MINUTES

Chairman Shapiro asked for approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 23, 2007. Commissioner Andreini **motioned** to approve the minutes. Vice-Chairman Harris **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION ON THE REQUEST FROM THE PACIFIC RACING ASSOCIATION TO ADD TWO RACE DAYS TO THEIR ALLOCATED 2007 RACE DATES CALENDAR.

Chairman Shapiro said the item would be **deferred** to the March 2007 Regular Meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING BY THE BOARD ON THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF CHRB RULE 1481, OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES AND FEES, TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF GRADED STAKES SECURITY GUARDS.

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the proposed amendment to Board Rule 1481, Occupational Licenses and Fees, would add the license classification of "graded stakes security guard" to the list of occupational licenses that are issued by the Board. She stated the license would be for a period of one year and would cost \$35, with renewals costing \$20. Ms.

Wagner added the proposed amendment would codify the current practice of licensing such security guards, and staff recommended the Board adopt the amendment as presented. Chairman Shapiro said due to the fluctuation in their use, he recognized licensing the security guards would be a challenge, but it was a good idea and would be in line with licensing everyone with access to the backstretch. Vice-Chairman Harris said the license classification should reflect a broader scope of duties, as the guards were used for more than graded stakes. Ms. Wagner stated an additional 15-day public comment period would be required if the Board wished to change the name of the license classification. Vice-Chairman Harris asked if the security guards were licensed in the same manner as other licensees. Ms. Wagner stated the association hired the security guards through a private company. The Board was relying on the private company to do due diligence. However, the proposed amendment would require the guards to undergo the Board's licensing procedure. Chairman Shapiro said the license classification could be named "event guard" or "event personnel" to differentiate it from other security guard licenses. Ms. Wagner stated staff would amend the language of the regulation to reflect a more encompassing license classification name. Eual Wyatt of Hollywood Park said he would work with staff to arrive at a satisfactory title for the license classification, and address the idea of the association holding the license.

PUBLIC HEARING BY THE BOARD ON THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF CHRB RULE 1433, APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING, TO REQUIRE ASSOCIATIONS TO PROVIDE AVERAGE DAILY PURSE ESTIMATES, THE NAMES OF THE ADVANCE DEPOSIT WAGERING PROVIDERS AND INFORMATION DESCRIBING FIRST-AID FACILITIES AT THE RACE TRACK ON THE APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the proposed amendment to Rule 1433, Application for License to Conduct a Horse Racing Meeting, was a response to the passage of Assembly Bill (AB) 1180, Statutes of 2005. The proposed amendment would incorporate specific requirements pursuant to AB1108. The emergency section of the application for license to conduct a horse racing meeting was expanded to require the associations and racing fairs to describe their on track first aid facilities. Racing associations and racing fairs would also be required to provide an emergency medical plan in English and Spanish, which would be posted in the jockey's room. The associations and racing fairs would also be required to appoint a health and safety manager and assistant manager who would be responsible for compliance with the provisions of AB1180. Ms. Wagner stated no comments were received during the 45-day public comment period, and staff recommended the Board adopt the amendment as presented. Commissioner Moretti **motioned** to adopt the amendment to Rule 1433. Commissioner Bianco **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

PUBLIC HEARING BY THE BOARD ON THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF CHRB RULE 1581.1, ENTRIES, TO MAKE EXPLICIT THAT A HORSE DRAWN FOR A POST POSITION IN A RACE TO BE RUN MAY SUBSEQUENTLY BE ENTERED IN A CALIFORNIA STAKES RACE ONLY.

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the proposed amendment to Rule 1581.1, Entries, would clarify the intent of the regulation by adding the word “California” to make it clear that stakes races in which horses that drew a postposition could subsequently be entered into California stakes races only. Ms. Wagner stated an incident occurred wherein there was a misinterpretation of the regulation and staff was directed to initiate a rule change to provide clarification. Chairman Shapiro said he did not see where the original intent of the regulation was to limit the stakes races to California. If a California owner wanted to ship his horse out-of-state to participate in a big stake race, why should he not be allowed to? Executive Director Fermin stated the owner could take his horse out of State with the approval of the racing office and the stewards. However, the proposed amendment said if a horse was going out of one race and into a stake race, the racing secretaries preferred that it be a California race. Drew Couto of Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) stated his organization opposed the amendment because it restricted the subsequent entry to California stake races, and was an unnecessary restriction on owners who wished to enter and run elsewhere. Mr. Couto said TOC could find only one instance where there might have been a problem with the regulation, and he added TOC would meet with the industry to see if there were additional problems that might require a change. Chairman Shapiro said the item would be **continued**. Jerry Jamgotchian, a horse owner, spoke about his concerns regarding the proposed amendment.

PUBLIC HEARING BY THE BOARD ON THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF CHRB RULE 1606, COUPLING OF HORSES, TO EXEMPT QUARTER HORSE RACES FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE RULE.

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the proposed amendment to Rule 1606, Coupling of Horses, would exempt quarter horses from the requirement that two or more horses owned in whole or in part by the same owner(s) shall be coupled as a single wagering interest and as an entry. Ms. Wagner stated in 2006 the Board conducted an experimental waiver of the coupling rule that included the Los Alamitos quarter horse meeting. Subsequent to the experiment, Los Alamitos Racing Association requested that quarter horses be exempt from the requirements of Rule 1606. During the 45-day public comment period one comment in opposition of the proposed amendment was received. Chairman Shapiro stated that during the 2006 experiment at Los Alamitos the quarter horse field size increased from 7.15 to 8 starters per race. That meant there was an increase of .85 horses per race. He added he personally had not heard any fan complaints, or adverse comments regarding the proposed amendment. Commissioner Andreini said he knew of no issues arising from the uncoupling experiment at Los Alamitos. Vice-Chairman Harris stated if the association and the horsemen were in favor of the proposed amendment it should be approved. He commented thoroughbred owners often owned one hundred percent of both horses in an entry, but in quarter horse racing there were often multiple partnerships involved in the ownership of one horse. Vice-Chairman Harris **motioned** to approve the amendment to Rule 1606. Commissioner Moretti **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

**DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE ENFORCEMENT OF CHRB
RULE 1690.1, TOE GRABS PROHIBITED.**

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the enforcement of Rule 1690.1, Toe Grabs Prohibited, was discussed at the January 2007 Regular Board Meeting. The Oak Tree Racing Association and Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) spoke in favor of enforcing the regulation. California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT) spoke in opposition to the enforcement of Rule 1690.1. Chairman Shapiro said at the January 2007 meeting he voted against the enforcement of Rule 1690.1 because he believed the Board should not interfere - when the racing association could work with the horsemen and achieve the same results. However, he stated he did embrace actions that would save any horse from injury. Chairman Shapiro added he did not know why the rule was limited to thoroughbred horses, and he thought it should be extended to any breed. He said he participated in a conference call regarding toe grabs where conclusive evidence regarding the effects of high toe grabs was presented. Dr. Rick Arthur, CHRB Equine Medical Director, spoke about the scientific studies conducted regarding the effects of toe grabs and explained the results of such studies. He stated the data was irrefutable, and although he did not have evidence regarding taking the same step with quarter horses and with hind shoes, there would be some justification in such actions. Dr. Arthur said the issue also touched jockeys. There was a recent incident that resulted in a euthanized horse and a jockey in the hospital. Darryl Haire of the Jockey's Guild said his organization believed toe grabs were a serious safety issue for its members and it supported the enforcement of the regulation. Guy Lamothe of TOC stated his organization supported the enforcement of Rule 1690.1. Eual Wyatt of Hollywood Park spoke in favor of enforcing Rule 1690.1. Vice-Chairman Harris said he understood Hollywood Park intended to allow only queen's plates on

its synthetic track. Mr. Wyatt said the current house rule allowed toe grabs of not more than a quarter of an inch in height. However, Hollywood Park believed the synthetic surface would limit the natural slide and turn that a horse's hoof experienced on a dirt racetrack, and based on experience only it seemed the addition of toe grabs and jar caulks further inhibited that movement. Therefore, Hollywood Park intended to limit shoes on the synthetic track to queen's plates and/or flat shoes. Vice-Chairman Harris said it looked like the synthetic surfaces provided a greater reason to eliminate toe grabs. Mr. Wyatt replied that could be the case. He added there would still be traditional dirt tracks in California, so the regulation needed to be in place. Commissioner Moss said he understood Woodbine, which had a synthetic surface, needed to return to toe grabs. Mr. Wyatt said that was true, but it was the result of changes in the track, not a change in philosophy. Commissioner Moss said the decision at the January 2007 meeting not to enforce Rule 1690.1 was the result of there being no scientific data regarding synthetic tracks. He added the issue should be left to the track and the trainer, so they could have the flexibility to adjust to differing conditions. Mr. Wyatt said the regulation was on the books - and if it stayed on the books - it should be enforced. There could be another discussion about artificial surfaces, but there were horses that would still be running on traditional dirt tracks and they and their riders should be protected. Charles Dougherty of CTT said his organization did not endorse the enforcement of Rule 1690.1. Vice-Chairman Harris **motioned** to enforce Rule 1690.1. Commissioner Moss said he did not believe the issue was one the CHRB should enforce. The trainers would do what was best for the horse and the tracks would monitor the situation. He added he believed in the sanctity of the stakeholder, and it was up to the horsemen to take action. Vice-Chairman Harris stated the

CTT voiced its opposition, and it controlled that part of the horsemen's agreement. Absent Board intervention a Catch-22 was created, as the horsemen and the tracks had not gotten together on the issue. Commissioner Moretti **seconded** the motion, which **carried** with a "no" vote by Commissioner Moss.

**DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE PROPOSED REPEAL OF
CHRB RULE 1690.1, TOE GRABS PROHIBITED.**

Chairman Shapiro said the item would not be heard.

**DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE PROPOSED ADDITION OF
CHRB RULE 1414.5, RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES RELATING TO AGREEMENTS,
TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES REGARDING
AGREEMENTS THAT ARE NECESSARY FOR THE CONDUCT OF A HORSE RACING
MEETING.**

Jacqueline Wagner, CHRB staff, said the proposed addition of Rule 1414.5, Resolution of Disputes Relating to Agreements, would allow the parties to provide the Board with written notification of a dispute. Upon notification, the Board could impose a cooling off period of up to 15 days, during which the allegations would be investigated and if necessary the matter may be heard by the Board. After an investigation, or a hearing, the Board could make recommendations to the parties. For the purposes of Rule 1414.5, agreements necessary for the conduct of the meeting would include, but would not be limited to: advance deposit wagering (ADW) agreements; simulcast wagering agreements; and horsemen's agreements. Chairman Shapiro said it often happened that the Board believed everything was in place for the conduct of a horse racing meeting, only to discover there was an issue between the parties

that could affect the conduct or performance of the meeting. He stated he would like to see a dispute resolution mechanism that would allow a cooling off period for issues that could affect the meeting, or that could be different from what the Board believed it was approving. Vice-Chairman Harris said he was not clear with the terminology. He stated "cooling off period" did not describe what the Board was trying to accomplish, nor did he believe "allegations" would be investigated. The issue was disputes between the parties that needed arbitration. The cooling off period was more of a "stand still." Chairman Shapiro said he was trying to find a mechanism that stated if a dispute would have a detrimental effect on California fans, or the horse racing business in California, there would be a forum for the Board to hear the matter and reach a solution. Vice-Chairman Harris said that would require a stand still agreement, and the regulation would have to clarify what agreements the parties reverted back to. Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Derry Knight stated the Board entertaining a dispute and making recommendations was one issue; the cooling off period was another, and would require a definition. He added the Board had to be careful as the regulation raised the subject of the Board's ability to decide issues that were private disputes. DAG Knight said without a statute he did not know where the Board would get that authority. He stated the Board was suggesting it would be resolving disputes, and even a stand still agreement was a form of dispute resolution. Without legislation the Board might not have that authority. Chairman Shapiro asked if the Board could require that - as a condition of the license - the race meeting must occur as presented in the license application, and any disputes that could affect the meeting would be arbitrated by a third party, or litigated so they did not disrupt the meeting. DAG Knight stated the issue was too involved for him to answer immediately, and he suggested it be

