



It seems appropriate to incorporate in the board's thirteenth biennial report the degree to which horse racing and horse breeding have developed in this State since parimutuel wagering has been legalized. This is especially desirable in view of the racing law's declaration that its purpose is "the encouragement of agriculture and the breeding of horses in this State."

As the board's information in this connection is based on the activities of many organizations that operate on a calendar year basis, the following data in most instances reflects conditions for the calendar year of 1957:

### AGRICULTURE

In 1957 there was used at the racing associations' tracks and at the fairs, as well as on the breeding farms:

32,042 tons of hay  
19,448 tons of straw  
38,976 tons of grain

These items represent a value of \$4,044,030.

### BREEDING OF HORSES

There are now 336 thoroughbred breeding farms in California and they devote 33,336 acres to horse production. The estimated value of the land, improvements and breeding stock on these farms is \$150,000,000. The payrolls of these breeding farms list 1,359 employees whose payroll for the year 1957 totaled \$5,063,330.

In round numbers there are 295 thoroughbred stallions and 3,000 mares on these farms, and in 1957 there were 1,077 foals registered with the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, the designated registering agency. Horses bred in California won purses totaling \$5,476,790 in the year 1957 in this State. In addition, the breeders of these California-breds received \$350,122 in awards accruing from the 10 percent paid under the law as a bonus for earning first moneys in this State.

By way of providing a few examples, the purse earnings in the past several years of the more successful California-breds are herewith presented:

To these may be added Correspondent, Cover Up, Eddie Schmidt, Great Circle, Honeys Alibi, Social Climber, Spinney, Stepfather, Stranglehold, and Trusting, which have earned upward of \$200,000 each, and many more in the \$100,000 bracket.

Further evidence of the steadily improving quality of California-bred horses may be found in a perusal of world speed records. California-

breeds have contributed conspicuously in the establishing of new world speed marks or the equaling of old ones. They now hold:

The breeder of Swaps, Mr. Rex C. Ellsworth of Chino, sold his interest in this horse at a figure reliably reported to have been in excess of any price ever previously paid for a thoroughbred anywhere. Other California-breds are being sold from time to time for large sums, and this commerce is expected to increase as the fame of the horses bred within our State's borders grows.

### CALIFORNIA STANDARDBRED HORSES

Fifteen farms in this State are devoted to the breeding of standardbred horses, and these farms comprise 2,500 acres. These breeders employed 60 persons in 1957 whose combined salaries totaled \$200,000.

Thirty standardbred stallions stand in the State and they serve approximately 250 mares. In 1957 standardbred foals to the number of 213 were reported.

During 1957 purses totaling \$1,437,050 were reported distributed at standardbred meetings in the State, and the breeders' awards amounted to \$13,048.

### CALIFORNIA QUARTER HORSES

The latest addition to racing in California is the quarter horse. This type of horse is very fast for a distance of a quarter of a mile, hence the name "quarter horse."

As the quarter horse is ideal for use on cattle ranches, many ranchers in this State are breeding this horse.

There were 788 California-bred quarter horses registered in 1957.

The purse distribution at quarter horse meetings in 1957 totaled \$916,445, and the breeders' awards amounted to \$12,768.

### OTHER IMPORTANT FACTORS IN CONNECTION WITH RACING

It is necessary to transport horses from one race track to another, as well as from fair to fair, and this activity alone is of considerable magnitude—as the following will demonstrate.

There are 67 horse vans registered with the Public Utilities Commission, and 50 vans not so registered. These vans have a capacity of from

4 to 10 horses. In addition, it has been estimated that 300 two-horse trailers are in use in the transportation of horses.

The owners of the 67 registered horse vans employ 209 persons, including drivers, shopmen, and office employees. The payroll for 1957 amounted to \$856,900, and the volume of business done by these 67 vans was \$1,340,000. The board was unable to obtain from the unregistered van owners information accurately reportable.

Another item of considerable importance has to do with the furnishing of food and supplies, not only to those who work at the race meetings, but also to the patrons attending these meetings. For the year 1957 the record was as follows:

In 1957 the total payroll for all these yearly and seasonal employees was \$11,040,525.

Also, the American Totalisator Company employs from 14 to 24 technicians at the meetings of the major race tracks and seven technicians at the fairs.

There are many individuals whose work necessitates their presence at these racing meetings. In this group there is included representatives of the newspapers, radio, television, the *Racing Form*, Western Union,

etc., numbering 150 at the racing associations in the southern part of the State and 130 in the north.

In the stable area, and in the jockeys' room, an additional 2,830 individuals work at each of the tracks in the Los Angeles area, and a lesser number at the other tracks. This figure includes trainers, jockeys, platers, jockeys' agents, valets, exercise boys, grooms, hot walkers and others.

### IMPROVEMENT AND MAINTENANCE EXPENDITURES

In 1957 a considerable amount was spent for improvements and maintenance by the major racing associations. In addition, the 79 fairs, which receive annual appropriations from the State's income from racing, disbursed large sums for improvement and maintenance of their plants:
