TWELFTH BIENNIAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

For the Period July 1, 1954, to June 30, 1956

*To HIS EXCELLENCY, GOODWIN J. KNIGHT, Governor,
and to the Members of the Legislature:*

I. GENERAL MATTERS

The California Horse Racing Board herewith presents its biennial report covering the period July 1, 1954, through June 30, 1956, pursuant to the provisions of Section 19432 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California. This report will be the twelfth biennial report which has been made by the Racing Board since horse racing has been legalized in California.

There has been a tremendous development and expansion of the horse racing sport in this State. This development has involved an increase in all phases of horse racing.

In order to bring into focus this tremendous development it is only necessary to state that there are 18 associations in the State conducting racing with pari-mutuel wagering, and included among which are major racing associations, state, county, and district fairs, and organizations specializing in the harness and quarter horse fields, and that in no other state in the Union are the three types of racing conducted under the jurisdiction of the same board, and finally to make a hasty over-all comparison between the salient features of the first report of the Racing Board for the Fiscal Year 1933-34, and the Fiscal Year 1955-56.

1. Income

In the first report there were 112 days of racing, wagering amounted to \$6,315,634, and the State's income from racing was \$259,657.36. While in the fiscal year of 1955-56, there were 515 days of racing, wagering amounted to \$442,846,078, and the State's income from racing was \$25,050,884.94.

As will be noted in this Biennial Report, the State of California for the fiscal years July 1, 1954, to June 30, 1956, received from pari-mutuel wagering and license fees the sum of \$47,921,412, and the attendance at all the race meetings, including the fairs, for the period of this report was 12,177,505. This is the largest income the State has received from racing in any like period, and it is the largest attendance for any similar period.

2. Board Rules Enforcement and Stimulation Cases

In the case of stimulation of the horses, the board's record shows that during the period of this report, of the 17,348 samples of urine and saliva taken, 10,056 samples were analyzed including samples taken from the horses finishing second and third in stake races.

A perfect record was marred by the finding of a stimulant in one of the samples of a horse raced at one of the fairs. Those responsible for the care of this horse were suspended as provided in Section 1871 of Title 4 of the California Administrative Code.

3. Fire Prevention Matters

In the matter of fire prevention, it will be recalled that Section 1992 provided for certain fire prevention requirements as a condition precedent to the granting of a license to conduct a race meeting.

The Racing Board, since the adoption of Section 1992 in 1954, has continued its policy of requiring a high standard of fire safety measures, particularly in the stable area. Every race track, including the fairs, which conduct a race meeting with pari-mutuel wagering, is required to comply fully with this safety measure. Prior to the start of every race meeting, the management is obliged to obtain a written clearance from the State Fire Marshal, or from a recognized fire inspection authority, stating that a reasonable standard of fire safety exists. A copy of this written clearance must be furnished the Racing Board before a license is issued.

In an endeavor to minimize the danger of fire in the stable area, the Racing Board adopted Section 1463.1, which section gives the stewards authority to suspend for the duration of the meeting, any licensee found under the influence of intoxicating liquors within the confines of the racing association.

Two of the major racing associations, namely the Los Angeles Turf Club and the Hollywood Turf Club, have installed at considerable expense, the automatic sprinkler system and electric controls in their stable areas. Some of the other racing associations, as well as some of the fairs, have lined the tack rooms in the stable area with a fire retarding material. Although the Racing Board realizes that the cost of installing the automatic sprinkler system and the electric controls would be too expensive for some of the racing associations and fairs, the Racing Board believes, however, that all racing associations and fairs conducting racing, should provide the maximum fire protection within their financial ability to do so.

The Racing Board has been advised by the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association that the value of the horses at a major race meeting is approximately \$8,000,000. It can readily be seen that a serious fire would indeed be a catastrophe involving not only the track facilities, but also the loss of irreplaceable racing stock, to say nothing of the possibility of loss of human life.

The Racing Board wishes to thank State Fire Marshal Joe E. Yockers, whose cooperation and assistance have been invaluable to it in connection with fire prevention matters.

II. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. State Stewards

In order for the Racing Board to keep abreast with the growth, development and advancement of racing, it is necessary that it be in a position to carry out all activities pertinent to its duty to see to it that all race meetings are conducted in a manner commensurate with the best interest of racing and in the public interest. In this connection, it is imperative that the Racing Board have sufficient funds with which to pay the necessary state stewards. Historically, the actual conduct of the races is under the supervision of the stewards. These men are trained and experienced in all phases relating to the running of races. It is incongruous and inconsistent that the racing laws of this State and the rules and regulations of the Racing Board should be enforced by stewards appointed by the Racing Board and paid by the racing associations running the meetings over which they preside.

