Report of the Board of Stewards for the week of Wednesday August 5, 2009 through Sunday August 9, 2009.

TUESDAY
AUGUST 4, 2009

Steward Tom Ward will be supervising entries and scratches this week.

1 TRAINER ROBERT ALLEN

Trainer Robert Allen arrived from Pomona with six friends and witnesses in response to Complaint # 09DM005. His horse, Tamale Pie, had been late to the receiving barn at Hollywood Park. Mr. Allen had hired a groom to paddock his horse, the groom had failed to show, and he needed to 'scramble' in order to find a replacement. Since Mr. Allen did not have any previous violations, the need for his witnesses to participate was not necessary, a warning was issued and Mr. Allen appeared to feel that his frustrations had been 'heard.'

WEDNESDAY
AUGUST 5, 2009

1 JOCKEY DEAN MERNAGH

Irish jockey Dean Mernagh appeared before the stewards this morning applying for his California license. He plans to ride in two stake races in the next couple of weeks for Kentucky trainer Mike Leahy. Mr. Mernagh, who has ridden in England for ten years, is currently licensed in Kentucky, Virginia, Ohio, and Illinois. Mr. Mernagh did volunteer that he had served a ten month suspension in England, which was satisfied in 2008. His violation was for 'sharing inside information' with Bet Fair. Mr. Mernagh discussed his issue at length with the stewards, and will furnish the documentation that was provided to John Veitch in Kentucky verifying his return to good standing.

2 DEL MAR INTERNS

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club is hosting five student interns during this meet. The three American students are from University of Arizona, USC and UCLA. Two students are from the University of Limerick, in Ireland. They will be observing hearings and the running of the races with the stewards at given times this meet.

3 JOCKEY JOY SCOTT – RULING # 14

Joy Scott appeared this morning to review the 10th race from Sunday, August 2nd. The stewards posted the inquiry sign following the running of the race; however, it was the unanimous decision of the stewards that the infraction did not alter the original order of finish. During the review of the race, the stewards took the position that Scott's mount did drop in leaving the ¼ pole causing Felipe Valdez to take his mount up sharply and break stride. Mr. Scott was informed that the following ruling would be issued today:

RULING #14

Jockey Joy Scott, who rode “Ol’ dogtown” in the tenth race at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on August 2, 2009, is suspended for three (3) racing days(August 12, 13, and 14, 2009) for altering course without sufficient clearance, causing interference in the far turn. This constitutes a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (Riding Rules-careless riding). The term of suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races.

4 JOCKEY JOSE VICTOR ESPINOZA – RULING # 15

Official Veterinarian Jill Bailey filed a complaint against Jockey Espinoza when his mount “North Rodeo” had a cut on his right flank after the running of the fourth race on July 24th. Mr. Espinoza stated that the cut was accidental, and that he has tried to be very cautious while whipping his mounts. He has changed to the new cushion-designed whips and believes that they will be kinder to the horses. Mr. Espinoza has not had a similar violation since 2007, and the following ruling was issued:

RULING #15

Jockey Victor Espinoza is fined THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1688(Use of Whips-causing welts or breaks in the skin) during the running of the fourth race on July 24, 2009, at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club

5 TRAINER ROGER STEIN

Julie Schifsky, Assistant Trainer to Roger Stein, appeared on his behalf this morning in response to a complaint that “Gassy Jack” had been late to the Receiving Barn on Thursday, July 23rd. Ms Schifsky admitted that her crew was late, and assured the stewards that it would not happen again. Since there have not been any previous violations from the Mr. Stein's barn, a warning was issued.

6 TRAINER SUZANNE RODRIGUEZ

Suzanne Rodriguez, who is training her horses at Santa Anita, accepted a telephonic discussion regarding the complaint filed against her. Her horse, Heavenly N' Free was late to the receiving Barn at Hollywood Park on July 19th. Ms Rodriguez did not have any previous violations and was warned.

7 VETERINARIAN JEFFREY BLEA - RULING # 16

During a phone conversation with Veterinarian Blea, he verified and accepted responsibility for giving a pre-race lasix injection to a horse that was not on the registered Bleeders List. The horse was scratched.

RULING # 16

Veterinarian Jeffrey Blea is fined THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1845(Authorized Bleeder Medication – treated horse not on approved list.

