Report of the Board of Stewards for the period August 1, 2007 through August 6, 2007.

**Wednesday**  
**08/01/07**

**1 FILM REVIEW**

Jockey JOE TALAMO met with the stewards to discuss his ride in the fifth race Monday, which his mount won, but in the steward's opinion, he could have done a better job in keeping his mount straight through the stretch. After reviewing the films, Mr. Talamo explained that his instructions were to ride his mount vigorously, but acknowledged that he was overzealous. He was cautioned to make a better effort in the future.

**2 SADLER DISCUSSION**

Trainer JOHN SADLER met with the stewards this morning to discuss the procedures with respect to medication disqualifications and purse redistributions. The stewards in Southern California have been requiring that owners return the entire purse amount earned, leaving them to pursue their employees—trainer and jockey, for their respective parts. Clearly, owners will object to this system, and would prefer the old system under which each party was required to return their share. Oftentimes, jockeys would object to returning their part. Clearly, there needs to be a uniform system in place throughout California. The way to accomplish this should be a meeting of the CHRB, CTT, TOC and Jockey's Guild.

### **3 WARREN RULING**

Trainer DON WARREN met with the stewards informally to discuss case number 07HP106, which was filed by the Official Veterinarian for being late to the receiving barn at Hollywood Park. Mr. Warren accepted the following ruling without argument:

#### **Ruling #20**

Trainer Donald Warren is fined the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00)\* for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rules #1852 (Reporting to the Receiving Barn - Late) and #1894 (Duties of a Trainer) for the eighth race on July 12, 2007, at Hollywood Park.

### **4 CONTRERAS RULING**

Trainer GERARDO CONTRERAS met with the stewards informally by telephone to discuss case number 07HP104, which was filed by the Official Veterinarian for being late to the receiving barn at Hollywood Park. Mr. Contreras accepted the following ruling without argument:

#### **Ruling #21**

Trainer Gerardo Contreras is fined one hundred dollars (\$100.00)\* for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rules #1852 (Reporting to the Receiving Barn - Late) and #1894 (Duties of a Trainer) for the seventh race on July 8, 2007, at Hollywood Park.

**1      FILM REVIEW**

Jockey BRICE BLANC met with the stewards to discuss his ride in the sixth race yesterday during which his mount drifted in slightly in the stretch. Although the rival to his inside pauses only briefly, we are trying to impress upon the jockey colony the importance of maintaining a straight path, especially in the new age of polytrack. Mr. Blanc agreed.

**2      FERNANDEZ RULING**

Trainer VICTOR FERNANDEZ was fined in the following ruling for bringing his horse to the receiving barn with illegal shoes. This was the second time at the meet. Fortunately, the horseshoe inspector was able to correct the problem.

**Ruling #22**

Trainer Victor Fernandez, who started “Marc’s Shadow” in the eighth race July 30, 2007 at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club is fined is fined two hundred dollars (\$200.00)\* for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule #1853 (Examination Required –Horse Improperly Shod).

**3      PENDER RULING AND PURSE REDISTRIBUTION**

Trainer MIKE PENDER met with the stewards in a formal hearing for the purpose of approving the stipulated agreement and resulting disqualification and purse redistribution embodied in case 07HP056. The crux of the agreement involved a three thousand dollar fine for a Class 3 Clenbuterol overage. The stewards approved the agreement, and in the absence of the owners’ appearance or any objection, voted to disqualify the horse and redistribute the purse. These two actions were memorialized in the following two rulings:

**Ruling #23**

Trainer Mike Pender, who started the horse “Asian Eyes” in the fifth race at Hollywood Park Race Track on May 6, 2007, having entered into a stipulated settlement agreement with the California Horse Racing Board, is fined THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00)\* pursuant to California Horse Racing Board, Rule #1887 (Trainer to Insure Condition of Horse) for violation of California Horse Racing Board, Rule #1843 (a) & (d) (Medication, Drugs and Other Substances – Clenbuterol 11.5 ng –CLS III)

## **Ruling #24**

Based upon a report from the University of California, Davis Laboratories, an official testing laboratory for the California Horse Racing Board, that urine sample #HP01938, obtained from the horse "Asian Eyes", the second place finisher in the fifth race at Hollywood Park on May 6, 2007, contained the drug Clenbuterol (Class III) in excess of the permitted level (11.5 ng), it is ordered that "Asian Eyes" be disqualified from all purse monies earned in said race, in accordance with California Horse Racing Board rule #1859.5 (Disqualification Upon Positive Test Finding).

It is further ordered that the purse money earned in said race (\$4,600.00) be returned by owner Coto Thoroughbreds to the Paymaster of Purses at Hollywood Park for redistribution in accordance with the revised order of finish.