In the Seventh Biennial Report 1944-46, the Racing Board requests funds with which to hire and pay the state stewards, and again in the Ninth Biennial Report 1948-50 the Racing Board renewed this request to hire and pay for the state stewards who represent the Racing Board and report to it. The Racing Board at this time again requests the Legislature to provide it with the necessary funds so that it may hire and pay two state stewards in order that these individuals will no longer be in the incongruous position of representing the Racing Board and at the same time receiving their pay checks from the racing associations against whom they must enforce the laws and rules of racing.

The racing laws of New York State provide for an assessment against the corporation conducting a race meeting, and this fund is used to pay for the State Steward and other activities of the New York State Racing Commission. The following is the New York State racing laws on this subject:

7533. *Supervisory costs:* "The state shall be reimbursed for the cost of providing supervisory functions at any race meeting, and the expense of preventing the use of improper devices and the administration of drugs or stimulants, by assessments in an amount to be fixed by the state racing commission at not exceeding eight hundred dollars per day which shall be a charge against and be paid by the corporation or association conducting the race meetings at which such functions are exercised, and shall be paid by it to such commission in advance of such meetings in addition to the license fees prescribed by chapter four hundred forty of the laws of nineteen hundred twenty-six as amended: provided, that the assessments for such purpose in the case of hunt meetings shall not exceed \$100 per day."

The New York law, in addition to providing for stewards, also provides for the maintenance and operation of a laboratory for the testing of urine and saliva, among other things. We do not propose such a laboratory for this State, but merely request funds for the stewards' salary.

The Washington state law also provides for an assessment against the racing associations for such purposes. The Washington Horse Racing Commission has always employed the state steward and paid him

his salary, from the Washington Horse Racing Commission's operating fund. Racing associations in the State of Washington have never hired or paid the state steward. His salary has been for several years and presently is \$100 per racing day. The commission pays the salary and is not reimbursed by the racing associations.

Operating funds for salaries and expenses of the Washington commission come from a percentage of the pari-mutuel receipts and other revenue collected for the state.

The steward representing the State of California is paid \$100 a day by the various racing associations, and it is recommended that the State of California levy a tax against the racing associations (fairs excepted) for the necessary funds required for the State to pay for the employment of two state stewards.

The Racing Board, in making this request, believes that those appointed to represent the Racing Board and the State of California should be paid by the State.

This request for two state stewards to be hired exclusively by the Racing Board is for supervision of the major racing associations only, and does not include a board-paid steward for the fairs. It would be a year-round job for each steward.

2. Expenses of Racing Board Employees Who Work at the Fairs

The Racing Board is confronted with one further problem that requires the attention of the Legislature. This problem has to do with the matter of providing means for supplying funds with which to reimburse the Racing Board's employees who are required to work at the various fairs.

The Racing Board requests the Legislature to enact legislation in order that the investigators and the license clerk who work at the fairs receive an expense allowance sufficient to meet their needs.

At present the Racing Board's license clerk and investigators who attend the race meetings at the fairs find it necessary to supplement the State's maximum allowance of \$11 a day for expenses by \$4 to \$5 from their own funds, due to the fact that prices for rooms and meals in the community where the fairs are held are increased during a race meeting. It does not seem just for the Racing Board's employees who work at the fairs to pay from their own pockets from \$4 to \$5 a day to supplement the State's maximum allowance of \$11 a day for expenses when the increase is due to the fact that the rates charged at the communities where the fairs are held are increased at such times to a point where they are in excess of the allowance for expenses by the State.

It is, therefore, requested that the Legislature enact such legislation in order to make it possible for the Racing Board employees who attend the fairs to receive an allowance for expenses of \$15 per day. The total allowance requested in excess of the regular maximum allowance of \$11 per day would not exceed \$2,000 per annum. At the present time three board employees are assigned to the fair circuit.

CONCLUSION

The Racing Board in rendering this report and making the recommendations herein contained, does so with a sincere desire and purpose of fully meeting its duty and obligation of furthering and preserving the sport and business of racing that it believes has been of great benefit to the people of the State of California.
