**FILM REVIEW**

Jockeys **Kevin Krigger**, **Russell Baze** and **Alejandro Gomez** were summoned to the stewards' office to review their respective actions during the eighth race on Sunday, December 18. Baze and Gomez appeared in person while Krigger, who has moved his tack to southern California, was represented by jockey Aaron Gryder.

Baze and Krigger were issued warnings regarding the minor contact they made with rivals during the stretch drive. Gomez however, allowed his mount to drift out at the top of the stretch, and made solid contact with an outside competitor. That horse went on to out finish Gomez, despite the interference, which negated the need for a disqualification, but the stewards could not absolve him of culpability and issued the following ruling:

**No. 1** Jockey **ALEJANDRO GOMEZ**, who rode **STORM IN BLAIRSDEN** in the eighth race at Golden Gate Fields on Sunday, December 18, 2011, is suspended five (5) racing days (January 2, 6, 7, 8 And 12, 2012) for failure to make the proper effort to maintain a straight course in the stretch and causing interference; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (d) & (f) (Riding Rules – careless riding).

The term of this suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races in California.

12-26-11<sup>2</sup> **SYWAK CONFERENCE**

Trainer **ALEXANDER SYWAK** appeared with his wife, Ingrid, concerning the imposition of a 30-day suspension issued in ruling #46 dated December 18, 2011. The suspension begins December 29, 2011 and runs through January 27, 2012. The suspension was originally handed down on May 5, 2011 but was stayed during Sywak's appeal process. Sywak's suspension was recently upheld on appeal and the suspension days were reassigned by this Board of Stewards.

Sywak previously requested permission for his wife to run horses she currently owns during the term of his suspension which led to today's conference. Sywak understood that his wife would have to transfer the horses into the care of another trainer but sought leave to let the horses race since they are her sole and separate property.

The stewards researched Sywak's request and after conversations with Board counsel Robert Miller denied permission for Ingrid Sywak to run her horses. CHRB rule #1843.3 (i) and (j) (Penalties for Medication Violations) states that a suspended licensee shall not benefit financially by having a licensed family member race horses.

12-26-11<sup>3</sup> **APPRENTICE ARRIVES**

**ELISKA KUBINOVA**, an apprentice jockey who was originally licensed this summer in Washington and just arrived from Oregon, applied for a license this morning. While perusing her paperwork it was discovered that she does not possess an original copy of her apprentice certificate. Kubinova stated that she gave the original copy to the stewards at Portland Meadows

and she never got it back. A phone call to Portland Meadows revealed that the stewards saw her original certificate but gave it back to her. The result is that the original is lost.

This Board of Stewards contacted the Washington Horse Racing Commission and Assistant Executive Director Doug Moore stated he would re-issue an original certificate and overnight it to Golden Gate Fields.

12-28-11<sup>1</sup> **FINANCIAL RESOLVED** (Case #11GG232)

A complaint filed by Equine Sports Medicine against owner **David L. Ferguson** alleging violation of CHRB rule #1876 (Financial Responsibility) was heard this morning. The complaint alleged that \$1,198.00 was due for services rendered.

Ferguson took exception to being billed by the practice since his horse eventually died but realized that services were performed by Dr. Smith. After back and forth discussions with the stewards a mediated amount of \$876.25 was agreed upon by both parties and Ferguson wrote a check.

Another financial complaint filed by Equine Sports Medicine was scheduled for this morning but respondent **Cecil W. Mellinger** did not appear.

12-29-11<sup>2</sup> **RULING NO. 2 – MELLINGER** (Case #11GG233)

Owner **CECIL W. MELLINGER**, having failed to respond to written notice to appear before the Board of Stewards at Golden Gate Fields

on or before Wednesday, December 28, 2011, to answer charges alleging violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1876 (Financial Responsibility), is hereby suspended pending an appearance for a hearing before the Board of Stewards for violation of CHRB rule #1547 (Failure to Appear).