All records are ordered changed to reflect this ruling. In accordance with California Horse Racing Board Rule # 1956 (Race Declared Official), neither the pari-mutuel payoff nor the distribution of any pari-mutuel pool shall be affected.

## **4 PRINE HEARING**

The stewards met informally with exercise rider CODY PRINE concerning case number 07HP10. This case involved alleged cocaine possession and violation of CHRB Rules 1489(H) and 1890. Mr. Prine has had a history of problems with drinking and marijuana; this is first incident involving cocaine. A criminal proceeding is pending. Accompanying him were Winner's Foundation Executive Director Bob Fletcher and Mr. Prine's employer, trainer Neil Drysdale. Both men were highly supportive of Mr. Prine, his commitment to recovery and his ability as an employee. The stewards required that Mr. Prine submit to a drug test today and decided to take more time to discuss appropriate action.

## **5 JOCKEY FILM REVIEW**

The weekly film review was sparsely attended due in part to the refreshing reversal of riding infractions this past week and a half. Three riders attended and all were in agreement with the reviewed races.

## **6 INQUIRY/NO CHANGE**

Following the running of the first race, the stewards posted the inquiry sign to examine an incident at the sixteenth pole on the turf course. Films showed that the winner #6 Courtnall drifts in slightly causing the two horses to his inside, second place finisher #5 Seeking Answers and fourth place finisher #3 Faulkwood Shores, to made contact. #6 Courtnall is approximately one length in front of his two rivals at the time. Second place finisher #5 Seeking Answers is beaten a nose for the win and fourth place finisher #3 Faulkwood Shores, is beaten a head for third. After speaking with the patrol judges and

riders involved and a lengthy review of the films, it was the stewards' opinion that the winner came over only slightly and always maintained a path, albeit a narrow one, for the horse to his inside. Additionally, neither jockey to his inside had to steady or stop riding their respective mounts. Therefore, the stewards voted unanimously to make no change to the order of finish.

**1 FILM REVIEW**

Jockey RICHARD MIGLIORE met with the stewards to review his ride in the second race yesterday in which he allows his mount to drift out turning for home, herding out the horse to his outside. Although there was no actual contact between the rivals, the stewards made it clear that this type of riding would not be condoned. Mr. Migliore agreed that it would not happen again.

Jockey DAVID FLORES met with the stewards to discuss his ride in the first race yesterday that was the subject of an inquiry referenced on the preceding day. Although Mr. Flores' mount does drift in slightly, it is a matter of inches, and the stewards commended Mr. Flores for his ability to correct his mount's path so quickly.

## **2 NETTLES RULING**

Trainer KENNETH NETTLES spoke with the stewards on the telephone to discuss the late scratch of his horse from yesterday's last race for failing to receive lasix. Mr. Nettles explained that it was a miscommunication with his veterinarian and took full responsibility. He was fined in the following ruling:

### **Ruling #26**

Trainer Kenneth Nettles, is hereby fined three hundred dollars (\$300.00)\* pursuant to California Horse Racing Board Rule #1629 (Penalty for Late Declaration), for failing to treat "Baby's Got Heart", with bleeder medication necessitating the late declaration from the eighth race on Thursday August 2, 2007, at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club.

## **3 LUND RULING**

Owner MICHAEL LUND was suspended in the following ruling for failing to appear to answer the complaint embodied in case number 07DM007 alleging violation of CHRB Rule 1876 (Financial Responsibility). The alleged debt was \$206.50 to complainant Dr. Melinda Blue, DVM.

### **Ruling #25**

Owner Michael Lund having failed to appear before the Board of Stewards to answer a complaint alleging violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule #1876 (Financial Responsibility), is suspended for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule #1547 (Failure to Appear). During the term of suspension, all license and license privileges of Michael Lund are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards to Suspend or fine) subject is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

## **4 OBJECTION/NO CHANGE**

Following the running of the third race, jockey Michael Baze aboard fourth place finisher #1 Marqz Melody claimed foul against first place finisher #6 Forest Miss (jockey Joseph Talamo) and third place finisher #4 Toppers Moment (jockey Victor Espinosa) for alleged interference near the quarter pole. Mr. Baze's mount finds herself in tight quarters between the aforementioned rivals. After speaking with the patrol judges and riders involved, it was the stewards' opinion that Mr. Baze was attempting to guide his horse into a space that provided insufficient room for his mount. Also, while it appears that Mr. Espinoza's mount may drift out slightly, Mr. Baze had made a poor decision to drive his horse between the other horses while negotiating the final stages of the turn. Therefore, no change was required.

**1      FILM REVIEW**

Jockeys VICTOR ESPINOZA, MICHAEL BAZE, JOE TALAMO, and COREY NAKATANI met with the stewards together to discuss the incident in the third race yesterday. There were varied opinions with respect to what happened, but it was the stewards’ opinion that each rider played a role in the difficulty and that therefore suspension days would not be appropriate for any individual. All were cautioned, however, that they need to take care of each other on the track. They agreed.

