Report of the Board of Stewards for the week of Wednesday, August 20, 2008 through Monday, August 25, 2008. Randy Winick will record the minutes during this reporting period.

WEDNESDAY

8/20/08

1 SCRATCHES

Scratches for Thursday were completed at 10:00 a.m.

2 DOUBLE DRAW

Entries will be drawn today for Saturday and Sunday racing. Saturday will feature the Del Mar Handicap, \$250,000 Grade II and Sunday will showcase The Pacific Classic, \$1,000,000 Grade I. In addition, Sunday's card will present three other graded stakes, The Rancho Bernardo, \$3000,000 Grade III, The Pat O'Brien, \$3000,000 Grade II, and The Del Mar Mile, \$4000,000 Grade II.

3 CAL-BRED REPORT

Today's card will feature two Cal-Bred events. The first and fourth races are split divisions of a \$40,000 maiden claiming contest at six furlongs for two-year old fillies. Both races were drawn with eight participants.

4 JOAN HEMMING COMPLAINT (CASE # 08DM0004)

A formal hearing was held before the Board of Stewards to hear a complaint against owner Joan Hemming for financial indebtedness to trainer Thomas Bell II in the amount of \$30,175.00 for training services. Present at the hearing in addition to the Stewards were plaintiff Thomas Bell II and court reporter Barbara Weinstein. The respondent, owner Joan Hemming, did not appear as requested nor was her legal counsel present to represent her. It should be noted that this proceeding was continued once and the Board of Stewards elected not to give an additional postponement as her attorney requested due to there being insufficient reason to do so. The Board of Stewards issued a default judgment in favor of trainer Bell and that owner Joan Hemming is given seven days to provide payment or have her license suspended. A ruling will be forthcoming.

5 STABLE AREA VIOLATIONS

Rulings #63 through #86 involved routine stable area violations incurred here at Del Mar.

6 STEWARDS INQUIRY – ACCIDENT – SIXTH RACE – NO CHANGE

After the finish of the sixth race (six furlongs – main track) the Stewards posted the inquiry sign to review an accident just ten strides out of the starting gate. The replays show # 3 Bella Dancer (Garrett Gomez) ducking sharply inward and out from under Jockey Gomez, causing him to fall to the track surface. Garrett was immediately attended to by the track EMT'S and returned to the first aid room for examination. The loose horse was not a factor in the running of the race and returned uninjured. The Stewards posted the official sign after a thorough review and were told by first aid that jockey Gomez was cleared to ride his remaining mounts. An accident report will be attached.

1 SCRATCHES AND ENTRIES

Friday’s scratches were completed at 10:00 a.m. and eight races were drawn for Monday’s program.

2 CAL-BRED REPORT

Today’s racing will include two races restricted to California bred horses. The third race on the card is for maiden fillies and mares, three years old and up, claiming price \$40,000 going six furlongs with a field of ten. The eighth event of the afternoon will contest a full field of twelve two-year old maidens for a claiming price of \$40,000 to be run at six furlongs.

3 MAG PEREZ COMPLAINT (CASE # 08DM011)

A financial agreement was reached in this matter through negotiations with the Stewards. Trainer Mag Perez, who represented himself telephonically, and pony rider Julie Schifsky who was present in the Stewards’ office, agreed to a schedule of four (4) payments due each month of \$200.00 for three months and a final payment of \$110.00 the last month, starting on September 1, 2008, for a total of \$710.00 for services rendered.

4 ROLANDO HEVIA RULING

Jockey Agent Rolando Hevia is restored to good standing as set forth in the following ruling.

DMTD Ruling #87

Case #08SA020 having been withdrawn by Los Angeles Turf Club, Jockey Agent ROLANDO HEVIA is restored to good standing. Ruling # HRT116, issued at Hollywood Park Racing Association on July 6, 2008, is set aside.

5 JOAN HEMMING RULING (REFER - #4 -8/20/08)

This ruling was agreed upon after due deliberation of yesterday’s formal hearing.