During the term of suspension, all licenses and license privileges of CECIL W. MELLINGER are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards), subject is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

The above ruling was released after Mellinger failed to show up at yesterday's hearing.

The complaint alleges he owes Equine Sports Medicine \$1,176.20 for services rendered.

12-29-11<sup>3</sup> **WRONG HORSE RAN**

Horse Identifier Patrick Kealy reported this morning that the wrong horse ran and placed second in the ninth race on Monday, December 26, 2011. The horse, WHO'S GOT MILK, was entered and scheduled to run but the horse BUBBLEGUM MIKE actually started in the race. Both horses are owned and trained by Ellen Jackson.

Kealy stated that when the runner appeared at the receiving barn prior to the race he examined and compared the horse to his I.D. card but made some assumptions which proved to be catastrophically wrong and led to BUBBLEGUM MIKE starting the race in place of WHO'S GOT MILK.

Following an investigation into the matter which involved Ellen Jackson it was determined that the two horses were switched at Jackson's ranch and the misidentification by Jackson has been going on for months. The real WHO'S GOT MILK is in a pasture at her ranch and is six months from a race. BUBBLEGUM MIKE has been training as WHO'S GOT MILK. Both horses are similar in appearance as neither has any white markings and both can be identified only through cowlicks and night eyes. WHO'S GOT MILK is three years old while BUBBLEGUM MIKE is a four year old.

Both Kealy and Jackson took responsibility for the mix up stating that proper due diligence and more attention to detail would have prevented the incident from escalating to where the wrong horse started in a race.

The stewards will take the matter under advisement and determine how to resolve all the various issues involved.

12-29-11<sup>4</sup> **FOG DELAYS**

Due to a stubborn fog bank hovering over San Francisco Bay first race post time was delayed 15 minutes and off time for the second race was another 25 minutes behind schedule as visibility ebbed and flowed. The fog eventually lifted and the card was completed with a reluctant sun peeking through the haze.

12-29-11<sup>5</sup> **STEWARDS' INQUIRY – Seventh Race – DISQUALIFICATION**

The stewards illuminated the inquiry sign to evaluate an incident at the top of the stretch involving #6 LIFE IS A ROCK (2<sup>nd</sup>, Russell Baze), #1 HOT CHACO (3<sup>rd</sup>, Frank Alvarado) and #7 RESTLESS YOUTH (7<sup>th</sup>, Juan Hernandez). The stewards observed HOT CHACO checking sharply near the 1/8. After a thorough review the stewards disqualified LIFE IS A ROCK from second and placed him third behind HOT CHACO.

Tapes showed that LIFE IS A ROCK drifted in and made contact with RESTLESS YOUTH who was forced in and subsequently crowded HOT CHACO causing that horse to check. The stewards disqualified LIFE IS A ROCK from second and placed him third behind HOT CHACO after the stewards determined the latter lost the opportunity at a better placing. Although RESTLESS YOUTH did suffer contact from LIFE IS A ROCK, the horse was losing ground at the time and no placings were affected.

12-30-11<sup>2</sup> **DISQUALIFICATION – Ruling No. 3** (Refer 12-29-11<sup>3</sup>)  
 Having determined that the horse **WHO'S GOT MILK** was ineligible to start in the ninth race at Golden Gate Fields on Monday, December 26, 2011 due to violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1588 (f) (Horse Ineligible to Start in a Race) in that the identification markings of the horse did not agree with the identification markings on the certificate of registration it is hereby ordered that WHO'S GOT MILK be disqualified from second place and unplaced pursuant to CHRB rule #1592 (Ineligible Horse to be Disqualified). The revised order of finish is as follows:  
 2<sup>nd</sup> - MUCHO PROBLEMA  
 3<sup>rd</sup> - BERT'S PAL  
 4<sup>th</sup> - GAMESMAN

5<sup>th</sup> - RIBBIT RACER  
6<sup>th</sup> - MR. GOODFELLOW  
7<sup>th</sup> - SLEW BLINK

All records are ordered changed to reflect this ruling. In accordance with CHRB rule #1956 (Race Declared Official) this ruling shall not affect the pari-mutuel payoffs.

