9/06/10¹

PRE-MEET DUTIES AND INSPECTION

Stewards RANDY WINICK and JON WHITE were present in the morning and early afternoon. Both met with Equine Manager KIM LLOYD and Racing Secretary TOM KNUST to address various issues regarding the upcoming meet. The Stewards also paid a visit to the Stewards' stand to begin the process for having the necessary equipment (TVs, telephones, etc.) in proper working order for opening day.

9/06/10² **DRAW FOR OPENING DAY**

Entries were drawn for the Thursday, Sept. 9, opening-day card. The card consists of 12 races (eight Thoroughbred races, one Mule race and one Arabian race). Race 6 opening day is a match race, billed as the "King of the Ring," featuring Fairplex Park's two all-time leading jockeys in victories, Martin Pedroza and David Flores. This match race has been heavily promoted by the track in an attempt to increase opening-day attendance and handle. It was not carded as part of the Pick Six. Win wagering is to be offered, plus it is included in Double, Pick Three and 50-cent Pick Four wagering. Derrick Do is also eligible. Racing Secretary TOM KNUST said having an also eligible for a match race had been done before in California, specifically citing when Patrick Valenzuela and Julie Krone rode against each other in a match race at Del Mar billed as the "Battle of the Sexes" in 2003. KNUST also noted that Vladimir Cerin, the trainer of Derrick Do, the also eligible for the "King of the Ring" match race, did want permission to work that horse between races opening day at Fairplex if the horse did not participate in the match race.

MATCH RACE CONCERNS

Stewards DARREL MCHARGUE and JON WHITE were present in the morning and early afternoon, with Steward RANDY WINICK in contact by telephone. The Stewards became concerned regarding the possible ramifications if one of the horses entered in the "King of the Ring" match race is scratched, with the also-eligible horse then competing in the race. The Stewards want to make every effort to have wagering on it as long as concerns regarding integrity and fairness to all bettors are addressed.

The Stewards proactively addressed a worst-case scenario in which the also-eligible horse did compete. Thus, in addition to discussing the matter with Racing Secretary TOM KNUST, the Stewards spoke with CHRB Executive Director KIRK BREED, Equine Manager KIM LLOYD and Mutuel Manager BILL NAVARRO, among others. KNUST said that even if one of the two horses scratched during the day of the match race, it would not affect that many bettors. This did not satisfy the Stewards in that it is impossible to know how many bettors would be affected and to what extent they would be affected. Once wagering had commenced, the Stewards believe it would be unfair to any bettor to mandate they have money on a different horse than the one they bet on. KNUST also said it this is a "jockey match race," with the emphasis on the jockeys, not the horses. While that is true, there still are bettors who would wager on the race based not primarily on the jockeys but rather on the horses.

MORE ON MATCH RACE

The Stewards were provided with a copy of the program page from the "Battle of the Sexes" match race at Del Mar in 2003. In the program, below the two horses scheduled to race and above the also-eligible horse was this notation: "The following horse will be substituted for either of the above entries should there be a scratch in the Battle of the Sexes Match Race." Racing Secretary TOM KNUST also will have this type of notation in the Fairplex program for the "King of the Ring" match race. The Stewards again spoke with Mutuel Manager BILL NAVARRO, who said that following a conference call with the State Auditor and Tote that they all had "serious concerns" if wagering on the match race continued if the also-eligible horse replaced a scratched horse after wagering had commenced at 9 a.m. Thus, the Stewards arrived at a unanimous decision as to how to proceed from a wagering standpoint should the also-eligible horse take the place of a scratched horse after

wagering for the day had commenced. In fairness to all bettors, Equine Manager KIM LLOYD and Racing Secretary TOM KNUST were advised that the match race then would become a “non-wagering” race and the two contestants would run “for purse only.”

OPENING DAY**THURSDAY**9/09/10¹**MICHAEL SAMRENA CONTINUANCE**

MICHAEL SAMRENA contacted the Stewards by phone and stated that a financial dispute hearing (involving trainer RAFAEL DELEON) was scheduled at Fairplex on Saturday, Sept. 11. SAMRENA ultimately was granted a continuance and was informed that his September 11 hearing on the matter would be rescheduled for Wednesday, September 22, at 10 a.m., at the Fairplex Park Stewards' office.

9/09/10²**ALEX GONZALEZ**

Del Mar Steward KIM SAWYER called the Fairplex Stewards to alert them that jockey ALEX GONZALEZ has not been given a doctor's clearance to ride until “as of Wednesday, September 22.”

9/09/10³**RIDER EXCUSED**

ALEJANDRO GARCIA was excused from his mount in the first race, BAR JF WHATMULE. A replacement rider was named.