DMTD Ruling #88

In the matter of case #08DM004, filed against Owner JOAN HEMMING by trainer Thomas Bell II: Subject having failed to appear, a default judgment in the amount of \$30,175.00 is awarded to trainer Thomas Bell II. The entire amount shall be due by September 1, 2008. MS. HEMMING'S license shall be subject to suspension should the terms of this ruling not be met.

6 RAFAEL BEJARANO FILM REVIEW

Jockey Rafael Bejarano was in at the Stewards' request to review film of yesterday's seventh race in which his mount drifted over through the stretch. Rafael said that he thought he was clear of the horses behind him. The Stewards told Mr. Bejarano that he must be aware of his position at all times and to take nothing for granted. Rafael said that he would make a better effort in future races.

1 SCRATCHES

The scratches for Saturday were completed at 10:00 a.m.

2 CAL – BRED REPORT

There were no California Bred races contested on Friday's program.

3 TYLER BAZE FILM REVIEW

Jockey Tyler Baze was in to review Thursday's third race where his mount was running a little erratically through the stretch. Mr. Baze told the Stewards that his mount was pretty green and had his hands full. The Stewards allowed this as somewhat plausible but reminded Tyler that he must maintain a straight course to the best of his ability. Jockey Baze was cooperative and agreed.

4 STABLE AREA VIOLATIONS

Rulings #89 through #103 involved routine stable area violations incurred here at Del Mar.

5 RACING PROGRAM /LATE JOCKEY CHANGE - PADDOCK INCIDENT FIRST RACE

There was a late replacement for Jockey Matt Garcia (Joy Scott) in Friday's first race on # 4 Jacob's Mark due to the San Diego Sheriff's Department carrying out a warrant for the arrest of Mr. Garcia at the request of the Monrovia Police Department. It was understood by the Stewards that this action would take place in a more discreet manner post race, coordinated through the CHRB investigators and San Diego Sheriff's Department, however, through an apparent miscommunication the process was carried out in the paddock as the riders were about to be mounted in the walking ring. This incident accounted for an approximate twelve-minute delay of post time for the first race.

6 STEWARDS' INQUIRY – 2ND RACE – NO CHANGE

Following the running of the second race, (1 3/8 miles turf – Handicap) the Stewards called for an inquiry into an incident approaching the 3/16 pole. A review of this race involved the first five finishers. The tape shows first place finisher #2 Marzelline (Tyler Baze) apparently coming in on fifth place finisher #4 Hopehopehope (Joseph Talamo) causing him to steady and check, while second place finisher #1 High Heel Sneakers (Victor Espinoza) came off the inside rail slightly causing the space that third place finisher #3 Green Lyons (David Flores) was trying to come through to narrow, forcing #4 to come over on the heels of #2, while also switching leads, in effect making #2 somewhat less culpable in this matter. In the stewards' opinion there were several factors involved here, not just #2 causing the crowding, including Jockey Flores going for a hole he probably shouldn't have. In the final analysis the Stewards thought this complicated event did not affect the outcome of the original order of finish. In a unanimous decision, the Stewards declared the race official.

1 SCRATCHES

Sunday's scratches were taken at 10:00 a.m. sharp.

2 CAL – BRED REPORT

California Bred racing will be featured in the fourth and ninth events today. The fourth is a six furlong maiden allowance two year old filly contest while the ninth is also at six furlongs for older filly and mare maidens.

3 JOCKEY'S FILM REVIEW

Jockey Victor Espinoza appeared as requested to review film of yesterday's second race where his mount was involved in a Stewards inquiry. Victor's horse was on the inside turning for home and appeared to drift out slightly and narrow the space another horse was trying to come through. Mr. Espinoza said his horse was getting out somewhat during most of the race and did his best to keep him

straight. The Stewards thought this action did not alter the outcome of the race but told him to be aware of his mounts drifting at all times and to make the appropriate adjustments.