It is further ordered that all purse money (\$1,640.00) earned by WHO'S GOT MILK by owner/trainer Ellen Jackson and jockey Barrington Harvey from the ninth race be returned to the Paymaster of Purses for redistribution pursuant to CHRB rule #1760 (Purse Award or Prize to be Withheld).

The above ruling was issued after yesterday's revelations concerning the mix-up and subsequent misidentification of two horses owned and trained by Ellen Jackson.

This ruling is the first step toward setting the record straight. Further actions which need to be taken include correcting the works attributed to WHO'S GOT MILK by putting them under the name of BUBBLEGUM MIKE. The past performance line in the Daily Racing Form for the ninth race on December 26, 2011 needs to be changed to show that BUBBLEGUM MIKE was the starter. Also, when BUBBLEGUM MIKE makes his next start both the form and the program must reflect that the horse previously raced under the name of WHO'S GOT MILK.

Both Ellen Jackson and Patrick Kealy have accepted responsibility for their actions leading up to the disqualification and realize penalties may be forthcoming. The stewards will take that portion of the incident under submission and give the matter due consideration.

12-30-11<sup>3</sup> **FILM REVIEW - RULING NO. 04**

Jockey **Russell Baze** was in to review yesterday's seventh race in which his mount was disqualified from second to third for interference in the stretch. Baze agreed that the horse deserved to be disqualified but explained he was doing everything he could to keep his horse from drifting in and bothering a rival. Baze stated he took a cross to switch his stick from his right hand to his left and while he was taking this action the horse drifted in and bumped a rival.

The stewards agreed with the assessment offered by Baze but did not agree that the act of switching sticks is an excuse that would relieve a jockey from the responsibility to keep his mount on a straight path. Had Baze corrected his mount's drift prior to switching his whip the interference could have been prevented. The following ruling was issued:

Jockey **RUSSELL BAZE**, who rode **LIFE IS A ROCK** in the seventh race at Golden Gate Fields on Thursday, December 29, 2011, is suspended three (3) racing days (January 6, 7 and 8, 2012) for failure to make the proper effort to maintain a straight course in the stretch and causing interference resulting in the disqualification of his mount from second to third; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (d) and (f) (Riding Rules – careless riding).

The term of this suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races in California.

12-30-11<sup>4</sup> **RULING NO. 05 – NARANJO** (Case #11GG191)

Groom **LUIS NARANJO**, having failed to respond to written notice to appear before the Board of Stewards at Golden Gate Fields on or before Thursday, December 29, 2011 to answer charges alleging violation of California Horse Racing Board rules #1489(a) (c) (f) (h) (Grounds for Denial or Refusal of License), #1900 (Grounds for Suspension or Revocation) and #1902 (Conduct Detrimental to Horse Racing), is hereby suspended pending an appearance for a hearing before the Board of Stewards for violation of CHRB rule #1547 (Failure to Appear).

During the term of suspension, all licenses and license privileges of LUIS NARANJO are suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards), subject is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

The above ruling was issued after Naranjo failed to appear to address the above referenced complaint. Subject is alleged to have falsified his license application with respect to his criminal history.

Horse Identifier **PATRICK A. KEALY** is suspended from his duties for seven days, January 12 through January 18, 2012, for misidentifying the horse WHO'S GOT MILK on Monday, December 26, 2011; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1554 (Duties of Horse Identifier).

The above ruling was issued following an informal hearing with the stewards. Kealy readily admitted he erred by not properly identifying the horse presented to him at the receiving barn on the day in question. He has already instituted procedures to prevent this type of error from occurring in the future.

01-02-12<sup>4</sup> **LATE DECLARATION – Fourth Race – REFUND**

#7 ROYALTY FORBIDDEN, trained by Greg James, broke through the front of the starting gate during the loading process and ran off. He eluded the first outrider but was captured by the second. The filly was scratched by the stewards and the refund was \$48,564.72.