simplified, as the Board was attempting to assume very broad authority. Chairman Shapiro asked if the Board could make it a condition of license that if there was a dispute, the parties would continue to take the signal, or conduct business, without disrupting the race meeting. DAG Knight said the Board could impose such a condition, but the question was if the Board could enforce its condition. Vice-Chairman Harris said the issues could be narrowed to exclude labor problems. The main issues were ADW and occasionally the horsemen's agreement. There needed to be a way to resolve impasses regarding such issues. Drew Couto of Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) said the proposed rule was unnecessary with regards to the horsemen's agreements because Rule 2043, Adjudication of Controversies Relating to Agreements, covered horsemen's agreements. Mr. Couto stated ADW disputes were a function of the enabling statute, which was poorly drafted. He said the industry was doing its best to deal with the law as it was written, and the statute would be improved going forward. Mr. Couto added the Board's efforts to impose a cooling off period and decide ADW or simulcast issues that were based on federal law was an inappropriate extension of the Board's jurisdiction. Chairman Shapiro said Rule 2043 required the Board to immediately investigate any allegation and refer the complaint to the Board of Stewards. By the time that was done, there could be a dispute that negatively affected the ability of a race meeting to function. He stated he was trying to find a vehicle that would allow the Board to maintain the status quo, so the fans, and the industry were not negatively impacted. Mr. Couto stated there was nothing the Board could do if a party was intent on creating a dispute. Chairman Shapiro asked why an agreement that the signal would not be interrupted could not be a condition of license. Mr. Couto said the condition would violate the horsemen's federal rights, and it could

be challenged in court. Chairman Shapiro stated the Board was not asking anyone to waive their rights. He said the parties in dispute could raise the issue, and any monies could be put in escrow until the issue was resolved. It was in the best interests of the owners if the meeting ran smoothly. Mr. Couto said sometimes a fundamental principle needed to be put ahead of personal financial gain. TOC could not anticipate when the need to exercise its rights under federal law would arise, but in its years of existence it only withheld consent four times. If there was a problem that was covered by a contract and by State law, the Board had the right to investigate and refer it to the Board of Stewards. He added that was quicker than the proposed 15-day cooling off period, which could mean that one party would lose all of its rights or leverage. Cliff Goodrich of Fairplex Park Pomona said in his many years of experience with license applications he found that when the Board tried to adjudicate disputes it did not succeed. If the Board let the market run its course such disputes got resolved. Jerry Jamgotchian, a horse owner, spoke about his concerns regarding the proposed addition of Rule 1414.5. Chairman Shapiro said the Board's DAG could provide advice regarding its proper function in the matter. DAG Knight stated, as he understood the issue, the Board was talking about economic disputes between third parties. Chairman Shapiro said that was correct. If the Board approved a license application and all the parties agreed the application contained the terms under which the meeting would go forward, the Board wanted the meet to commence as such. However, if there was a dispute, the meeting could continue and the dispute could be resolved outside the meeting's conduct. Chairman Shapiro said in December 2006 he spent an entire day in an office over a dispute wherein YouBet would not have carried Santa Anita's signal. When the Board approved Santa Anita's application for license it believed all the

parties were in agreement. However, he received a telephone call regarding the dispute, which meant the possible loss of up to a couple hundred thousand dollars a day in handle. That would immediately affect the horsemen's purses, and the fans that wanted to wager on Santa Anita via YouBet. Chairman Shapiro stated he resented that such a dispute would arise two days before the opening of a meeting. He only wanted the Board to be able to say let the meeting go forward as planned, and do not hold the horsemen or fans hostage. Mr. Couto said he agreed with Chairman Shapiro, but the dispute was the result of the flawed ADW statute and the Board's failure to take a stand on exclusivity. He stated he was not certain Rule 1414.5 would address the issue; it would simply limit the rights of the parties. If the rationale for the proposed regulation was the ADW problems, the ADW statute was the mechanism to achieve resolution. Vice-Chairman Harris said the ADW statute was due to sunset, and he hoped the industry was working to make sure the problems with the law were resolved. Mr. Couto said TOC submitted a draft for a new law to the industry. He stated it was a starting point, and he thought it addressed many of the issues. DAG Knight said he did not have a problem with the Board being involved in mediating and recommending resolutions. What the proposed regulation suggested, however, was that the Board would have the power to compel the parties to continue paying pursuant to agreements they thought were no longer in effect. He stated he did not believe the Board had such power; the Board could not go beyond mediating. Chairman Shapiro said the Board was not trying to become the party to decide issues in a dispute. It simply wanted to keep the industry from being hurt by such disputes.

**REPORT AND DISCUSSION BY THE BOARD ON THE UPDATE FROM STAFF ON
THE STATUS OF THE JOCKEY GUILDS' HEALTH AND WELFARE PROGRAM.**

Bon Smith, Assistant Executive Director, spoke about his ongoing review of the Jockey Guild's (Guild) Health and Welfare Fund. Chairman Shapiro said it appeared that none of California's jockeys were being denied coverage through the self-funded Jockey's Health Insurance Plan. He stated, however, it was important that the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), the Guild and staff meet as soon as possible to determine what vehicle would provide the best services for California jockeys and to ensure the funding coming from California was properly used. Vice-Chairman Harris asked how the monies were forwarded to the Guild. Mr. Smith stated the full amount for the year was calculated, then divided by 12, and a check was forwarded to the Guild monthly. Commissioner Bianco asked if advance deposit wagering was having an effect on the amount of money available for the Guild. Mr. Smith said in 2004 the monies funded 21 percent of the costs. In the current year, the monies would fund only 16 percent. The health cost curve had gone up, and the unclaimed tickets revenue had flattened and was probably on the decline. Ron Warren, Jr. of the California Jockey's Guild (CJG) said his organization represented 80 jockeys. He stated the CJG was requesting that the Board consider letting it run the health and welfare program for California riders. Chairman Shapiro said under the law the jockeys decided who would represent them. If a majority of the members stated they were represented by one organization that was the organization the Board was required to recognize. Mr. Warren stated the CJG represented approximately 95 percent of Northern California riders, 10 percent of Southern California riders and 90 percent of the quarter horse riders at Los Alamitos. He added he had not had the opportunity to approach many Southern California thoroughbred riders, so the numbers could

increase. Chairman Shapiro stated the CJG needed to research the statute regarding jockey representation and determine what it needed to accomplish to get Board recognition. Chris Gibbs, an insurance industry representative, spoke regarding the health and welfare plans of various jurisdictions, and the problems with California's funding scheme as he saw them. Darrel Haire of the Guild said his organization would work with the CJG and the TOC to get the best insurance for the money.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REQUEST OF BAY MEADOWS RACING ASSOCIATION TO DISBURSE CHARITY DAY RACING PROCEEDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$40,099.31 TO FIVE BENEFICIARIES.