8 ASSISTANT TRAINER JOHN MEAIRS – RULING # 17

Beginning in April of 2009, John Meairs was suspended for a financial complaint, NSF checks and Failure to Appear. He was reinstated in June when he made an agreement with Hollywood Park to pay \$200 per month toward an outstanding debt of \$6,150. Mr. Meairs has failed to make any of the agreed upon payments and the following ruling was issued:

RULING #17

Owner/assistant trainer JOHN M. MEAIRS, having failed to comply with the provisions of a financial agreement with Hollywood Park, is suspended for violation of California Horse Racing Board rules 1876 (Financial Responsibility) and 1877 (Checks).

During the term of suspension, all licenses and license privileges of John M. Meairs are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule 1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards to Suspend or Fine), Mr. Meairs is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

9 EIGHTH RACE – JOCKEY OBJECTION – NO CHANGE

Following the running of the eighth race, Jockey Corey Nakatani (4th, #8 Gangbuster) lodged a claim of foul against Jockey Alonso Quinonez (1st, #9 Unusual Suspect) for interference going into the 3/8 turn. The tapes did verify that Nakatani's mount did steady momentarily, but it was the unanimous decision of the stewards that there would be no change in the original order of finish. The eighth race was a one and one-half mile event. The minor incident occurred shortly after the start and did not affect the final outcome.

10 SEVENTH RACE – HORSE EASED

The seventh race was run at one mile on the turf. # 8- Andalacia (Jockey Joseph Talamo) was eased beginning at the 3/8. The ambulance was dispatched, but trainer, Patrick Gallagher walked the horse back to the barn. Dr. Grant will check the horse tomorrow.

 AUGUST 6, 2009

- 1 TRAINER GEORGE PAPAPRODROMOU FINANCIAL COMPLAINT:
 An outstanding financial complaint that had been filed by groom Ginove Morales was satisfied this morning when Mr. Papaprodromou paid the \$850 due in full.
- 2 RODRIGO NAVARRETE MATIAS FITNESS HEARING:
 Mr. Rodrigo Matias came to the office for a Fitness for License hearing this morning. Also present were: Winners Foundation’s Bob Fletcher and LeRoy Martinez, Jockey Guild Representative Darrell Haire, Safety Steward Luis Jauregui and CHRB Investigator Rick Amieva.
 A search of Mr. Matias’ tack room at Hollywood Park in April resulted in the finding of marijuana and paraphernalia. Mr. Matias and two others were cited for the violation. Mr. Matias, who suffers from rheumatoid arthritis and had a medical prescription for the use of marijuana for pain, also tested positively for cocaine.
 Prior to a formal hearing on the violations, Mr. Matias entered a 90-day, residential treatment program, was inaccessible for his scheduled hearing and was suspended for Failure to Appear. Mr. Matias hopes to eventually ride in Northern California. The stewards have requested that he have a physical evaluation from the track physician, and establish a program for continued recovery with Winners Foundation at Golden Gate Fields. This Board of Stewards will determine the sanction for Mr. Matias’ violation, but feel that the Northern California stewards might better establish his terms for relicensing.

3 JOCKEY JOEL ROSARIO – RULING #18

Jockey Joel Rosario acknowledged that he had cut the left flank of his horse “Million Dollar Run” in the 4th race on July 25th. Mr. Rosario said that he was still using the old style whip. Due to his recent series of similar violations, Mr. Rosario was informed of the escalating fine and cautioned that an additional violation could result in “days.”

RULING #18

Jockey Joel Rosario is fined ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1688(Use of Whips-causing welts or breaks in the skin) during the running of the fourth race at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on July 25, 2009.(third offense).

4 JOCKEY CHRISTIAN SANTIAGO REYES – RULING # 19

Jockey Christian Reyes admitted that he had cut his horse “Cape of Bradford” in the first race on July 23rd. This is Mr. Reyes’ second such violation at this meet, and his fine was escalated a notch. The following ruling was issued:

RULING # 19

Apprentice Jockey Christian Santiago Reyes is fined FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1688(Use of Whips-causing welts or breaks in the skin) during the running of the first race at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on July 23, 2009 (second offense).

5 JOCKEY REVIEW:

Jockey Alonso Quinonez reviewed the tapes of yesterday’s 8th race inquiry. The incident occurred early in the race, and the tapes verified that the incident was minor. Clearly, the incident did not alter the outcome of the race.

