

STAFF ANALYSIS
DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF
RACE DAY CHARITY PROCEEDS OF THE LOS ALAMITOS QUARTER HORSE
RACING ASSOCIATION FROM ITS 2023-2024 RACE MEETING

ISSUE:

The Los Alamitos Quarter Horse Racing Association (LAQHRA) is requesting approval to distribute race day charity proceeds generated at its 2023-2024 race meeting for the period of December 20, 2023, through December 24, 2024. LAQHRA is proposing the statutory distribution amount of \$13,783. The attachment lists the amounts to be distributed to the selected charitable organizations. Staff notes that 100 percent of the proposed charity distributions are made to equine and/or horse racing-related charity organizations.

BACKGROUND:

Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 19550 states that the Board shall require each licensed racing association that conducts 14 weeks or less of racing to designate three racing days, and each licensed racing association that conducts more than 14 weeks of racing to designate five racing days during any one meeting, to be conducted as charity days by the licensee for the purpose of distribution of the net proceeds therefrom to beneficiaries through the distribution agent. No racing association shall be required to pay to a distributing agent for the purpose of distribution to beneficiaries more than an amount equal to two-tenths of one percent of the association's total on-track handle on live races conducted by the association at the meeting. BPC section 19555 requires that proceeds be distributed to beneficiaries within 12 calendar months after the last day of the meet during which charity days were conducted. BPC section 19556 provides that the distributing agent shall make the distribution to beneficiaries qualified under this article. At least 30 percent of the distribution shall be made to charities associated with the horse racing industry. An additional five percent shall be paid to a welfare fund for horsemen/horsewomen and backstretch personnel, and another five percent shall be paid to a nonprofit corporation, the primary purpose of which is to assist horsemen/horsewomen and backstretch personnel who are being affected adversely as a result of alcohol or substance abuse. In addition to the above distributions, a separate 20 percent shall be made to a nonprofit corporation or trust that has as its sole purpose the accumulation of endowment funds, the income on which shall be distributed to qualified disabled jockeys.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. Staff recommends that the Board approve the race day charity distribution as presented.

The Permanently Disabled Jockey's Fund provides financial assistance to former jockeys who have suffered catastrophic on-track injuries. It works with industry and medical research groups to improve the safety of both the human and equine athlete.

The California Retirement Management Account ("CARMA") provides a range of services to former racehorses in need of rehabilitation toward retirement or placement in a new career.

The Winners Foundation is a support and referral service for employees and family members of the industry whose lives are affected by alcohol, drugs, mental illness, and gambling related problems.

The Quarter Horse Benevolent Charity Foundation welfare fund provides for the physical, social, educational and emotional needs for backstretch employees and family members.