Chairman Shapiro said the proposed distribution of charity day racing proceeds would pay 100 percent of the funds to horse racing related causes. Commissioner Andreini **motioned** to approve the request of Bay Meadows Racing Association to distribute charity day racing proceeds. Vice-Chairman Harris **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

REPORT OF THE MEDICATION COMMITTEE

Dr. Rick Arthur, CHRB Equine Medical Director, said the Medication Committee (committee) discussed the Equine Herpes Virus, which was under control. The committee also discussed anabolic steroids. Dr. Arthur stated the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium was working on a national policy regarding steroids. The committee also discussed Clenbuterol and talked about recent studies regarding the drug. The issue of announcing positives before the split sample came back was discussed. Dr. Arthur stated horse racing law and the Board's regulations governed the issue, and it could take a change in the law to allow such

announcements. The last issue discussed by the committee was making DNA testing available to the horsemen. Dr. Arthur reviewed the number of fatalities at Santa Anita, and commented there were no musculoskeletal injuries at Hollywood Park's cushion track.

REPORT OF THE STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE

Chairman Shapiro said the Strategic Planning Committee (committee) met on February 21, 2007. The committee heard a report from Drew Couto of Thoroughbred Owners of California regarding the ad hoc committees he chaired. The committee also heard from Jack Liebau of Hollywood Park that the last day Hollywood Park would operate under the current economic climate was September 23, 2008. That closing date was predicated on there being no mitigation relief. Chairman Shapiro stated the closing date was very near and underscored the importance of planning for the future. The consensus of the committee was to wait and see what action the Legislature might take with regards to mitigation. If that did not happen, the Board and the industry needed to provide alternative options to insure the future of horse racing in California. Eual Wyatt of Hollywood Park said he did not want to leave anyone with the impression Hollywood Park would close on September 23, 2008. He stated Hollywood Park was committed to run through that date, and it could continue running for a variety of reasons. Chairman Shapiro said that might be true, but it behooved the industry to plan as if Hollywood Park would close on that date. Cliff Goodrich of Fairplex Park Pomona stated the first choice of the industry was mitigation with the first allotment of monies going to purses, and an agreement between horsemen and the tracks regarding commissions and purses thereafter. However, mitigation could fail, and he thought Hollywood Park was, in effect,

unconsciously holding the industry hostage. As long as Hollywood Park continued to look at its options it made launching contingent plans impossible. If mitigation failed and Hollywood Park stopped racing, the industry would have lost 2,000 stalls. In the interim, San Luis Rey could be lost, and redevelopment could take place at Los Alamitos and/or Fairplex. Mr. Goodrich stated if mitigation failed he thought Hollywood Park owed the industry a declaration of a firm closing date. Before that occurred the industry needed to make plans, so if Hollywood Park did close, it could begin the legislative process, financing and a myriad of other things that needed to be accomplished. Mr. Goodrich said no one was going to invest a hundred million dollars while Hollywood Park continued to race and make plans for the future.

REPORT OF THE PARI-MUTUEL OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

Commissioner Moss said the Pari-Mutuel Operations Committee (committee) heard presentations from a number of persons interested in ways to protect the wagering public. He stated the committee was prepared to move forward on several issues. One issue was an amendment to Board Rule 1606, Coupling of Horses, which would allow the stewards to have a horse run for purse only and as a non-wagering interest when the other half of the entry was scratched. This would let the stewards have a third option, as opposed to scratching the entire entry, or letting the remaining half of the entry run as a wagering interest. Another issue was a recommendation by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Player's Panel (Panel). The Panel suggested an amendment to the Pick-4 wager that would require a refund before the Pick-4 sequence began, and a consolation pool after the first leg ran. The amendment would eliminate the practice of replacing the scratched horse with the favorite in the race. The

committee also heard about gelded horses being announced late to the public. The committee was considering a mandatory scratch when the trainer failed to report a gelding in a timely manner. Commissioner Moss stated the committee heard a presentation from Richard Murray regarding late odds changes. Following Mr. Murray's presentation representatives of Scientific Games explained the technical reasons for late odds changes.

STAFF REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING CONCLUDED RACE MEETS:

A. LOS ALAMITOS RACING ASSOCIATION AT LOS ALAMITOS FROM DECEMBER 26, 2005, THROUGH DECEMBER 17, 2006.

Bon Smith, Assistant Executive Director, stated the packet contained information regarding the end-of-meeting results for Los Alamitos, which ran from December 26, 2005, through December 17, 2006. The on track and off track handle was down, but out of state and advance deposit wagering handle were up significantly. Chairman Shapiro complemented the end of meeting report prepared by Senior Special Investigator Michael Kilpack.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Vice-Chairman Harris said the average fan at California racetracks did not know what the take out was on wagers. He stated the take-out was different for the various jurisdictions, so it might be nice to have that information somewhere in the program. Commissioner Andreini said the Pari-Mutuel Committee wanted the associations to educate the public more regarding racing. He stated maybe every three months a page explaining several points regarding horse racing could be published in the program. Chairman Shapiro said Commissioner Bianco's term was up and he wanted to take the opportunity to recognize his tremendous commitment

and dedication. Commissioner Bianco said he appreciated the people he met and ne thought they and the Board had a lot of integrity. Jerry Jamgotchian, a horse owner, spoke about his concerns regarding several issues related to horse racing.

MEETING ADJOURNED AT 12:33 P.M.



