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TENTH BIENNIAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

For the Period July 1, 1950, to June 30, 1952

TO HIS EXCELLENCY, EARL WARREN, *Governor*, and to the Members of
the Legislature:

As provided for in the Horse Racing Act, Chapter 4, Division 8, Section 19432, Business and Professions Code (the Racing Act), and pursuant thereto, the California Horse Racing Board presents herewith its Tenth Biennial Report covering the period from July 1, 1950, to June 30, 1952.

In the biennial period July 1, 1950, to June 30, 1952, the California Horse Racing Board received from racing \$36,145,744.97. This sum is inclusive of commission, breakage, license fees and unclaimed wagers. The operating cost of the Horse Racing Board for the same period amounted to \$258,965.41, which in relation to the total revenue is 0.7 percent.

During this time the members of the board participated in 23 official recorded meetings and had submitted to them 362 matters requiring their attention. This included 118 cases of licensees referred to the board, or applicants for licenses, and on whom the board made judicial decisions. The board continued its work on the proposed revision of the Rules of Racing, which will be published early in 1953.

There are 20 associations in the State conducting racing, and included among which are major racing associations, state, county, and district fairs, and organizations specializing in the harness and quarter horse fields. In no other state in the Union are the three types of racing conducted under the jurisdiction and supervision of one racing board. In other words, the California Horse Racing Board exercises its authority supervisorily over Thoroughbred, Standard Bred, and Quarter Horse racing.

Section 19435 (Subpenas for Witnesses to Attend Board Hearings). The board in the conduct of its hearings in various parts of the State has been confronted with a serious situation and wherein witnesses have failed to appear in answer to subpenas issued under this section. As a result of the nonappearance of necessary witnesses, cases have had to be dismissed or postponed.

In many cases, a licensee of the board is suspended by a board of stewards on a race track in one part of the State and the case referred to the Racing Board for review or further disciplinary action at the next meeting of the commissioners. The date may have already been set for the next meeting of the board in another part of the State. Witnesses are served in due course and as provided for under this section, but the board has no money in its budget to pay the necessary expenses incurred by witnesses who are subpoenaed to appear at meetings at distant places.

For instance, a licensee might be suspended for a serious infraction of the rules on the Bay Meadows race track. The Bay Meadows race track is in the San Francisco Bay area, and the next meeting of the board at which the case could be heard is scheduled to take place in Los Angeles. Necessary witnesses are served with subpoenas to appear at the meeting, but fail to put in their appearance thereat, or inform the subpoena-server that they will not be present unless their expenses are paid during their absence from their homes.

Under the circumstances outlined herein, it is respectfully suggested that consideration be given by the Legislature to the addition to Section 19435 of a provision to the effect that witnesses subpoenaed to appear before the board shall receive reasonable expenses to attend meetings of the board at distant places; and that the board be permitted to appropriate money for that purpose.

Section 19562 (California Bred Horses). The past few years have seen several of our outstanding thoroughbred stallions in California lost to this State for breeding purposes owing to the fact that these stallions have been purchased by, or leased to, individuals or syndicates in other states. Among a few of the best known stallions which California has lost for breeding purposes are as follows: Beau Pere, Alibhai, Mische, Shannon II, Bolero, Noor, Your Host, and recently, On Trust.

The Racing Board, therefore, recommends that a portion of the revenue from pari-mutuel wagering, which will go into the General Fund, be used to purchase a few outstanding thoroughbred stallions and these stallions to be maintained at our agricultural colleges; and, that individuals owning thoroughbred mares be permitted to breed these mares to the state stallions, and that a fee for service be charged so the cost of maintaining the stallions would be paid by these fees. It is suggested that a commission consisting of five members be appointed: two members of the California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, the Director of Finance, and two of our state veterinarians; and, that this commission be authorized to purchase for the State such outstanding stallions as will, in their opinion, improve the thoroughbred horse of this State. Also, this commission should be authorized to purchase a few thoroughbred mares for each agricultural college where the stallions are housed so that these agricultural colleges may breed these mares to the state stallions and the colts sold at the annual yearling sale. There would thus be some income accruing to the agricultural colleges from the sale of these colts.

As Section 19562 of the California Horse Racing Act states that the purpose of this chapter is the encouragement of agriculture and the breeding of horses in this State, it would seem, therefore, that the Legislature would be carrying out the intent of the Horse Racing Act if this proposal were to be acted upon favorably.

Section 19564 (Quarter Horse Racing). The board, after giving the matter of quarter horse racing careful consideration, has arrived at the conclusion that it would be in the best interests of the sport if an amendment were to be made to this section and wherein quarter horse racing would be limited in the State to 50 days annually, exclusive of charity days; and that the amendment would be worded in a similar manner as Section 19539 pertaining to harness horse racing. In other words, it would provide for 25 days in the north and 25 days in the south for quarter horse racing.

Section 19598 (Unclaimed Wagers). On the basis of an investigation under way at this time of claims for reimbursement on lost tickets, permissible under this section, and wherein board investigators have secured twenty-eight (28) confessions from persons who had placed such claims and who in most cases had not purchased the tickets they claimed they had lost, the board recommends that the law be amended so as to not permit the reception of claims for lost tickets. The board also recommends that Section 19598 be so worded that the actual ticket must be submitted before encashment will be made; and in the case of torn tickets, payment thereon may be secured if genuine, provided sufficient parts are tendered for payment showing on the face thereof the name of the race track, the date, the denomination, the race number and the horse number.

The amendment of this section would result in a saving of many thousands of dollars annually. As a result of the investigation of the false claims herein referred to, the State has saved approximately \$4,000.

Section 19538 (Charity Days). The California Horse Racing Board recommends that Section 19538 of the Horse Racing Act be amended so that all income derived from or because of the conduct of racing on charity days, less actual expenses for those days, shall constitute the funds to be donated to charity.