9/09/10⁴**INQUIRY – FIRST RACE (MULE) - DISQUALIFICATION**

Following the running of the first race, the inquiry sign was posted for a review of an incident at the 1/16 pole involving #5 DASHN BOBI MCGEE (LUIS GODAY) and #6 ICEMAN (JAMES WOOTEN JR.). After reviewing the various recorded angles, hearing from the patrol judges and speaking to the riders involved, the Stewards, in a unanimous decision, disqualified #5 from second and placed her fifth (behind #6) for veering out sharply at the 1/16 pole, taking the path of and impeding #6, costing #6 the opportunity at a better placing.

9/09/10⁵**SUBSTANTIAL CLASS DROP MONITORED – FIFTH RACE**

Throughout the meet, the Stewards' policy will be to touch base with Track Veterinarian JILL BAILEY and/or State Veterinarian SID GUSTAFSON concerning horses taking a substantial drop in class, such as in this race, in which #1 MANHATTAN BEACH (trainer MIKE MITCHELL) was dropping to the \$8,000 level from a \$35,000 claiming race at Monmouth Park on July 18. Ultimately, on the advice of DR. BAILEY, MANHATTAN BEACH was a Vet scratch (sick).

9/09/10⁶**“KING OF THE RING” – SIXTH RACE (MATCH RACE)**

The “King of the Ring” match race turned out to be a good, clean race, won by #2 CAT BRANDO (DAVID FLORES) by one length over #1 DAVE'S RULER (MARTIN PEDROZA).

9/09/10⁷**INQUIRY – NINTH RACE – NO CHANGE - ACCIDENT**

SALVADOR INIGUEZ, the rider of #5 LAST CHANCE BOBBY, was unseated on the final turn of this 6 ½-furlong race. The Stewards posted the inquiry sign before the race was over. After reviewing the various recorded angles, hearing from the patrol judges and speaking to INIGUEZ, the Stewards, in a unanimous decision, concluded that no change to the order of finish was warranted in that #5 LAST CHANCE BOBBY clipped heels and stumbled while in heavy traffic and that no blame could be attributed to any of the other horses or riders. INIGUEZ said that his mount was “getting a little tired in the pack, shied away from the horse to the inside, clipped heels and took a couple of bad steps.” INIGUEZ said he then “lost his balance.” #5 LAST CHANCE BOBBY did not need to be vanned off. #8 WARREN’S MR. LUCKY, impeded when #5 LAST CHANCE BOBBY unseated his rider, was eased. INIGUEZ was transported to First Aid for evaluation. The Track Physician, DR. DAVE BROWN, released INIGUEZ to resume his remaining mounts.

FRIDAY9/10/10¹**VIDEOTAPE REVIEW**

Jockey LUIS GODOY was in, as requested by the Stewards, to review the videotape of Thursday's first race, in which his mount, DASHN BOBI MCGEE, was disqualified from second and placed fifth for causing interference. DASHN BOBI MCGEE, a Mule, ducked out sharply at the sixteenth pole while GODOY was using the whip left-handed. Once DASHN BOBI MCGEE ducked out, GODOY quickly switched to using the whip right-handed. The Stewards felt there was no careless behavior on GODOY's part and that no sanction was warranted.

9/10/10²**TSAGALAKIS HEARING (CASE #10DM003)**

A formal hearing was conducted for trainer MARK D. TSAGALAKIS in the above-referenced case for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1843 (a) & (d) (Medications, Drugs and Other Substances: Unapproved Substance – Methocarbamol [Class 4]). Present at this hearing were the respondent, trainer MARK D. TSAGALAKIS; BILL WESTERMANN, Supervising Special Investigator II, Hollywood Park & Santa Anita/So. Region; CSR Barbara Weinstein; and the Board of Stewards, DARREL MCHARGUE, RANDY WINICK and JON WHITE.

Steward WINICK began the hearing by reading MR. TSAGALAKIS his rights and asking if he was prepared to go forward, to which MR. TSAGALAKIS answered in the affirmative. MR. TSAGALAKIS, who has an exemplary record, took full responsibility and said that he was pleading guilty, admitting that he had simply "messed up," after which the following ruling was issued:

Trainer MARK D. TSAGALAKIS, who started the horse ROCK 'N RULE, first place finisher in the tenth race at Hollywood Park on July 10, 2010, is fined the sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00)* pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1887 (Trainer to Insure Condition of Horse) for violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1843 (a) & (d) (Medications, Drugs and Other Substances: Unapproved Substance – Methocarbamol [Class 4]).

