POSITION DESCRIPTION:

Under the general direction of the Supervising Special Investigator, incumbent conducts field investigations to detect or verify suspected violations of laws, rules and regulations in the preparation of cases for criminal, civil, and/or administrative hearings; conducts background investigations of California Horse Racing license applicants; assists the Stewards in gathering information concerning issues associated with drug testing and medication programs at race tracks; knowledge of the permitted and prohibited drugs that may effect the performance of a race horse and investigate any leads that may involve the inappropriate or illegal use of medication; and may act as a liaison between the Veterinarians and the California Horse Racing Board.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class.

Knowledge of or willingness to learn about race horses and the common procedures and practices that are used in the horse racing industry; ability to gain the respect and trust of the horse racing industry; knowledge of drug enforcement practices; knowledge of the veterinary practices used in the horse racing industry; background experience in report writing, interviewing, and investigative skills; Those with Spanish bilingual skills are encouraged to apply.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Work irregular hours, holidays, and weekends; to travel frequently in southern California and occasionally throughout the State.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Other monthly benefits may include Spanish bilingual pay of \$100; Intermediate POST certification/Associates degree pay of \$50 or Advanced Post certification/Bachelors degree pay of \$100; and Physical Fitness pay of \$65. This position is subject to the three day furlough program.

DUTY STATEMENT**

Under the general direction of the Supervising Special Investigator I, the incumbent independently conducts field investigations; works as part of a team; or acts as a lead of other investigators when assigned. As Peace Officers under the California Penal Code, Section 830.3d, detects and/or verifies and enforces suspected violations of the California Horse Racing Laws and other related laws.

| 70% | As assigned, will travel to the various race tracks/fair meets to independently, or as a lead, investigate and prepare written reports on reported/observed violations of the CA Horse Racing Laws, CHRB rules and regulations, and/or other related laws inside and outside of the racing enclosure; may assist with difficult or confidential investigations; gather and preserve evidence as required; present cases before the Board of Stewards by proving facts, questioning prosecution and defense witnesses, present the evidence for review and acceptance into the hearing and may litigate cases; may represent the CHRB on appeal cases before Administrative Law Judge and/ or testify as a witness in criminal cases; and establish and maintain cooperative relations with Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies. |
| 20% | Reviews occupational license applications and conducts interviews of license applicants to determine fitness for a license; tests and analyzes the licensees' alcohol intoxication levels and urine samples when a licensee is under reasonable suspicion of being under the influence of drugs/alcohol; develops and works with confidential informants; maintains good communications with the horse racing industry; and assists Stewards in gathering information concerning issues associated with drug testing, medication programs, and other health and safety issues at the race tracks. |
| 10% | May be assigned to inspect intertrack wagering and auxiliary facilities which includes internal and external review of the entire facility; checking licenses of all personnel; securing contacts with the facilities' management, security personnel, and local law enforcement; may assist the Licensing Unit with fingerprinting and other related duties, with the approval of the Supervisor, and performs other duties as required. |
