- Adequan and Pentosan are injectable veterinary products purported to be chondroprotective (anti-arthritis).
- Methocarbamol is a commonly used centrally acting muscle relaxant that was sold at one time as Robaxin-V. It is a common pre-race medication which can be administered outside of 48 hours before a race. All methocarbamol is now compounded.
- NSAID's (Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug): phenylbutazone, diclofenac (Surpass), ketoprofen (Ketofen), flunixin (banamine) fall into this group. NSAID's were administered alone or in various combinations on a case by case basis. All are commonly used in race horses and appear to have been administered within CHRB regulations.
- Adjunct Bleeder medications: These include estrone (an estrogen), glycopyrrolate (short-acting bronchodilator), Stop 20 (a homeopathic remedy). All are commonly used with the possible exception of Stop 20.
