California Department of Child Support Services, who was the 'complainant' in this matter.

Owner/Trainer Calvario requested that he meet with the stewards on July 3 following his court appearance before the stewards reach a conclusion in this matter. The majority of the stewards (Baker dissent) voted to leave the record 'open' and reconvene this formal hearing on July 3. More to follow.

06-25-10<sup>2</sup> **INQUIRY – NO CHANGE – Second Race**

The stewards posted the inquiry sign following this quarter horse race and investigated two (2) incidents. Also in this race jockey, and brother, Gregorio Arriaga (#8 SUPER BLACK DASH, 2<sup>nd</sup>) lodged an objection against first place finisher #6 IN REMEMBRANCE SBL (Juan Arriaga) for alleged interference about seventy (70) yards before the finish. The stewards observed #6 IN REMEMBRANCE SBL drift out in front of rival #8 SUPER BLACK DASH; however, he was nearly two (2) lengths clear at this point.

In an earlier second incident third place finisher #3 OUTDASHIN (Reed Saldana) breaks into #2 KELLYS REGAL BOY (Olivo Maldonado) who finished a well beaten eighth (last).

After film review it was unanimously ruled that neither incident warranted a disqualification. No Change. Jockeys Reed Saldana and Juan Arriaga were ordered to film review with the stewards.

06-26-10<sup>1</sup> **REED SALDANA FILM REVIEW**

Jockey **Reed Saldana** appeared in the stewards' office to review his ride aboard #3 OUTDASHIN who finished third in yesterday's second race. Film review shows jockey Saldana break inward in this three hundred fifty (350) yard quarter horse race. Jockey Saldana made a good effort to straighten his mount in the unanimous opinion of the stewards.

06-26-10<sup>2</sup> **RULING NO. 4 – MIYADI**

Trainer **STEVE MIYADI**, who was scheduled to start the horse CHU SHY SHY in the fifth race at the Alameda County Fair (Pleasanton) on June 25, 2010, is fined the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for failing to declare shoeing change at time of entry necessitating a late declaration; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1853 (Examination Required).

The stewards issued the foregoing ruling after speaking with trainer Steve Miyadi. Trainer Miyadi raced CHU SHY SHY June 13, 2010 at Golden Gate Fields unshod. He wished to put 'shoes on' at Pleasanton but failed to declare that at time of entry.

06-26-10<sup>3</sup> **JOCKEY ARRIAGA FILM REVIEW – RULING NO. 5**

Jockey **Juan Arriaga** appeared in the stewards' office today to review his ride in yesterday's second race. This was jockey Arriaga's first lifetime quarter horse ride. He finished first aboard #6 IN REMBRANCE SBL. His mount drifted out continuously while jockey Arriaga whipped right handed through the stretch.

Arriaga's brother, Gregorio Arriaga, was aboard #8 SUPER BLACK DASH, who finished second in this race. He also appeared at this hearing. The stewards explained that the 'inside rein' should be used rather than the whip when attempting to straighten horses.

The stewards hope this young rider will learn/improve from the following ruling that the stewards unanimously decided on.

Jockey **JUAN ARRIAGA**, who rode IN REMEMBRANCE SBL in the second race at the Alameda County Fair on Friday, June 25, 2010, is suspended three (3) racing days (July 2, 3 and 4, 2010) for failure to make the proper effort to maintain a straight course in the stretch and causing interference; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (d) & (f) (Riding Rules – careless riding).

The term of this suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races in California.

06-26-10<sup>4</sup> **CHRIS RUSSELL FILM REVIEW**

Jockey **Chris Russell** appeared in the stewards' office to review his ride aboard #6 LIVING LEGEND who finished fifth in yesterday's ninth race. Approaching the ¼ pole, LIVING LEGEND and jockey Russell angle out and make contact with eighth place finisher #3 BEST OF THE BUNCH (Diego Sanchez).

Jockey Russell was told to take better control of his horse in a ride the stewards felt was under par. Warning issued.