6 TRAINER DAVID HOFMANS

David Hofmans came to the office to discuss the complaint issued against him for having his horse “Naux Faux Pas” arrive late to the receiving barn. Mr. Hofmans has not had a previous violation and was warned.

7 OWNER JERRY JAMGOTCHIAN

Owner Jerry Jamgotchian met with the stewards to discuss “Whatever Whenever” running in the sixth race today, which he owns in partnership with Gerson Racing. In addition to the Board of Stewards, Safety Steward Luis Jauregui was present. Mr. Jamgotchian had several questions and items that he wanted to discuss: would Steward Fermin recuse herself from the sixth race, what were the details of the meeting with the stewards and Mr. Wygod on July 24th, a sentence by sentence discussion of the minutes describing that meeting, and finally a detailed discussion of the procedure for scratching a horse as late as in the paddock. Mr. Jamgotchian said that he was familiar with the memo that had been distributed yesterday by Executive Director Kirk Breed (attached), and asked Steward Fermin directly if she had a bias against him. Ms Fermin responded that she felt that she could view all races without bias and that as per the recent directive recusal was not an option.

Mr. Jamgotchian was aware that Steward Fermin would be in the paddock for the saddling of the horses for the sixth race, and that in the event that he would be initiating a late scratch he needed to notify her.

The horses for the sixth race were saddled without incident, and Mr. Jamgotchian did call the Steward's stand as the horses were loading into the gate to report that he would not request a scratch. "Whatever Whenever" (2-1) ran, finished eighth, and appeared to return in good form.

8 MEETING IN THE JOCKS ROOM:

DMTC's Joe Harper and Craig Fravel, Jockey Representative Darrell Haire, Official and Track Veterinarians Bailey and Grant, the Stewards and the Jockey's met prior to the running of the first race. Next Wednesday, August 12th, a house-rule will become effective requiring that all jockeys use the new cushion whip which is designed to be 'kinder' to horses. Darrell Haire reviewed the background for the new whips, and encouraged the riders to offer their input into the new rules that will be forthcoming.

10 EIGHTH RACE –INQUIRY – DISQUALIFICATION:

The inquiry sign was posted following the running of the eighth race in order to review the stretch run. Initially, the numbers of the first four finishers were flashed, but further analysis revealed that the winner was not the culprit and had actually been bothered also.

The tapes verified that #4 Gilligan (4th, Jockey Agapito Delgadillo) had come out causing a chain reaction of horses #10- Purse Luva (1st, Jockey Victor Espinoza), #9-Golden Boy Mark (5th, Jockey Michael Baze), #1- Senor Crafty (6th, Jockey Kyle Kaenel), #6-Catch My Tale (7th, Jockey Felipe Valdez) being bumped and jostled.

It was the unanimous decision of the stewards to disqualify #4-Gilligan from fourth to seventh position. Jockey Delgadillo will meet with the stewards tomorrow.

1 FILM REVIEW

Prior to Christian Santiago Reyes reviewing the fourth and fifth races with the Stewards, his agent Tony Matos met with the stewards also. The stewards are concerned that Mr. Reyes, an apprentice and recent addition to the Southern California colony, is resistant to taking suggestions or direction from veteran riders. Mr. Reyes has a five day suspension on appeal from this meet, as well as two whip violations. Mr. Matos will work with his rider.

In reviewing yesterday's races, Mr. Reyes was again cautioned to have proper clearance when altering his course.

Jockey Agapito Delgadillo viewed the tapes from yesterday's eighth race disqualification. The tapes substantiated that Delgadillo's mount continued to race straight through the stretch when first hit left handed, with the second contact the horse veered out, Delgadillo took an immediate hold, but the damage was done. The stewards were of the unanimous opinion that Delgadillo had reacted quickly to the horse's action, although the damage to the rest of the field was significant. Mr. Delgadillo was given a pass.

2 NINTH RACE – INQUIRY – NO CHANGE

The inquiry sign was posted after the ninth race in order to review an incident in the final 1/16th of the race. The tapes verified that # 10-Migillah (3rd, Jockey Victor Espinosa) steadied sharply, but the stewards felt that Espinoza may have over reacted to the situation and that the winner #6- Wicked Mischief (1st, Jockey Joel Rosario) had maintained a straight course. It was the unanimous decision of the stewards to make no change in the original order of finish.