The following procedures have been put in place at Golden Gate Fields to ensure that proper security surveillance guidelines for races of \$100,000 or more are followed:

- Carrie Fawcett, Stable Superintendent, provides a list of starters to T. W. Johnson, Director of Security which includes the following information:
 1. Name of horse
 2. Name of trainer
 3. Barn number
 4. Stall number
- Supplemental security staff, provided by a licensed security contractor and licensed by the CHRB, are called in the morning of the race to meet with the Director of Security for the following instruction:
 - A. An overview of the race track operating procedures
 - B. A briefing of their duties throughout the day
 - C. All guards are asked to sign out for their specific video camera
 - D. A form is provided by the CHRB to each guard which is to be signed by the attending veterinarian when administering medication to bleeders.
 - E. Each guard is given a video camera to record ALL activities involving individuals entering and exiting their assigned stall. Instruction is given to first record the posted number on the stall to confirm that the camera is directed at the assigned horse.
 - F. Instruction is given to monitor any and all suspicious activity and to contact the Director of Security if and when suspicious activity occurs.
 - G. Guards are instructed to position themselves as close to the horse's stall without jeopardizing safety.
 - H. The horse and handler will be followed on foot by each guard to the receiving barn before the race.
 - I. After all horses are safely in the receiving barn, the guards are instructed to meet in the Security office with the Director of Security. The guards sign that they have returned their video camera and participate in a discussion of the day's surveillance activities.
- Surveillance videotapes are saved until all test results have received a negative result.

On March 2, 2007, a Fire and Life Safety inspection was conducted by this office under the *Fire Prevention Code*, NFPA 1, the Fundamental Requirements listed in the *Life Safety Code*, NFPA 101, Chapter 2, the 2001 California Fire Code and California Code of Regulations. Listed below are the results of the inspection and code references. All areas of Golden Gate Fields Race Track, within the jurisdiction of the Albany Fire Department have not been inspected, only the Public Areas of Golden Gate Field's at this time.

GENERAL

This building is in generally good condition. Housekeeping in the public areas are maintained, fire extinguishers and most of the existing exit/panic hardware and egress doors are in serviceable condition. 





PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF
RULE 1481. OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES AND FEES

Regular Board Meeting
March 22, 2007

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include, but not be limited to, licensing of each racing association and all persons, other than the public at large, who participate in a horse racing meeting with pari-mutuel wagering. B&P Code Section 19510 states no person required to be licensed may participate in any capacity in any horse race meeting without a valid and unrevoked license. B&P Code Section 19520 provides that every person not required to be licensed who participates in, or has anything to do with the racing of horses shall be licensed by the Board pursuant to rules and regulations that the Board may adopt, and upon the payment of a license fee fixed and determined by the Board. Board Rule 1481, Occupational Licenses and Fees, categorizes the types of occupational licenses issued by the Board and lists the fees charged for such licenses. Racing associations contract with private security firms to provide security guards for graded stakes races and other special events. These security guards provide around-the-clock surveillance at the stalls of horses entered in graded stakes races and other special events by conducting video surveillance and keeping written records. The guards are used on an "as needed" basis and may only be present on the backside sporadically; however, the Board has an interest in allowing only qualified persons onto the restricted areas of the racetrack, and while such security guards may hold California Department of Consumer Affairs certification, Horse Racing Law requires that the Board license all persons, other than the public at large, who participate in a horse racing meeting with pari-mutuel wagering. To ensure the integrity of the enhanced security program for graded stakes races and other special events, the Board has determined that these security guards must be eligible for a Board-issued occupational license. No comments were received during the initial 45-day public comment period; however, at the February 2007 hearing for adoption the Board determined that the term "graded stakes security guard" would be misleading as a license classification. Industry representatives suggested the new license class be named "backstretch event personnel." This change required a 15-day public comment period.

ANALYSIS

The proposed amendment to Board Rule 1481 will add "backstretch event personnel" to the list of occupational licenses issued by the Board. A backstretch event personnel license would be issued for the period of one year, and could cost \$35 for the initial license, with renewals costing \$20.

RECOMMENDATION

No comments were received during the 15-day public comment period. Staff recommends the Board adopt the amendment as presented.

CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD
TITLE 4. CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS
ARTICLE 4. OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES
PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF
RULE 1481. OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES AND FEES

1481. Occupational Licenses and Fees.

No person required to be licensed shall participate or attempt to participate in a race meeting without holding a valid license authorizing that participation.

(a) A person acting in any capacity within the restricted area of an inclosure, simulcast facility or auxiliary stabling area shall procure the appropriate license(s) and pay the fee required.

(b) A person acting in any of the following capacities shall procure the appropriate license(s) and pay the fee required:

- (1) Horse Owner by Open Claim.....\$250
- (2) Officer, Director, Partner or any individual or person who holds 5% or more of the outstanding shares of a racing association, simulcast service supplier or totalizator company.
\$200
- (3) Horse Owner\$150
- (4) Trainer, Assistant Trainer, Driver, Jockey, Apprentice Jockey, Jockey Agent\$150
- (5) Veterinarian\$150
- (6) Steward, Associate Steward, Steward (Veterinary Service), Simulcast Facility Supervisor, Assistant Simulcast Facility Supervisor, Racing Official, Administrative or Managerial personnel including General Manager of a racing association, simulcast organization or an intrastate guest association, who exercise control over other licensees, horse racing, pari-

mutuel wagering or simulcast operations, or whose duties routinely require access to restricted areas of the inclosure\$150

(7) Bloodstock Agent.....\$150

(8) Valet, Jockey Room or Drivers' Room Attendant or Custodian or Service Person, Colors Attendant, Paddock Attendant \$75

(9) Assistant to a Racing Official or Official, Assistant General Manager of a racing association, simulcast organization or an intrastate guest association, Assistant Starter, Assistant to the Veterinarian, Assistant Manager, Announcer, Paymaster of Purses, Superintendent, Starting Gate Driver, Flagman, Marshal, Stewards' Aide \$75

(10) Exercise Rider, Pony Rider, Outrider \$75

(11) Horseshoer, Stable Agent, Vendor or Vendor's Employee when duties require access to the restricted area, Stable Foreman \$75

(12) Pari-mutuel Employee, Totalizator Technician, Video Operator, Photofinish Operator. \$75

(13) Security Officer, Security Guard, Stable Gateman, Fire Guard, Security Investigator .. \$75

(14) Clerical Employee or Uncategorized Employee of a racing association, intrastate guest association, simulcast organization, simulcast service supplier, totalizator company, horsemen's organization or concessionaire when employed in a restricted area..... \$75

(c) A person acting in the capacity of Backstretch Event Personnel, Groom, Stable Employee or Stable Assistant shall procure the appropriate annual license. The fee for an original license is \$35, and the annual renewal of license is \$20.

(d) A person acting in the capacity of Authorized Agent shall register an authorized agent agreement and registration of authorized agent and pay a fee of \$25 for each registration.