06-26-10<sup>5</sup> **INQUIRY – NO CHANGE – Fourth Race**

The stewards called for a 'general inquiry' after viewing seventh (last) place finisher #2 ONE FOR THE MONEY (James Wooten) become rank and hard to place rounding the first (clubhouse) turn. Contact was made with #5 SCREAMIN EXPRESS (Diego Sanchez) during this incident. #2 ONE FOR THE MONEY finished last therefore no action by the stewards was warranted. No Change.

**Sunday**06-27-10<sup>1</sup> **GILBERTO RUBALCAVA COMPLAINT** (Case # 10GG114)

A formal hearing was held today for exercise rider **GILBERTO RUBALCAVA**. The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) charged Mr. Rubalcava with violations of CHRB rule #1489 (a) (h) (Grounds for Denial or Refusal of License), rule #1902 (Conduct Detrimental to Horse Racing) and rule #1900 (Grounds for Suspension or Revocation).

Along with the stewards, present at today's hearing were CHRB senior special investigator Charles Smith, court reporter Connie Parchman, along with Mr. Rubalcava's attorney James Ghidella. Exercise rider Rubalcava retained attorney Ghidella's service yesterday, June 26, 2010.

Gilberto Rubalcava was arrested in Contra Costa County (CA) on September 3, 2008 for alleged violations regarding a) planting / cultivating marijuana; b) possession of marijuana for sale and c) conspiracy to commit crime. This hearing was originally set for June 11, 2010; however, Rubalcava was unable to attend due to being under house arrest.

Attorney Ghidella requested a continuance in this matter in order to review documents and other 'discovery' issues. The stewards granted the continuance and this matter will be heard on July 10 at 10:00 a.m. at Pleasanton.

06-27-10<sup>2</sup> **JUAN HERNANDEZ FILM REVIEW**

Jockey **Juan Hernandez** appeared in the stewards' office to review his ride in yesterday's seventh race. Jockey Hernandez was aboard #1 MAMOONYA who finished second in this race going one (1) mile an seventy yards. Jockey agent Ramon Silva accompanied jockey Hernandez to the hearing.

Race replays showed #1 MAMOONYA drift out just inside the 1/16 pole. This forces third place finisher #8 COME BACK NATIVE (Frank Alvarado) to take up slightly and alter course while racing from between horses.

The stewards told jockey Hernandez that a straight course is necessary and decided that an 'official warning' would be memorialized in these minutes.

06-27-10<sup>3</sup> **OBJECTION - NO CHANGE – First Race**

Following the running of the first (mule) race the jockey of second place finisher #6 RED ROOSTER, Olivo Maldonado, lodged an objection against first place finisher #5 JET FUEL (James Wooten, Jr.).

Race replays showed #5 JET FUEL shift out slightly about one hundred (100) yards before the finish. The stewards felt #6 RED ROOSTER was bothered very little during this incident and unanimously ruled to make 'no change' in the order of finish.

06-27-10<sup>4</sup> **INQUIRY / OBJECTION – NO CHANGE – Second Race**

The stewards posted the inquiry sign after viewing an incident between first place finisher #4 COWBOY HEART (Julien Couton) and second place finisher #1 GENERAL DAN (Michael Martinez) while racing in the homestretch.

A jockey's objection was also made in this race by jockey Michael Martinez who 'claimed foul' against #4 COWBOY HEART.

The stewards noticed an incident in the stretch run of this race. Inside the one eighth

pole #4 COWBOY HEART steps inward following right handed whipping. Jockey Martinez, aboard #1 GENERAL DAN, appears to anticipate traffic issues which don't occur and steadies slightly. In the second incident, inside the one-sixteenth pole, #4 COWBOY HEART drifts in again; this time taking the path of #1 GENERAL DAN, forcing him to 'take up' and lose ground while racing along the rail.

The stewards received a patrol judge report; spoke with both riders involved and reviewed all angles of race replays.

In a majority vote, no change was made in the order of finish. The minority (Baker) felt #1 GENERAL DAN lost an opportunity to place where he might be reasonably expected to finish. Jockey **Julien Couton** was ordered to film review with the stewards.