1 EXERCISE RIDER JOSE CERVANTES BARBA RULING #20

Exercise Rider Barba had been arrested by the Riverside County Sheriff for possession of a controlled substance. He had pled guilty and sentenced by the courts to a diversion program. Mr. Barba did not appear for his scheduled hearing before the stewards, and the following ruling was issued:

RULING # 20

Exercise rider Jose Cervantes Barba, having failed to appear before the Board of Stewards to answer a complaint alleging violation of California Horse Racing Board rule#1489(h)(Grounds for Denial or Refusal of License), is suspended for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1547(Failure to Appear).

During the term of suspension, all licenses and license privileges of Jose Cervantes Barba are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards to Fine or suspend), Mr. Barba is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

2 TRAINER PETER MILLER RULINGS

Peter Miller was fined when he admitted that his horses had been late to the receiving barn on three occasions. He said that he is setting his stop watch at the 20 minute call now, and will be prompt in the future. Mr. Miller was sanctioned for his first offense here at Del Mar (he had received a warning at Hollywood Park). The stewards felt that he had not received proper notice to correct the two violations the following day. On the same visit, Mr. Miller explained

that he had also received parking tickets and a citation for not having his license validated. The following rulings were issued:

RULING # 21

Trainer Peter Miller is fined ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100)* for violation of California Horse Racing Board rules #1852(Reporting to Receiving Barn) and #1894(Duties of Trainer) with his horse Heathersdaddysbaby in the first race at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on July 31, 2009.

RULING # 22

Pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1530(Cases Not Covered by Rules and Regulations), trainer Peter Miller is fined FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50)* for violation of Del Mar parking regulations.

3 JOCKEY JOEL ROSARIO FILM REVIEW

Joel Rosario reviewed the eighth race and was cautioned that he must control his mounts. His mount #9 Necessary Evil angled out at the head of the stretch during the running of the eighth. Mr. Rosario did take a hold quickly, and he must use better judgment in the future.

4 TRAINER BEN CECIL

Trainer Ben Cecil participated in a telephonic hearing regarding his horse “Elletelle” which ran in the 4th race at Del Mar on July 25th being late to the receiving barn. A warning was issued.

5 JOCKEY CHRISTIAN SANTIAGO REYES RULING

The stewards received documentation that the Temporary Restraining Order that had been granted to Jockey Santiago Reyes regarding his recent five day suspension was dissolved by the Superior Court of San Diego yesterday. A revised ruling was issued:

RULING # 23

Apprentice jockey Christian Santiago Reyes, his temporary restraining order having been dissolved by the Superior Court of San Diego County on August 7, 2009, it is ordered that ruling #8 issued a Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on July 26, 2009 be re-imposed with the dates of suspension to be as follows: August 15,16,19,20 and 21, 2009. All other terms of the original ruling remain in effect.

1 RECEIVING BARN WARNINGS:

Trainers Cirilo Mr. Sierra, Ricardo Zamora, Jorge Gutierrez and John Shirreffs received warnings about getting their horses to the receiving barn on time.

2 JOCKEY REVIEW

Jockey Mike Smith reviewed yesterday's second race. His mount #4-Warren's Tony R drifted out at the head of the stretch making light contact with two outside horses. Mr. Smith said that he was "thinking for two jocks instead of thinking just for himself." He anticipated something that did not occur.

3 TRAINER STACY YOUNG FINANCIAL:

Trainer Young satisfied an outstanding financial complaint this morning filed by Fairplex Park for \$1,514.00

4 1ST RACE – JOCKEY OBJECTION – NO CHANGE

Jockey Garrett Gomez lodged an objection against jockey Christian Santiago Reyes for alleged interference around the 3/8 turn and into the head of the stretch. #3-Charlie and Chris (2nd, Jockey Reyes) did come out and make light contact with #6 Scofield Barracks (5th, Jockey Gomez). The stewards were of the unanimous opinion that the incident did not warrant a change in the original order of finish.

5 10TH RACE – ACCIDENT – INQUIRY – NO CHANGE:
 Shortly after the break of the 7 furlong, 10th race, # 3- Endless Moon (Jockey Alex Solis) went wrong and fell. #8- Captain Cash (Jockey Aaron Gryder) stumbled badly over the fallen horse, unseated his rider, and did not pull up until the 3/8 pole. Endless Moon was euthanized on the track, and Captain Cash was returned to his barn via horse ambulance. Both jockeys were examined in First Aid, evaluated by Dr. Agostino and released.