- (e) A person or persons electing to conduct racing operations by use of a Stable Name shall register the Stable Name and pay a fee of \$300.
- (f) A person or persons conducting racing operations as a syndicate or as a partnership having more than ten general partners or having one or more limited partners shall register the syndicate or partnership as a multiple ownership and pay a fee of \$300.
- (g) A person participating in any capacity required to be licensed under this rule who participates or attempts to participate at a mule racing meeting shall procure an annual Mule Racing Participant license and pay an annual fee of \$25. A license for participating in a mule racing meeting is valid only at mule racing meetings and any license otherwise valid for horse racing meetings is not valid for mule racing meetings.
- (h) A person whose license-identification card is lost, destroyed or mutilated shall procure a replacement license-identification card and pay a fee of \$15.
- (i) A person who elects to participate in the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) Licensing Reciprocity Program shall pay the associated costs charged by the ARCI and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- (j) The date the payment of the required fee is received and recorded by the Board is the effective date of issuance of a continuous occupational license for the capacity in which licensed. The fees required herein are for the entire period for which the issued license is to be valid.

STAFF ANALYSIS
PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF
RULE 1844. AUTHORIZED MEDICATION

Regular Board Meeting
March 22, 2007

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. B&P Code Section 19562 states the Board may prescribe rules, regulations and conditions under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California. B&P Code Section 19580 requires the Board to adopt regulations to establish policies, guidelines, and penalties relating to equine medication to preserve and enhance the integrity of horse racing in California. B&P Code Section 19581 provides that no substance of any kind shall be administered by any means to a horse after it has been entered to race, unless the Board has, by regulation, specifically authorized the use of the substance and the quantity and composition thereof. Board Rule 1844, Authorized Medication, names drug substances and medications authorized by the Board that may be administered to safeguard the health of the horse entered to race. The rule lists the drug substances that may be found in official test samples and the level at which such drugs may occur. At the February 2005 Medication Committee meeting a proposed amendment to Rule 1844 was discussed. The item was again discussed at the August 2006 Medication Committee meeting.

ANALYSIS

The proposed amendment to Rule 1844 would change the allowable level of Flunixin to 50 nanograms per milliliter of blood plasma or serum. A new Subsection 1844(f) would allow the official blood test sample to contain clenbuterol in an amount not to exceed 25 picograms per milliliter of serum or plasma. Subsection 1844(c)(2) currently provides that the test sample shall contain not more than 20 nanograms of the drug flunixin per milliliter (ng/ml) of blood plasma or serum. The current level for flunixin was based on Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) studies that utilized a dose of flunixin of 1.1mg. per kilogram of body weight administered 24 hours prior to racing. When the Board adopted the current flunixin level it initiated a 60-day "phase in" period during which horses at the racetrack were experimentally dosed with flunixin at levels commonly administered by racetrack veterinarians. The survey revealed that flunixin administrations to race-age-horses using 500 mg. intravenously, the dose that is commonly used by racetrack veterinarians, would result in some flunixin overages at the current threshold of 20 ng/ml. That meant horsemen could have flunixin violations even though they followed the Board's regulations regarding administration of therapeutic drugs to horses entered to race. The proposed level of 50 nanograms of the

drug flunixin per milliliter of blood plasma or serum will ensure horse men may administer the drug within the confines of the Board's regulations without the fear of inadvertently violating the Board's rules. The proposal to amend Rule 1844 also adds subsection 1844(f), which provides for a clenbuterol level of 25 picograms per milliliter of serum or plasma in the official blood test sample. Subsection 1844(e)(9) allows 5 nanograms per milliliter in the official urine test sample. However, studies have demonstrated it is difficult to establish threshold levels for clenbuterol in urine. Levels of clenbuterol can be regulated more effectively through blood samples, and its administration can be identified within 72 hours. This means levels identified in serum or plasma are more rigorous and defensible. If clenbuterol is found in the urine sample, the blood sample can definitely establish if the drug was administered within the guidelines of the Board's rules.

RECOMMENDATION

No comments were received during the 45-day public comment period. Staff recommends the Board adopt the amendment to Rule 1844 as presented.

1844. Authorized Medication.

Consistent with the intent of these rules, drug substances and medications authorized by the Board for use may be administered to safeguard the health of the horse entered to race provided that:

(a) No person shall administer a drug substance to any horse entered to race except upon authorization of the official veterinarian in conformance with these rules.

(b) No drug substance, other than authorized bleeder medication, shall be administered to a horse entered to race within 24 hours of the race in which entered.

(c) Not more than one approved non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug substance (NSAID) may be administered to a horse that is entered to race and shall be only one of the following authorized drug substances:

(1) Phenylbutazone in a dosage amount that the test sample shall contain not more than 5 micrograms of the drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.

(2) Flunixin in a dosage amount that the test sample shall contain not more than ~~20~~ 50 nanograms of the drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.

(3) Ketoprofen in a dosage amount that the test sample shall contain not more than 10 nanograms of the drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.

(4) Metabolites or analogues of approved NSAIDs may be present in post race test samples.

(d) If the official chemist reports that a blood test sample contains an authorized NSAID in excess of the limit for that drug substance under this rule, the official

veterinarian shall, in conjunction with the veterinarian who administered or prescribed the authorized drug substance, establish a dosage amount or time of administration of the drug substance that will comply with the limits under this rule; or the official veterinarian may, if in his/her judgment no such reduced dosage amount or amendment to time of administration will result in a test sample level within the limits of this rule, withdraw authorization for the use of any one NSAID.

(e) Official urine test samples may contain one of the following drug substances, their metabolites or analogs, in an amount that does not exceed the specified levels:

- (1) Acepromazine; 25 nanograms per milliliter
- (2) Mepivacaine; 10 nanograms per milliliter
- (3) Promazine; 25 nanograms per milliliter
- (4) Albuterol; 1 nanogram per milliliter
- (5) Atropine; 10 nanograms per milliliter
- (6) Benzocaine; 50 nanograms per milliliter
- (7) Procaine; 10 nanograms per milliliter
- (8) Salicylates; 750 micrograms per milliliter
- (9) Clenbuterol; 5 nanograms per milliliter

(f) Official blood test samples may contain clenbuterol in an amount not to exceed 25 picograms per milliliter of serum or plasma.