**2      TALAMO RULING**

Jockey JOE TALAMO met with stewards before the film review to discuss case number 07HP108 which involved a complaint filed by the Official Veterinarian alleging violation of CHRB Rule 1688 (Use of Whips). Photographs included in the complaint showed a horse ridden by Mr. Talamo at

Hollywood that had been cut on the flank, presumably by the whip. Mr. Talamo took responsibility and pledged to do a better job in the future. This was his first violation of this type in California.

### **Ruling #28**

Jockey Joseph Talamo is fined three hundred dollars (\$300.00)\* for violation California Horse Racing Board Rule # 1688 (b) (Use of Whips) on July 13, 2007, at Hollywood Park.

### **3 HINES HEARING AND RULING**

Trainer NICK HINES met with the stewards to discuss case number 07HP109 which involved a complaint filed by the Official Veterinarian for a horse that was late to the receiving barn. Although Mr. Hines offered a spirited defense, the stewards felt that the behavior represented a violation nonetheless and he accepted the following ruling graciously:

### **Ruling #27**

Trainer Nick Hines is fined one hundred dollars (\$100.00)\* for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rules #1852 (Reporting to the Receiving Barn - Late) and #1894 (Duties of a Trainer) on July 14, 2007, at Hollywood Park.

**1 FILM REVIEW**

Jockey AMIR CEDENO met with the stewards this morning to discuss his ride in the last race yesterday. His horse ducked out sharply leaving the gate and although he made an effort to correct him, it was the stewards’ opinion that the effort could have been a stride earlier. Mr. Cedeno agreed.

**2 PRINE RULING**

Exercise rider CODY PRINE was suspended ninety days for possession of cocaine on the backside of Hollywood Park after discussion of case number 07HP10 described previously. Outlined in the following ruling were additional restrictions to his license:

**Ruling #29**

Exercise Rider Cody Prine is suspended for a period of ninety (90) days (August 7, 2007 – November 4, 2007) for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule# 1489 (H) (Grounds For Denial or Refusal of License) and Rule #1890 (Possession of Contraband).

As conditions of reinstatement, Mr. Prine must participate in a fitness for license hearing; must sign a testing agreement with the California Horse Racing Board; must be evaluated and comply with guidelines set forth by the Winner’s Foundation; and Mr. Prine’s license will be considered probationary for its term. During the term of suspension, all license and license privileges of Cody Prine are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board Rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards to Suspend or Fine) subject is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

**3 LOBO RULING, DISQUALIFICATION AND PURSE REDISTRIBUTION**

The stewards held a formal hearing to approve a stipulated agreement and disqualify the appropriate horse with respect to case number 07HP0021. This case involved a clenbuterol overage (Class III) discovered in the post race urine sample of “Right Special” who won the third race at Hollywood on April 26, 2007. Neither Mr. Lobo nor his owner appeared at the hearing, but his attorney, Steve Schwartz, had contacted the stewards yesterday, waiving the appearance and dropping off a check for

the fine. The stewards went on the record, approved the agreement, disqualified the horse and then issued the following two rulings:

**Ruling #30**

Trainer Paulo Lobo, who started the horse “Right Special (Brz)” in the third race at Hollywood Park Race Track on April 26, 2007, having entered into a stipulated settlement agreement with the California Horse Racing Board, is fined THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00)\* pursuant to California Horse Racing Board, Rule #1887 (Trainer to Insure Condition of Horse) for violation of California Horse Racing Board, Rule #1843 (a) & (d) (Medication, Drugs and Other Substances – Clenbuterol –CLS III)

**Ruling #31**

Based upon a report from the University of California, Davis Laboratories, an official testing laboratory for the California Horse Racing Board, that urine sample #HP01769, obtained from the horse “Right Special (Brz)”, the first place finisher in the third race at Hollywood Park on April 26, 2007, contained the drug Clenbuterol (Class III) in excess of the permitted level, it is ordered that “Right Special (Brz)” be disqualified from all purse monies earned in said race, in accordance with California Horse Racing Board rule #1859.5 (Disqualification Upon Positive Test Finding).

It is further ordered that the purse money earned in said race (\$36,000.00) be returned by owner Eternamente Rio Stud to the Paymaster of Purses at Hollywood Park for redistribution in accordance with the revised order of finish.

**4 INQUIRY/NO CHANGE**

Following the running of the ninth and final race, the stewards posted the inquiry sign to examine an incident shortly after the start in which #1 Scottish Diamond ducked in sharply and made contact with the rail. Films revealed that he was the cause of this irregular action and that no other horses were involved. Therefore, no change was required.

**1      FISHER RULING**