9/10/10³**DR. CHITRAKAR HEARING**

DR. APRIL CHITRAKAR appeared before the Board of Stewards regarding a complaint filed by DR. JILL BAILEY for inaccurate confidential paperwork. DR. BAILEY also was present. DR. CHITRAKAR was advised that she was entitled to a formal hearing. DR. CHITRAKAR requested a formal hearing. The Board of Stewards advised DR. CHITRAKAR that she would be notified of a formal hearing.

9/10/10⁴**JOCKEYS' ROOM MEETING**

The Stewards conducted a meeting with the riders in the jockeys' room today. The Stewards spoke to the riders on a variety of matters, emphasizing safety above all. The riders were advised to remain alert and to try and fix a problem during a race rather than exacerbate a problem. The Stewards also discussed the paramedics situation and how a rider should proceed and follow their instructions until their examination is completed. Jockey DAVID FLORES, one of the most successful jockeys in Fairplex Park history, talked about how the younger riders can go to the veteran riders and that generally a veteran rider will try to help a younger rider. The Stewards told the riders we hope they have a good, safe meet, and that they should not hesitate to contact the Stewards if they have any issues or problems.

9/10/10⁵**JOCKEY JESUS VELAZQUEZ EXCUSED FROM REMAINING MOUNT**

After jockey JESUS VELAZQUEZ rode in the sixth race, Clerk of Scales RUBEN HERNANDEZ notified the Stewards that VELAZQUEZ felt "light headed and dizzy" and asked for permission not to ride #1 DA MARSHALL in the ninth race. VELAZQUEZ was instructed to see the Track Physician, DR. DAVE BROWN, who later reported to the Stewards that VELAZQUEZ was "a little dehydrated." DR. BROWN said he would examine VELAZQUEZ again Saturday before giving him the green light to resume riding. DANIEL SANDOVAL replaced VELAZQUEZ on #1 DA MARSHALL in the ninth race.

9/10/10⁶**OBJECTION – ELEVENTH RACE – NO CHANGE**

Jockey MATT GARCIA, the rider of #4 NIP OF GOLD, lodged an objection against #7 SEXY MELODY (ALONSO QUINONEZ) for alleged interference in the stretch. After reviewing the various recorded angles and hearing from the patrol judges, the Stewards, in a unanimous decision, concluded that no change to the order of finish was warranted when the videotape failed to substantiate any reason for the claim of foul.

9/11/10¹ **FINANCIAL COMPLAINT**

Trainer JAMES LLOYD contacted the Stewards regarding his financial complaint against Groom JOSE VALERA GARCIA. LLOYD said he has made contact with GARCIA and they have an agreement to resolve the issue.

9/11/10² **RIDER REPLACEMENT – FIRST RACE**

Jockey CHRISTIAN SANTIAGO REYES failed to arrive to fulfill his obligation to ride #3 PLAYA COCO in the first race and was replaced by KERWIN JOHN. SANTIAGO REYES did arrive in time to ride #5 YA LIEGO in the second race.

9/11/10³ **ATKINSON UNSEATED PRIOR TO FIRST RACE – ACCIDENT**

Shortly after the post parade for the first race, PAUL ATKINSON was unseated from #1 DIAMOND JOURNEY, who got loose and was a late scratch. DIAMOND JOURNEY propped and threw ATKINSON off. Later in the day, ATKINSON'S left wrist became a problem as a result of the incident prior to first race. After being examined by the Track Physician, DR. DAVE BROWN, ATKINSON was excused from his mounts in the eighth and twelfth races.

9/11/09⁴ **INQUIRY, OBJECTION - FIFTH RACE – DISQUALIFICATION**

Following the running of the fifth race, the inquiry sign was posted regarding an incident involving #3 BUBSY (JESUS VELAZQUEZ) and #6 LARSZILLA (PEDRO ARAMBULA) coming into the stretch as well as an incident approaching the finish involving #3 BUBSY, #6 LARSZILLA, #7 SELF DEFENSE (MARTIN PEDROZA) and #4 HALO'S LAW (CHRIS RUSSELL). Additionally, Jockey CHRIS RUSSELL lodged a claim of foul against #3 BUBSY for alleged interference approaching the finish.

After reviewing the various recorded angles, hearing from the patrol judges and speaking to the riders involved, the Stewards, in a unanimous decision, disqualified #3 from first and placed him second (behind #6) for drifting out several paths coming into the stretch, forcing #6 out to the middle of the track to lose considerable ground and thus costing #6 the opportunity at a better placing inasmuch as #6 was beaten a neck for first.

Regarding the incident approaching the finish, the Stewards, in a unanimous decision, ruled that the hole between horses had already closed by the time #4 HALO'S LAW tried to go through.

JOCKEY/DRIVER ACCIDENT REPORT