(g) Official blood test samples shall not contain any of the drug substances, or their metabolites or analogs listed in subsection (e)(1)-(98).

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19420 provides that jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the California Horse Racing Board (Board). B&P Code Section 19440 states the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of Horse Racing Law. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. B&P Code Section 19460 provides that all licenses are subject to all rules, regulations, and conditions from time to time prescribed by the Board. B&P Code Section 19520 states every person who participates in, or has anything to do with the racing of horses shall be licensed by the Board pursuant to rules and regulations that the Board may adopt. Breath alcohol testing was discussed at the October 2005 Steward's Committee meeting. In December 2005 the California Thoroughbred Trainers requested that the Board consider implementing a rule requiring breath alcohol testing for jockeys prior to their first mount of the day. At the September 2006 Regular Board Meeting the Jockey's Guild (Guild) stated it endorsed the regulation, but would like to see "high quality" law enforcement equipment with properly trained personnel to administer the tests. In addition, harness drivers were added to the text of the regulation.

ANALYSIS

The proposed addition of Rule 1874.1, Breath Alcohol Testing, states jockeys and drivers are subject to breath alcohol testing prior to each race program in which they participate. If the test shows a concentration of 0.05 percent, or more, of alcohol the jockey or driver shall not be allowed to ride/drive and shall be referred to the stewards. The jockey or driver must submit to an additional blood alcohol test before he or she can ride/drive again. A survey of literature regarding alcohol and the human body revealed that although one might not appear "under the influence," as few as two 12 ounce servings of alcohol within one hour can result in a blood alcohol level over 0.05 percent in a male weighing 120 pounds. In general, the less one weighs the more one would be affected by a given amount of alcohol. Fatigue and fasting can also play a role in the effect of alcohol on an individual. The combination of alcohol, low weight and fatigue can be a recipe for injury to jockey or driver, the horse and others participating in a race. Alcohol is not digested upon absorption, nor chemically changed in the bloodstream. As the blood goes through the lungs, some of the alcohol moves across the membranes of the lung's air sacs (alveoli) into the air. The concentration of alcohol in the

alveolar air is exhaled, and can be detected by the breath alcohol-testing device. Because the alcohol concentration in the breath is related to that in the blood, one can figure the blood alcohol concentration by measuring the alcohol on the breath. If a person's blood alcohol concentration is 0.08, it means there are 0.08 grams of alcohol per 100 milliliter of blood. The American Medical Association states that a person can become impaired when the blood alcohol level hits 0.05. Rule 1874.1 also allows Board investigators; the stewards or any security officer of the association to require a licensee to submit to a breath alcohol test if there is reasonable cause to believe the licensee is under the influence of alcohol. Subsection 1874.1(c) sets a blood alcohol level of 0.05 percent as the level at which a licensee would be considered "under the influence." This is the level used by Indiana, Iowa and the United States Trotting Association in their blood alcohol testing programs. In addition, the American Medical Association has encouraged state medical societies to urge their state legislators to adopt a blood alcohol level of 0.05 percent for illegal driving.

Staff researched breathalyzers in response to the Guild's concerns regarding the quality of equipment used to conduct breathalyzer testing. In conjunction with CHRB investigative staff, and the California Department of Justice, a portable test unit (Alco-Test Model 6810) was identified. Such units, including the printer, would cost \$1,245 each. Training on the unit would be free, and yearly calibration would cost \$70.

RECOMMENDATION

No comments were received during the 45-day public comment period. Staff recommends the Board adopt Rule 1874.1 as presented.

1874.1. Breath Alcohol Testing.

(a) Every jockey, apprentice jockey and driver is subject to a breath alcohol test prior to each race program in which they participate. No jockey, apprentice jockey or driver shall refuse to submit to a breath alcohol test. If a breath alcohol test demonstrates a concentration of 0.05 percent or more, by weight, of alcohol in the blood:

(1) The jockey, apprentice jockey or driver shall not be permitted to ride/drive in the race program for which the test was administered,

(2) Shall be referred to the stewards, and

(3) Shall submit to a breath alcohol test before the commencement of the next race program in which the licensee participates.

(b) The Board, its investigators, the stewards or any racing association security officer may require a licensee to submit to a breath alcohol test if there is reasonable cause to believe the licensee is under the influence of alcohol.

(c) For the purposes of this rule, "under the influence" means a blood alcohol concentration of 0.05 percent or more, by weight, of alcohol in the licensee's blood.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19549.1 states the Board may allocate horse racing days for mixed breed meeting and combined fairs horse racing meetings pursuant to Section 4058 of the Food and Agricultural Code. B&P Code Section 19549.1(a) provides the dates may only be allocated for a combined fair horse racing meeting between July 1 and October, 31, and the total combined number of dates shall not exceed the total combined dates of the combined fair racing associations in 1995. The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) approved the 2007 race dates calendar at the October 26, 2006 Regular Board Meeting. Solano County Fair was approved to conduct a mixed breed horse racing meeting July 11-22, 2007, or 10 days. They will be racing five days per week, Wednesday through Saturday. Sonoma County Fair was approved to conduct a mixed breed horse racing meeting beginning July 25 through August 6, 2007, or 12 days, they will be racing Wednesday through Sunday.

The Solano County Fair Association and the Sonoma County Fair and Exposition, Inc. have entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) to combine their fair dates and conduct a four-week mixed breed horse racing meeting to be called "Sonoma Solano Wine Country Racing". The JPA is requesting to run at Solano County Fair July 11-15, 2007, or 5 race dates and then continuing at Sonoma County Fair July 18 through August 6, 2007, or 17 race dates, for a total of 22 combined race dates.

ANALYSIS

The Solano County Fair and the Sonoma County Fair and Exposition, JPA is requesting to conduct a combined fair racing meeting July 11 through August 6, 2007. This would introduce a new concept of conducting combined racing fairs to increase handle and attendance. Additionally, the change to the Sonoma County Fair and Exposition race dates would give racing fans one more week of turf racing in Northern California.