Jockey David Flores was in to review the second race from the previous day where his mount was also involved in the aforementioned inquiry. David's horse was running fourth at the time of the incident and tried to go for an opening that closed sooner than he could get to it. It appeared to the Stewards that this contributed to the chain of events that prompted the inquiry. Jockey Flores stated that he knew he couldn't fit through there so he backed off, to which the stewards agreed and held him without fault in the complex event.

4 J.C. GREEN RULING

The following ruling is issued to trainer Jenny Green for failure to register her horse "Platinum Stiletto"(4th race- 8/20/08) as a bleeder at the time of entry. Ms. Green acknowledged her responsibility in this matter, however she said that she was unaware of having to register a horse on the bleeder list that raced out of state on bleeder medication. The Stewards advised her that ignorance of the rules is no excuse.

DMTD Ruling # 104

Trainer J.C. GREEN is fined Three Hundred Dollars (\$300)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1845 (a) (Bleeder Medication) at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on August 20, 2008.

5 BREAKDOWN – SIXTH RACE

In the sixth race as the field was passing the 1/16 pole #10 World Asunder (Corey Nakatani) went wrong while racing in the clear at the back of the field. Corey was trying to pull the injured horse up as best he could when he apparently lost his balance and fell to the track surface. Mr. Nakatani got to his feet rather quickly and returned to the Jockey's quarters on his own power and was able to ride his remaining mounts for the afternoon. The injured horse was removed by the horse ambulance and was later euthanized due to a possible left front suspensory injury.

1 SCRATCHES AND DOUBLE DRAW

Scratches for Monday were completed at 10:00 a.m. promptly. Today is also double entry day for Wednesday and Thursday.

2 CAL – BRED REPORT

Today's racing was contested without a California Bred event.

3 FILM REVIEW

Today's film review involved apprentice jockey Pedro Arambula and jockey Jose Campos coming out of the starting gate in Saturday's third race. Jose mount was outside in the #12 post and came inward, while Pedro's horse broke from the #8 position and drifted outward. Both riders were cautioned to make a better effort to correct their mounts direction as they leave the starting gate in future races or a penalty may ensue.

4 DEL MAR RACE TRACK COMPLAINT – CASE #08DM014

An informal hearing was held on a complaint filed against Del Mar Race Track for the omission of information on the racing program of a first time gelding in the eighth race on August 9th 2008. In attendance were the Board of Stewards, Assistant Steward Luis Jauregui, Del Mar Executive Vice President Craig R. Fravel and Vice President Racing / Racing Secretary Thomas Robbins.

The proceedings involved identifying the parties responsible for transmitting the information to the program and how it was missed as a “first time gelding”, although it was listed as a gelding. Mr. Fravel responded that although every effort is made to insure complete accuracy, sometimes there is either human or computer programming error. It was in essence an office mistake. With all this being said however, Mr. Fravel pointed out that there is no specific rule requiring the reporting of first time gelding’s by the racing office for the official program. The Stewards’ pondered this and couldn’t disagree, but in fairness thought they should be responsible for this mistake. The Stewards’ will deliberate on this and have a decision forthcoming.

5 PACIFIC CLASSIC DAY RACING

Today’s racing program featured the 18th running of the \$1,000,000 Grade I Pacific Classic, which was won in thrilling fashion by the post time favorite “Go Between”, trained by Bill Mott for owner Peter Vegso and ridden by Garrett Gomez. The under card consisted of three other graded stakes which were the Grade III \$200,000 Rancho Bernardo, won by “Dearest Trickski” for trainer John Sadler and owner Tom Mankiewicz, ridden by Mike Smith, the Grade II \$3000,000 Pat O’Brien, won by “Lewis Michael” for trainer Wayne Catalano and owner Frank Calabrese, ridden by Rene Douglas and the Grade II \$4000,000 Del Mar Mile won by “Whatsthescript” for trainer John Sadler and owner Tommy Town Thoroughbreds, ridden by Garrett Gomez.

