FINAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

UPDATED INFORMATIVE DIGEST

There have been no changes in applicable laws or to the effect of the proposed regulation from the laws and effects described in the Notice of Proposed Action.

The California Horse Racing Board (Board) adopted Board Rule 1846.1, Veterinary Records for Horses Shipping into an Inclosure to Race, at the April 22, 2020, regular Board meeting. The 45-day public comment period was open from February 21, 2020 through April 6, 2020. No comments were received.

UPDATE TO THE INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

The document relied upon in this rulemaking was made available to the public during the course of this rulemaking. There are no other updates to the Initial Statement of Reasons.

LOCAL MANDATE DETERMINATION

The adoption of Board Rule 1846.1 does not impose any mandate on local agencies or school districts.

SUMMARY AND RESPONSE TO COMMENTS RECEIVED DURING THE 45-DAY NOTICE PERIOD OF FEBRUARY 21, 2020 THROUGH APRIL 6, 2020.

There were no comments received during the 45-day notice period of February 21, 2020 through April 6, 2020.

SUMMARY AND RESPONSE TO COMMENTS RECEIVED AT THE APRIL 22, 2020 REGULATORY HEARING.

There were no comments received at the April 22, 2020 regulatory hearing.

ALTERNATIVE DETERMINATION

The Board has determined that no alternative would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the regulation is proposed or would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulation or would be more cost effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provisions of law. The proposed addition of Board Rule 1846.1, Veterinary Records for Horses Shipping into an Inclosure to Race, provides that trainers

with horses not stabled at a facility under the Board's jurisdiction for 30 days prior to either a race or working off the Veterinarian's list shall submit to the official veterinarian the previous 30-day treatment record for those horses.

The Board invited interested persons to present statements or arguments with respect to alternatives to the proposed regulation at the scheduled hearing or during the written comment period. No alternatives were proposed.

No alternatives that would lessen any adverse economic impact on small businesses were proposed.