Sonoma Solano Wine Country Racing is also requesting to reinstate Monday, July 23, 2007 as a live race day in the North. This additional day will bring the total combined race dates for this meeting to 23. When the CHRB approved the 2007 race dates calendar, July 23, 2007 was designated as a dark day in Northern California. Under the new agreement July 23, 2007 would fall in the middle of the Sonoma County Fair making it beneficial to run concurrently with the Southern meet at Del Mar.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19440 provides that the California Horse Racing Board (Board/CHRB) shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of the Horse Racing Law. Responsibilities of the Board include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. B&P Code Section 19480 states that the Board may issue licenses to conduct horse racing meetings. CHRB Rule 1433, Application for License to Conduct A Horse Racing Meeting, provides that every association or fair that intends to conduct a horse racing meeting must file a completed application with the Board at least 90 days prior to its proposed meeting. In 2006 the Board amended Rule 1433 to provide that as of January 1, 2008, no racing association that operates four weeks or more of continuous thoroughbred racing in a calendar year shall be licensed to conduct a horse racing meeting at a facility that has not installed a polymer synthetic type racing surface. Four of the five thoroughbred racetracks affected by the "polytrack" mandate of Rule 1433 have either complied with the regulation, or have begun the process of compliance. Hollywood Park installed its synthetic racing surface in 2006; Del Mar Thoroughbred Club has initiated the installation of its synthetic racing surface; and Golden Gate Fields and Santa Anita have made commitments to install synthetic racing surfaces sometime in 2007. On March 9, 2007, Bay Meadows Racing Association requested a waiver until after December 31, 2009, with respect to compliance with the synthetic racing surface mandate of Rule 1433(b). The stated reason for BMRA's request is its desire to evaluate the suitability of synthetic racing surfaces prior to installing one at Bay Meadows. In its request for a waiver BMRA noted that as many as three different types of synthetic racing surfaces may be installed in California. It also noted that synthetic racing surfaces at Turfway Park and Woodbine reportedly encountered some problems.

ANALYSIS

If a two-year waiver of the synthetic racing surface requirements of Rule 1433 is granted to BMRA it will be the only major thoroughbred racetrack in California to continue running on a traditional dirt racing surface. Hollywood Park has installed a synthetic surface; Del Mar is in the process of installing such a track surface; and Golden Gate Fields and Santa Anita have stated they will install synthetic surfaces in the summer of 2007. The racing press has reported that Polytrack, which was installed at Turfway Park and Woodbine, has not stood up well to extreme cold. The top cushion of the track was balling up from the extreme cold and sticking to the inside of the horse's concave hoof. Kickback has also been an issue. While BMRA may continue operating past December 2009, it is commonly understood that the facility may some day close so the 83.5-acre main track area can be redeveloped. On

November 7, 2005, the San Mateo City Council approved the Bay Meadows Specific Plan Amendment. On December 12, 2006, the San Mateo Planning Commission approved the Bay Meadows Phase II Design Guidelines and Development Standards. December 12, 2007, is the deadline to submit the first planning application for the first portion of anticipated development. (The December 2007 deadline is contingent on the conclusion of legal proceedings concerning the validity of the approval.) Staff spoke to the San Mateo Planning Department and learned that following approval of the first planning application, BMRA must obtain building permits. This process could take approximately two years from December 2007.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19440 provides that the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adjudication of controversies arising from the enforcement of those laws and regulations dealing with horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. B&P Code Section 19562 states the Board may prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in this State. B&P Code Section 19408.2 defines "claiming race" as a race in which any horse entered therein may be claimed in conformity with the rules established by the Board. Board Rule 1657, Opening of Claim, states claims shall be opened and examined after the horses in a claiming race have reached the post. No information regarding the claims shall be divulged, except to the authorized racing officials, until the race has been run. Should more than one claim be filed for the same horse, the successful claimant shall be determined by lot. Occasionally problems arise with claims that cause them to be voided immediately after a race, or after some time has passed. The question then becomes does the horse go back to the original owner or does there have to be another shake for the remaining claimants? If there is another shake it can be difficult to transfer the horse, as the losing claimants may have spent the money on another claim, or they may not want the horse. After an error left a claim in limbo, the stewards at Santa Anita requested an amendment to Rule 1657 that would leave no doubt regarding the disposition of a horse if the claim was void.

ANALYSIS

The proposed amendment to Rule 1657 would make all claims in a claiming race, except the successful claimant, null and void after the claiming race is declared official. This would clearly establish that the horse would return to the original owner in the event there is a defect discovered in the claim.

BACKGROUND

Business and Professions (B&P) Code Section 19420 provides that jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in California where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings is vested in the California Horse Racing Board (Board). B&P Code Section 19562 states that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations and conditions under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California. In 1996 The California Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory System (CVDLS) at the University of California, Davis, concluded a three-year study of shoeing and catastrophic injury in racehorses. The study compared the shoes of injured horses to those of uninjured horses to identify types of shoes associated with increased risk of injury. The toe grab was the type of traction device found on 90% of the injured horses and 80% of uninjured horses while rim shoes were found on 12% of injured horses and 30% of uninjured horses. The conclusion was that there appeared to be an association between toe grabs and increased risk of catastrophic injury in thoroughbred racehorses. The higher the toe grabs – the greater the risk. The three-year study of shoeing and catastrophic injury released in 1996 was not considered conclusive, so a second study was initiated in late 1999. The study was not complete when the Board heard the issue of toe grabs at its January 2000 Regular Board Meeting. The result of the discussion was a third CVDLS study that would record the type of shoes worn during competition of all thoroughbred racehorses in California for the year 2000. The information would be correlated with injuries sustained to determine patterns related to shoe type. In addition, the CVDLS would collect data from foreign jurisdictions that race on dirt without toe grabs. Subsequent to its initiation, the study was extended for a second year, to be completed in the spring of 2002. In February 2006 the Board added Rule 1660.1, Toe Grabs Prohibited, which prohibited the use of toe grabs over four millimeters in height on the front shoes of thoroughbreds while racing. However, the implementation of the regulation was delayed. At the February 2007 Regular Board Meeting the Board determined it would enforce the regulation, and that quarter horses should be added to the provisions of Rule 1690.1

ANALYSIS

The proposed amendment to Rule 1690.1 would prohibit the use of toe grabs with a height greater than four millimeters on the front shoes of quarter horses while racing. In initiating the requirement to prohibit high toe grabs on thoroughbreds, the Board relied on scientific research conducted on thoroughbreds. Staff is unaware of similar research regarding the effects of high toe grabs on quarter horses that would provide scientific justification for adding this breed to the regulation.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board may wish to hear from the Equine Medical Director. This item is presented for discussion and action.