6 INQUIRY – 8TH RACE – NO CHANGE

Following the running of the eighth race, the “Pat O’Brien Handicap”, the Stewards lit the inquiry sign to review an incident involving some bumping down the stretch between the first place finisher #4 Lewis Michael (R. Douglas) and third place finisher #6 Barbecue Eddie (Aaron Gryder). In the opinion of the Stewards, #6 initiated the contact at the head of the stretch with # 4 and later at the furlong marker #4 came back in slightly on #6, causing him some inconvenience and jockey Gryder to take up a little more dramatically than necessary. After a thorough review of the taped replay and conferring with the patrol judges and jockeys involved, the Stewards ruled unanimously that there should be no change.

7 OBJECTION – 9TH RACE – NO CHANGE

Upon completion of the ninth race, the “ Del Mar Mile”, the Stewards were informed by the “quick official” that the rider of third place finisher #6 Global Hunter (J. Valdivia Jr.) requested an objection involving the stretch run of this race for interference by both the first place finisher #4 Whatsthescript (G.Gomez) and second place finisher #5 Bold Chieftain (R.Baze). The taped replays show that while #4 did come in slightly and influence #6 to shift in a bit, it was determined that #4 was not a factor in his placing and that although # 5 did come out somewhat, it was actually #6 tipping him that caused most of his problem. In summary, after reviewing all angles of the film and talking to the patrol judges and riders involved, the Stewards unanimously thought that there should be no change to the original order of finish.

1 ENTRIES AND SCRATCHES

Eight races will comprise the card for the final Friday twilight racing program of the Del Mar meeting. The scratches for Wednesday’s program were completed at 10:00 a.m.

2 CAL – BRED REPORT

Today’s racing will contest two races for California bred runners. The fifth race is a maiden \$40,000 claimer for three year olds and up at six furlongs and the seventh race will feature fillies and mares which have never won a race other than maiden, claiming or starter, or which have never won two races or claiming price \$25,000, to be run at a distance of six and one half furlongs.

3 JOCKEY'S FILM REVIEW FILM REVIEW

Jockey Tyler Baze was in to review the second race from Friday where there was a Stewards' inquiry involving four horses, which he was a party. Mr. Baze mount was the winner and racing on the outside of a four horse spread turning for home, when there was some tightening to his inside causing a horse to take up. After a review of this film with Tyler, the Stewards thought he did a pretty good job of maintaining his direction and lane around the turn and was not the main factor in this somewhat complex entanglement . The Stewards just reminded him to be aware of his position at all times.

Jockey Joel Rosario came in to review yesterday's fifth race where his horse broke sharply to the outside and compromised the two horses to his right. It was determined that his mount was the cause of his own problem and that Joel was held mostly blameless, but cautioned to make the best effort possible to keep his horses straight out of the starting gate.

4 NOR RULING

This ruling was issued after owner Joanne Nor reached an agreement with San Luis Rey Equine Hospital for payment of services rendered.

DMTD Ruling #105

Case #07HP130 having been withdrawn by San Luis Rey Equine Hospital, owner JOANNE NOR is restored to good standing. Ruling #24, issued at Los Angeles Turf Club on January 14, 2008, is set aside.

5 DORITY RULING

This ruling was issued after Don Shields, DVM Inc. informed the Stewards that Mr. Scott Dority has failed to comply with the terms of a signed financial agreement.

DMTD Ruling # 106

Owner SCOTT DORITY, having failed to comply with the terms of a signed financial agreement with Don Shields, DVM Inc. (\$5,088.87), is suspended for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule 1876 (Financial Responsibility).

JOCKEY/DRIVER ACCIDENT REPORT

Business and Professions Code Section 19481.3(e) provides that the Stewards shall investigate and prepare a report Regarding all on-track accidents involving jockeys that occur during the performance of their duties.
